








The Miracle and Message of Cana Pope Francis

Today we shall ponder Jesus' first miracle, which John calls signs because Jesus doesn't perform them in order to excite wonder but to reveal the love of the Father. Initiating his public ministry at the wedding at Cana, Jesus reveals to us the depth of the relationship that unites us to him: it is the new covenant of love. What is at the foundation of our faith? An act of mercy by which Jesus



I the context of the covenant we are also to understand our Lady's observation: *they have no wine*. How can one celebrate a wedding feast and make merry without what the prophets indicated as a typical element of the messianic banquet? Water is necessary for life, but wine expresses the abundance of a banquet and the joy of a feast. This wedding feast was short of wine; the newlyweds are ashamed of this. Just imagine ending a wedding feast drinking tea. Wine is necessary for a feast. By transforming into wine the water of the jars used for the Jewish rites of purification, Jesus performs an eloquent sign: he transforms the Law of Moses into the Gospel, bearer of joy.

The words of Mary addresses to the servants come to crown the wedding of Cana: *Do whatever he tells you*. These are her last words recounted by the Gospels; they are the legacy she hands down to us. Today too our Lady says to us all: "Whatever Jesus tells you, do it." At this wedding the new covenant is truly articulated, and to the servants of the Lord, that is to all the Church, is entrusted a new mission: *Do whatever he tells you!...*

El milagro y el mensaje de Caná Papa Francisco

Hoy reflexionaremos sobre el primer milagro de Jesús, al que Juan llama signos porque Jesús no los realiza para despertar el asombro, sino para revelar el amor del Padre. Al iniciar su ministerio público en las bodas de Caná, Jesús nos revela la profundidad de la relación que nos une a él: es la nueva alianza de amor. ¿Cuál es la base de nuestra fe? Un acto de misericordia por el que Jesús nos une a él. Y la vida cristiana es la respuesta a este amor, es como la historia de dos enamorados. Dios y el hombre se encuentran, buscan, conocen, celebran y se aman: como los amantes del Cantar de los Cantares. Todo lo demás viene como resultado de esta relación. La Iglesia es la familia de Jesús en la que derrama su amor; es este amor el que la Iglesia salvaguarda y desea dar a todos.

En el contexto de la alianza debemos comprender también la observación de la Virgen: no tienen vino. ¿Cómo se puede celebrar una fiesta de bodas y alegrarse sin lo que los profetas indicaron como elemento típico del banquete mesiánico? El agua es necesaria para la vida, pero el vino expresa la abundancia de un banquete y la alegría de una fiesta. A esta fiesta de bodas le faltó vino; los recién casados se avergüenzan de esto. Imagínense terminar un banquete de bodas bebiendo té. El vino es necesario para una fiesta. Al transformar en vino el agua de las tinajas utilizadas para los ritos judíos de purificación, Jesús realiza un signo elocuente: transforma la Ley de Moisés en el Evangelio, portador de alegría.

Las palabras de María dirigidas a los criados que vienen a coronar las bodas de Caná: *Haced lo que él os diga*. Estas son sus últimas palabras narradas por los Evangelios; son el legado que nos transmite. También hoy la Virgen nos dice a todos: "Hagan lo que les diga Jesús". En estas bodas se articula verdaderamente la nueva alianza, ya los siervos del Señor, es decir, a toda la Iglesia, se les confía una nueva misión: ¡Haced todo lo que él os diga!...

"A KNIGHT'S PERSPECTIVE"

At the beginning of December, the St. Pius X chapter of the Knights of Columbus held their annual "Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest" and "Keep Christ in Christmas Poster Contest" for the students at St. Pius X School.

The essay contest is conducted as part of the Religion class for the eighth grade class. Students are asked to write an essay as a classroom assignment which they can also choose to submit to be judged for the contest.

The theme of the essay for this year was to "describe everyday obstacles that you may have experienced or witnessed others experiencing while living a life of authentic faith".

This contest is judged on Content, Grammar, and Style. Our Council awards prizes of \$100 for first place; \$50 for second place; and \$25 for third place. We had twenty-four students submit their essays and the winners of these prizes were:

- First place: Joe Stimpson
 - Second place: Logan Merriwether Third place: Emma Risser-Simas

The poster contest is conducted as part of the Religion class for the middle school (grades 6-8). In this contest, the students are asked to create a visual image reflecting the theme of "Keep Christ in Christmas". They can also choose to submit this assignment to be judged in our contest. This contest is judged on Slogan, Visuals, and Overall Impact. The prizes for the poster contest are the same as those listed above for the essay contest and there were 180 students who submitted their posters. The winners of this contest were:

- First place: Alexa Schreiber
- Second place: Nico Cardona
- Third place: Ashley O'Neill

The first place winner from both the Essay and Poster contest are submitted to the State-level for the Knights of Columbus to compete at that level. In the past, St. Pius X has had many students also win the \$50 prize awarded for these contests at State.

Winners of the State-level competitions are then submitted to the Knights of Columbus Supreme Office for judging at the International-level. Last year a St. Pius X student was named runner-up at the International-level of the essay contest. Additionally in 2018 a St. Pius X student won the International-level of the poster contest. This award was the first for the State of Oregon in this competition.




