1st Reading:

Genesis 15:1-6; 21:1-3

The word of the Lord came to Abram in a vision, saying: "Fear not, Abram! I am your shield; I will make your reward very great."

But Abram said, "O Lord God, what good will your gifts be, if I keep on being childless and have as my heir the steward of my house, Eliezer?" Abram continued, "See, you have given me no offspring, and so one of my servants will be my heir." Then the word of the Lord came to him: "No, that one shall not be your heir; your own issue shall be your heir."

The Lord took Abram outside and said, "Look up at the sky and count the stars, if you can. Just so," he added, "shall your descendants be." Abram put his faith in the Lord, who credited it to him as an act of righteousness.

The Lord took note of Sarah as he had said he would; he did for her as he had promised. Sarah became pregnant and bore Abraham a son in his old age, at the set time that God had stated. Abraham gave the name Isaac to this son of his whom Sarah bore him. *The Word of the Lord.*

Brothers and sisters: By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place that he was to receive as an inheritance; he went out, not knowing where he was to go. By faith he received

power to generate, even though he was past the normal age --and Sarah herself was sterile-- for he thought that the one who had made the promise was trustworthy.

So it was that there came forth from one man, himself as good as dead, descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and as countless as the sands on the seashore.

By faith Abraham, when put to the test, offered up Isaac, and he who had received the promises was ready to offer his only son, of whom it was said, "Through Isaac descendants shall bear your name." He reasoned that God was able to raise even from the dead, and he received Isaac back as a symbol.

REFLECTING ON THE WORD GUIDEPOSTS

THE SANCTIFICATION OF THE FAMILY

Today we celebrate the feast of the Holy Family --- the family of Joseph, Mary and Jesus. Although Son of God, Jesus became a human child; he grew up in a family. Thus, did God sanctify the human family.

We might think being holy is being free from problems. Like all other families, the family of Joseph, Mary and Jesus had to face dark moments. Like all other families they had to go through crises.

What made them different was their loyalty and dedication to God. Today's gospel shows them as a family religiously observing the practices of their faith which predisposed them to be attentive to God's will at every moment of their life, whether it is an ordinary event like going to Bethlehem for the census or such extraordinary events as the flight to Egypt or the return from Egypt.

God acts in our life, in our family. We need to practice the same attentive listening to God's will as Joseph and his family did in order to find out God's plans for us and our family. Let us seize the opportunity to say a family prayer to the Holy Family.

FAMILY PRAYER TO THE HOLY FAMILY

O heavenly Father, our loving God,/
You have given us the Holy Family as our patron/
to bless and guide our families,/ —
that the fruits of the Holy Spirit/ —
love, joy, peace, patience, kindness,/ —

As husbands and wives,/ teach us to love our
spouses more than ever./

As children, teach us to be obedient/ as Jesus showed
obedience and respect to Mary and Joseph./

faith/ and confident hope that all things work for
the good of all those who love God./

May we have a happy, holy family forever, through
Jesus, Mary, and Joseph — the adorable Holy
Family, our miraculous patron. Amen.

While today's feast certainly invites us to reflect on the tiny family of Joseph, Mary, and Jesus, it is by no means limited to that. In fact, the biblical readings offered for today's liturgy speak of three different "holy families." The first holy family consists of *Joseph, Mary, and Jesus*. The second family is *the family of Israel*, which extends beyond the core unit of Jesus and his parents. Third is the *holy family of the world*, which moves even beyond that of Israel.

The gospel for today's feast is taken from Luke 2:22-40. It is most fitting because all three aspects of the Holy Family are touched on here. There are Joseph, Mary, and Jesus fulfilling the law regarding purification (Lev 12:2-8) as well as the consecration of the firstborn (Exodus 13:1-2). Then come the prophecies of Simeon and Anna, which extend beyond Joseph, Mary, and Jesus by identifying Jesus as the revelation to the *Gentiles* and the glory for *Israel*. This emphasis is the centerpiece of the entire passage.

It shows how Jesus will be the fulfillment of God's promises, which extends back as far as Abraham. At the heart of this emphasis is Luke's strong theme of universalism, that is to say, of the family of humanity. Jesus has come for the salvation of all peoples.

The story of Jesus is how he left his small local family and created a new family based on faith and discipleship. All three forms of holy family are interrelated. They urge us to be inclusive rather than exclusive. It begins as a tiny group but soon expands to encompass a universe.

VALUES BEGIN AT HOME

A grade school teacher was telling her class about statistics which indicate that more twins are being born these days than in the past. "Why?" asked a little boy.

"Because," replied a tiny little girl, "little children are afraid to come into the world alone."

That is a very insightful remark. With the major threat to obstruct birth by means of abortion and various contraceptives, not to mention the scare of broken families, indeed, children have all the reason to fear coming out into the world alone!

But, from the beginning God intended that there be a place for parental love, care and affection beginning with infancy when we're helpless, a place where we find warmth and security, where we can make mistakes, where we can grow, where we can be accepted. In short, God intended a FAMILY.

The family, as the basic unit of society, ought to be the origin of change in society. Values and virtues must be found in the family and from there must radiate to our place of work, to schools, and communities. "Charity begins at home," we say. But it doesn't stop there.

Greater than this is the realization that parents are fulfilling the vocation of Joseph and Mary in the Holy Family.
