"Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."

I absolutely love the gospel from St. Luke this Sunday. However, I want to spend some time reflecting on the second reading from St. Paul to the Corinthians, that is really convicting me these days. *Taking us a comparison which was current at the time, St. Paul likens Christ to a body of which Christians are the members, each different, all indispensable and therefore called to mutual respect and solidarity. But the principle of life and of unity is Christ himself.*

(St. Andrew Bible Missal pg.537)



St. Paul really argues the point well in making these comparisons:

The eye cannot say to the hand, "I do not need you,"

nor again the head to the feet, "I do not need you."

Indeed, the parts of the body that seem to be weaker are all the more necessary,

and those parts of the body that we consider less honorable

we surround with greater honor,

and our less presentable parts are treated with greater propriety,

whereas our more presentable parts do not need this.

But God has so constructed the body

as to give greater honor to a part that is without it,

so that there may be no division in the body,

but that the parts may have the same concern for one another. (1 Cor. 16:21-25)

The key here is to remember the "principle" Christ himself is the life and the unity of the body. It's only in our communion through Him, with Him, and in Him, will we find this solidarity. This is stated well by the Third General Conference of Latin American Bishops, Puebla: *Evangelization at Present and in the Future of Latin America: Conclusions*, NCCB, 1979, p.150:

Not all of us are sent out to serve and evangelize on the basis of the same function. Some do it as hierarchical ministers, some as lay people, and some as people dedicated to the consecrated life. Complementing each other, we all construct the Kingdom of God on earth.

According to God's plan, all of us Christians are to find fulfillment as human beings. This is our human vocation. We also are to find fulfillment as Christians, living out our baptism and its summons to be holy (communion and cooperation with God), to be active members of the community, and to bear witness to the Kingdom (communion and cooperation with others). This is our Christian vocation. Finally, we must discover the concrete vocation (as lay person, consecrated religious, or hierarchical minister) that will enable us to make our specific contribution to the construction of the Kingdom. This is our specific Christian vocation. In this way we will carry out our evangelizing mission in a full and organic way.

“Hoy se cumple este pasaje de la Escritura en presencia de ustedes”.

Me encanta el evangelio de San Lucas este domingo. Sin embargo, quiero pasar un tiempo reflexionando sobre la segunda lectura de San Pablo a los Corintios, que realmente me está convenciendo en estos días. *Haciéndonos una comparación que era común en la época, San Pablo compara a Cristo con un cuerpo cuyos miembros son los cristianos, cada uno diferente, todos indispensables y, por tanto, llamados al respeto mutuo y a la solidaridad. Pero el principio de vida y de unidad es Cristo mismo.* (Misal Bíblico de San Andrés pg.537)

San Pablo realmente argumenta bien el punto al hacer estas comparaciones:

El ojo no puede decirle a la mano: “No te necesito”,

ni de nuevo la cabeza a los pies, “no te necesito”.

De hecho, las partes del cuerpo que parecen ser más débiles

son tanto más necesarios,

y aquellas partes del cuerpo que consideramos menos honorables

rodeamos con mayor honor,

y nuestras partes menos presentables son tratadas con mayor decoro,

mientras que nuestras partes más presentables no necesitan esto.

Pero Dios ha construido el cuerpo de tal manera

como para dar mayor honor a una parte que está sin él,

para que no haya división en el cuerpo,

pero que las partes puedan tener la misma preocupación una por la otra. (1 Co. 16:21-25)

La clave aquí es recordar que el “principio” Cristo mismo es la vida y la unidad del cuerpo. Sólo en nuestra comunión por Él, con Él y en Él encontraremos esta solidaridad. Así lo afirma bien la Tercera Conferencia General del Episcopado Latinoamericano, Puebla: La evangelización en el presente y en el futuro de América Latina: Conclusiones, NCCB, 1979, p.150:

No todos somos enviados a servir y evangelizar sobre la base de la misma función. Unos lo hacen como ministros jerárquicos, otros como laicos y otros como personas dedicadas a la vida consagrada. Complementándonos, todos construimos el Reino de Dios en la tierra.

De acuerdo con el plan de Dios, todos los cristianos debemos encontrar la realización como seres humanos.

Esta es nuestra vocación humana. También debemos encontrarnos realizados como cristianos, viviendo nuestro bautismo y su llamado a ser santos (comunión y cooperación con Dios), a ser miembros activos de la comunidad y a dar testimonio del Reino (comunión y cooperación con los demás). Esta es nuestra vocación cristiana.

Finalmente, debemos descubrir la vocación concreta (como laico, religioso consagrado o ministro jerárquico) que nos permita dar nuestra contribución específica a la construcción del Reino. Esta es nuestra vocación cristiana específica. De esta manera realizaremos nuestra misión evangelizadora de manera plena y orgánica.

Later it was realized three skeins of "Red Heart" brand is 2-times the yardage as our regular "Homespun" skeins! Therefore, if you're a knitter with Red Heart yarn, please use your discretion about length; usual prayer shawls are 60 inches length and 57 stitches wide. Those with Red Heart yarn are welcome to knit two shawls out of the three skeins or return the extra yarn. Happy knitting.

"A KNIGHT'S PERSPECTIVE"



At the beginning of December, the St. Pius X chapter of the Knights of Columbus held their annual "Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest" and "Keep Christ in Christmas Poster Contest" for the students at St. Pius X School.

The essay contest is conducted as part of the Religion class for the eighth grade class. Students are asked to write an essay as a classroom assignment which they can also choose to submit to be judged for the contest.

The theme of the essay for this year was to "describe everyday obstacles that you may have experienced or witnessed others experiencing while living a life of authentic faith".

This contest is judged on Content, Grammar, and Style. Our Council awards prizes of \$100 for first place; \$50 for second place; and \$25 for third place. We had twenty-four students submit their essays and the winners of these prizes were:

- First place: Joe Stimpson
- Second place: Logan Merriwether
- Third place: Emma Risser-Simas

The poster contest is conducted as part of the Religion class for the middle school (grades 6-8). In this contest, the students are asked to create a visual image reflecting the theme of "Keep Christ in Christmas". They can also choose to submit this assignment to be judged in our contest. This contest is judged on Slogan, Visuals, and Overall Impact. The prizes for the poster contest are the same as those listed above for the essay contest and there were 180 students who submitted their posters. The winners of this contest were:

- First place: Alexa Schreiber
- Second place: Nico Cardona
- Third place: Ashley O'Neill

The first place winner from both the Essay and Poster contest are submitted to the State-level for the Knights of Columbus to compete at that level. In the past, St. Pius X has had many students also win the \$50 prize awarded for these contests at State.

Winners of the State-level competitions are then submitted to the Knights of Columbus Supreme Office for judging at the International-level. Last year a St. Pius X student was named runner-up at the International-level of the essay contest. Additionally in 2018 a St. Pius X student won the International-level of the poster contest. This award was the first for the State of Oregon in this competition.
