A note from the Pastor...



Dear St. Gabriel Family,

Last weekend, in conjunction with the Supreme Court decision and the permission of the Bishop of San Diego, we were able to move back inside the Church. What a blessing to be able to begin the holy season of Lent with a return to the celebration of Mass in our Church. I am so thankful for your patience over the past year as we have done our best to keep everyone safe. We are confident that we have taken proper precautions and that our move back inside the Church will be a safe one. Proper air circulation, face masks, and all social distancing protocol will be followed. If you prefer to remain outside, please feel free to do so. Our courtyards allow for plenty of comfortable outdoor seating.

This Wednesday we begin the very holy season of Lent. Lent is a time of prayer, fasting, sacrifice and renewal. 

Building Fund Debt

Debt with National Knights Organization Loan Balance: \$2,627,089.22

We have completed a loan modification with the Knights of Columbus national organization in New Haven, CT. The new interest rate is 4%, down from 4.9%, and the new monthly payment is \$20,560.47, compared to \$23,559.99 on the previous loan. We have only modified the interest rate. The maturity date remains the same at 3/1/2035.




Baby Bottles


