

When and why did the church begin celebrating Divine Mercy Sunday?

The world was in the midst of the Great Depression in 1931 and the memories of World War I were still very much alive in the minds of Europeans when in Poland a sister of the Congregation of Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy, Faustina Kowalska (1905-1938), is said to have been personally visited by Jesus.

According to her diary, which was listed on the Index of Forbidden Books for more than 20 years, an image was revealed to her of the risen Lord, from whose heart shone two rays, one red (representing blood) and the other "pale" (symbolizing water), with the words "Jesus, I trust in you" at the bottom. Faustina wrote in her diary that Jesus told her, "I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish."

When she was canonized in 2000 under the direction of fellow countryman Pope John Paul II, he proclaimed that the Second Sunday of Easter would henceforth be known as Divine Mercy Sunday, thereby widely promoting the devotional practices associated with Faustina's visions, already popular in many communities.

St. Faustina, a poorly educated daughter of a humble Polish family, kept a 600-page diary of the apparitions she claimed continued for years. Her entries focus on God's mercy, the call to accept God's mercy and to be merciful, the need for conversion, and the call to trust in Jesus. It had been Jesus' own wish, she wrote, to establish a feast day: "I [Jesus] desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls. . . . I am giving them the last hope of salvation; that is, the Feast of My Mercy."

But the road to the universal recognition and institutionalization of the devotion was anything but smooth. Since Sister Faustina's diary, which she claimed Jesus himself had asked her to keep, had been previously listed on the Index of Forbidden Books, it curtailed the exercise of the devotional practices. Detractors claimed that her writing contained theological errors, while her defenders attribute mistakes to a faulty translation from Polish to Italian. While the diary is no longer on the Index and her canonization has officially put away concerns regarding the orthodoxy of her writings, critics remain.

The celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday is an opportunity to reflect on the theme of how God's mercy can overcome sin and, as the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments states, "a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face, with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that mankind [sic] will experience in the years to come."

¿Cuándo y por qué la iglesia comenzó a celebrar el Domingo de la Divina Misericordia?

El mundo estaba en medio de la Gran Depresión en 1931 y los recuerdos de la Primera Guerra Mundial todavía estaban muy vivos en la mente de los europeos cuando en Polonia una hermana de la Congregación de Hermanas de Nuestra Señora de la Misericordia, Faustina Kowalska (1905- 1938), se dice que fue visitada personalmente por Jesús.

Según su diario, que fue incluido en el Índice de Libros Prohibidos durante más de 20 años, se le reveló una imagen del Señor resucitado, de cuyo corazón brillaban dos rayos, uno rojo (representando la sangre) y el otro "pálido". (simbolizando el agua), con las palabras "Jesús, en ti confío" en la parte inferior. Faustina escribió en su diario que Jesús le dijo: "Prometo que el alma que venere esta imagen no perecerá".

Cuando fue canonizada en 2000 bajo la dirección de su compatriota el Papa Juan Pablo II, él proclamó que el Segundo Domingo de Pascua en adelante se conocería como Domingo de la Divina Misericordia, promoviendo así ampliamente las prácticas devocionales asociadas con las visiones de Faustina, ya populares en muchas comunidades.

Santa Faustina, una hija pobremente educada de una humilde familia polaca, mantuvo un diario de 600 páginas de las apariciones que, según ella, continuaron durante años. Sus escritos se centran en la misericordia de Dios, el llamado a aceptar la misericordia de Dios y a ser misericordiosos, la necesidad de conversión y el llamado a confiar en Jesús. Había sido el propio deseo de Jesús, escribió, establecer un día festivo: "Yo [Jesús] deseo que la Fiesta de la Misericordia sea un refugio y un cobijo para todas las almas. . . Les estoy dando la última esperanza de salvación; es decir, la Fiesta de Mi Misericordia".

Pero el camino hacia el reconocimiento universal y la institucionalización de la devoción fue todo menos fácil. Dado que el diario de la hermana Faustina, que ella afirmó que Jesús mismo le había pedido que lo mantuviera, había sido incluido previamente en el Índice de Libros Prohibidos, restringió el ejercicio de las prácticas devocionales. Los detractores afirmaron que su escritura contenía errores teológicos, mientras que sus defensores atribuyen errores a una traducción defectuosa del polaco al italiano. Si bien el diario ya no está en el índice y su canonización ha eliminado oficialmente las preocupaciones sobre la ortodoxia de sus escritos, siguen existiendo críticas.

La celebración del Domingo de la Divina Misericordia es una oportunidad para reflexionar sobre el tema de cómo la misericordia de Dios puede vencer el pecado y, como afirma la Congregación para el Culto Divino y la Disciplina de los Sacramentos, "una invitación perenne al mundo cristiano a afrontar, con confianza en la benevolencia divina, las dificultades y pruebas que la humanidad [sic] experimentará en los años venideros".

FACILITIES HAPPENINGS - EXTERIOR PAINTING



You can then set recurring giving or make a one time donation with an easy selection of the fund you wish to contribute to. You can also add a memo to your donation. While logged in you can also see your contribution history and manage your profile.

If you are unsure of your registration status please call the parish office and we can verify that for you.


We are hopeful that both Volleyball and Cross Country will start up in the Fall. We will keep you updated on the registration for those sports as soon as we have it.
