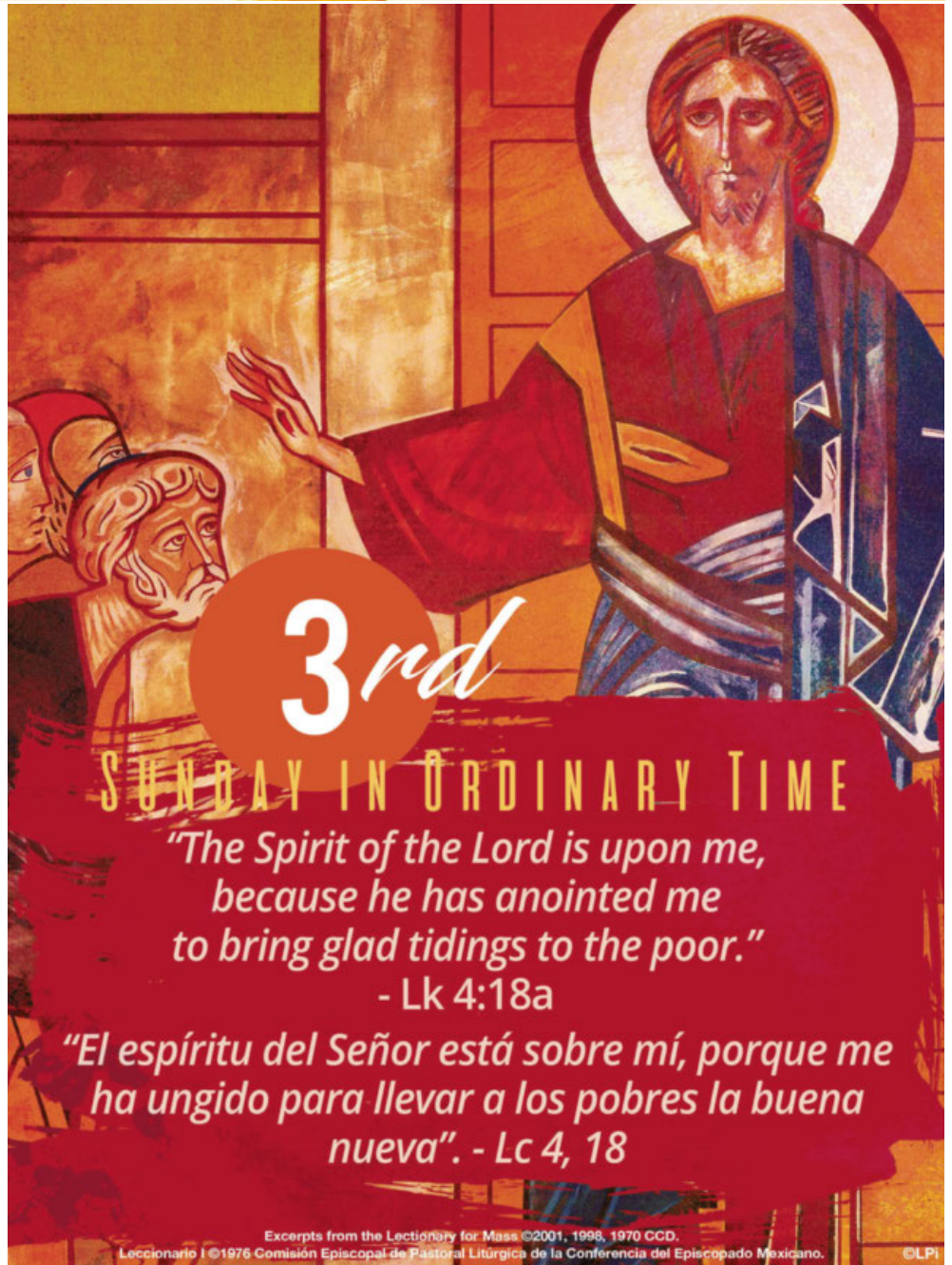

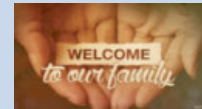

From the Pastor's desk – January 23, 2022.

Every single Inaugural Address from George Washington's to Joe Biden's has been preserved. In these speeches, presidents have laid out for the country their dreams, goals, and aspirations. Here is a part of the speech given by our first president, George Washington (April 30, 1789), when he bravely acknowledged the role of God in his administration: He said, "It would be improper to omit in this first official act my fervent supplications to that Almighty Being Who rules over the universe, Who presides in the councils of nations, and Whose providential aids can supply every human defect." Franklin Roosevelt said on March 4, 1933, "This is preeminently the time to speak the truth, the whole truth, frankly and boldly." Americans remember the role of citizens outlined in President John F. Kennedy's Inaugural Address (January 20, 1961), "In the long history of the world, only a few generations have been granted the role of defending freedom in its hour of maximum danger. And so, my fellow Americans: ask not what your country can do for you – ask what you can do for your country. My fellow citizens of the world: ask not what America will do for you, but what together we can do for the freedom of man." More recently we call to mind Ronald Reagan's American Song theme in 1985: "hopeful, big-hearted, idealistic – daring, decent and fair. That's our heritage, that's our song... we raise our voices to the God who is the author of this most tender music." No doubt you were able to identify several of the presidents by the historical references or by the famous lines, and while all of these Inaugural Addresses are important, some are moving, inspiring and worthy of remembrance. Today in the Gospel of Luke, chapter 4, we have listened to an "inaugural address" delivered not to a Nation but to a synagogue congregation; not in an American city but in a poor village, Nazareth, in Galilee; and not by a man elected by the power of the people but by the God-man Jesus, anointed with the power of the Holy Spirit. Jesus outlines his mission, vision and dreams in this famous reflection and teaching.

In 1835, Elijah Lovejoy saw a man lynched. It changed his life. He cut back on his career as a Presbyterian pastor and as a schoolteacher. He went back to his earlier training as a newspaper editor and began to write anti-slavery tracts. He delivered speeches and aroused hostility. People persecuted him, beat him, and finally burned him out of his home. He was injured in combating the fire, and after only two years, he was killed. Elijah P. Lovejoy, a life cut short. A young attorney in Elijah's home state of Illinois read Elijah P. Lovejoy's materials and was deeply influenced. Twenty-six years later, that young attorney signed the Emancipation Proclamation. One person! One! Will you be one?

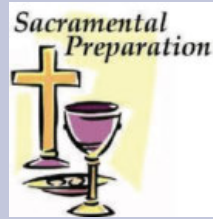
Before her tragic death in 1997, Princess Diana was championing the cause of those who had been victims of land-mine explosions. In the weeks following her funeral, the video footage of her last visit to Bosnia ran again and again on televised news programs. Featured in the footage was the Princess, reaching out in compassion to those who had survived the explosion but who would have to live the rest of their lives maimed by the loss of one or more of their limbs. Her care for these wounded members of society was a poignant reminder of what Paul teaches in today's second reading. Just as every part or member of the human body is necessary to the well-being of the whole person, so is every member of the human family necessary to the well-being of the Body of Christ. Therefore, each member must be cherished, valued, respected and protected by all the other members.

A friend was in front of me coming out of church one day, and the pastor was standing at the door to shake hands. He grabbed my friend by the hand and pulled him aside and said, "You need to join the Army of the Lord!" My friend replied, "I'm already in the Army of the Lord, Father." "If that's true," said the Pastor, "how come I only see you on Christmas and Easter?" My friend whispered back, "I'm in the Secret Service."

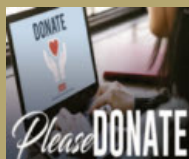

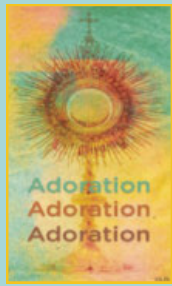

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ, Peace and well-being to you and your families. As we begin this new year 2022, please join me in hope and gratitude to God almighty for all the blessings received last year. At the same time, we implore God's providence and blessings upon us as we journey into the New Year. Like you, after almost two years of challenges with the pandemic, I have very much looked forward to a return to "normal." But instead, we find ourselves in the midst of another COVID spike, due to the Omicron variant. We are weary and tired of the many difficult impacts of this virus; its threat to our health, its impact on our work, our daily routine and our children's education. Still, we must resist the temptation to despair, indifference, or carelessness. God continues to walk with us through this darkness and if we keep the light of hope in our hearts and minds, we will recognize His loving presence. In these days, it is very important for us all to continue to practice the good habits we have learned during the pandemic – washing our hands frequently, wearing a mask indoors and staying home and away from others if we feel symptoms. If you have not been vaccinated yet, you can still do it anytime. An important fact that has emerged during this surge is that those who are fully vaccinated are experiencing less symptoms when they are infected. Those who are hospitalized are primarily those who are not vaccinated. Finally, with the increase in COVID cases and the normal flu season occurring, it is very important that if we feel sick, we get tested as soon as possible. Look for the many testing sites and resources in your community. How do we continue to respond to this as people of faith? With trust in our God, and with a spirit of diligence and compassion for the health and wellbeing of our brothers and sisters around us. Our churches remain open, and we can gather together at the table of the Lord to receive the Bread of Life, which sustains us and brings us to a greater communion with God and one another. Let us pray especially for those who are seriously ill and for the health care workers and service providers who tend to their needs every day. The "normal" that we have been waiting for, is not here yet, so we remain ever faithful and self-giving in the way that we live each day, trusting in God's providence and mercy. You remain in my heart and prayers. Let's continue to pray for one another. May Almighty God always bless you and keep you.

Del Escritorio de Nuestro Pastor—16 de Enero del 2021.

Se han conservado todos y cada uno de los discursos inaugurales, desde el de George Washington hasta el de Joe Biden. En estos discursos, los presidentes han expuesto para el país sus sueños, metas y aspiraciones. He aquí una parte del discurso pronunciado por nuestro primer presidente, George Washington (30 de abril de 1789), cuando valientemente reconoció el papel de Dios en su administración: Dijo: “Sería inapropiado omitir en este primer acto oficial mi súplicas fervientes a ese Ser Todopoderoso que gobierna el universo, que preside en los consejos de las naciones, y cuya providencia puede suplir todos los defectos humanos”. Franklin Roosevelt dijo el 4 de Marzo de 1933: “Este es el momento preeminente de decir la verdad, toda la verdad, con franqueza y valentía”. Los estadounidenses recuerdan el papel de los ciudadanos esbozado en el discurso inaugural del presidente John F. Kennedy (20 de enero de 1961): “En la larga historia del mundo, solo a unas pocas generaciones se les ha otorgado el papel de defender la libertad en su hora de máximo peligro. Entonces, mis compatriotas estadounidenses: no pregunten qué puede hacer su país por ustedes, pregúntense qué pueden hacer ustedes por su país. Mis conciudadanos del mundo: no pregunten qué hará Estados Unidos por ustedes, sino qué podemos hacer juntos por la libertad del hombre”. Más recientemente, recordamos el tema de la canción estadounidense de Ronald Reagan en 1985: “esperanzador, de gran corazón, idealista, atrevido, decente y justo. Esa es nuestra herencia, ese es nuestro canto... elevamos nuestras voces al Dios que es el autor de esta tiernísima música”. Sin duda pudimos identificar a varios de los presidentes por las referencias históricas o por las líneas famosas, y aunque todos estos discursos inaugurales son importantes, algunos son conmovedores, inspiradores y dignos de recordar. Hoy en el Evangelio de Lucas, capítulo 4, hemos escuchado un “discurso inaugural” pronunciado no a una Nación sino a una congregación sinagoga; no en una ciudad americana sino en un pueblo pobre, Nazaret, en Galilea; y no por un hombre elegido por el poder del pueblo, sino por el Dios-hombre Jesús, ungido con el poder del Espíritu Santo. Jesús describe su misión, visión y sueños en esta famosa reflexión y enseñanza.

En 1835, Elijah Lovejoy vio cómo linchaban a un hombre. Cambió su vida. Recortó su carrera como pastor presbiteriano y como maestro de escuela. Volvió a su formación anterior como editor de un periódico y comenzó a escribir tratados contra la esclavitud. Pronunció discursos y despertó hostilidad. La gente lo persiguió, lo golpeó y finalmente le quemó su casa. Resultó herido al combatir el fuego y, después de solo dos años, murió. Elijah P. Lovejoy, una vida truncada. Un joven abogado en el estado natal de Elijah, Illinois, leyó los materiales de Elijah P. Lovejoy y quedó profundamente influenciado. Veintiséis años después, ese joven abogado firmó la Proclamación de Emancipación. ¡Una persona! ¡Una! ¿Serás uno?

Antes de su trágica muerte en 1997, la princesa Diana defendía la causa de quienes habían sido víctimas de explosiones de minas terrestres. En las semanas posteriores a su funeral, el video de su última visita a Bosnia apareció una y otra vez en los programas de noticias televisados. En las imágenes aparecía la princesa, que se acercaba con compasión a aquellos que habían sobrevivido a la explosión pero que tendrían que vivir el resto de sus vidas mutilados por la pérdida de una o más de sus extremidades. Su cuidado por estos miembros heridos de la sociedad fue un recordatorio conmovedor de lo que Pablo enseña en la segunda lectura de hoy. Así como cada parte o miembro del cuerpo humano es necesario para el bienestar de toda la persona, así también cada miembro de la familia humana es necesario para el bienestar del Cuerpo de Cristo. Por lo tanto, cada miembro debe ser apreciado, valorado, respetado y protegido por todos los demás miembros.

Un amigo estaba frente a mí saliendo de la Iglesia un día, y el pastor estaba parado en la puerta para darme la mano. Agarró a mi amigo de la mano, lo apartó y dijo: “¡Tienes que unirte al Ejército del Señor!”. Mi amigo respondió: “Ya estoy en el Ejército del Señor, Padre”. “Si eso es cierto”, dijo el pastor, “¿cómo es que solo te veo en Navidad y Semana Santa?” Mi amigo me susurró: “Estoy en el Servicio Secreto”.

Estamos preocupados y cansados de los impactos tan difíciles de esta pandemia: la amenaza a nuestra salud, el impacto en nuestros trabajos, en nuestras rutinas diarias, y en la educación de nuestros niños. Con todo esto, no debemos bajar la guardia ni caer en la tentación de la desesperación, la indiferencia y el descuido. Dios sigue caminando con nosotros a través de esta oscuridad, aunque a veces no lo notemos. Mantengamos la luz de la esperanza en nuestras mentes y corazones, y así reconoceremos su presencia amorosa. Estos días, es muy importante que todos mantengamos los buenos hábitos que hemos aprendido durante la pandemia: lavado frecuente de las manos, uso de mascarillas en lugares cerrados, quedarnos en casa o mantenerlos alejados de los demás si tenemos síntomas. Si no se han vacunado todavía, pueden hacerlo en cualquier momento. Un hecho interesante que hemos estado escuchando es, que los que se han vacunado tienen síntomas más leves cuando se infectan. Y la mayoría de los que están siendo hospitalizados, son los que no se han vacunado. En esta temporada de gripe, y el aumento de infecciones de Covid, es muy importante recordar que, si nos sentimos enfermos, nos hagamos un examen tan pronto como sea posible. Busquemos los lugares de examinación y recursos de ayuda en nuestras comunidades. ¿Como seguimos respondiendo a todos estos retos como gente de fe? Con la confianza firme en Dios, y un espíritu de diligencia y compasión por la salud y bienestar de los demás. Nuestros templos seguirán abiertos, para que sigamos reuniéndonos y alimentándonos de la Mesa del Señor, quien nos sostiene y nos lleva a una mayor comunión con Dios y con los demás. 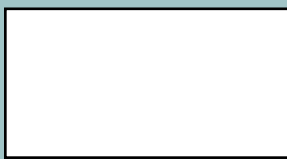

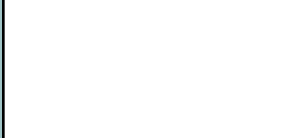
