TODAY'S GOSPEL MEDITATION ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

"We are called to live our baptism every day, as new creatures, clothed in Christ."

— Pope Francis

What reference point do you use when making decisions? Many times, impulse takes control and decisions are made based solely on emotion and desire. We all know that these types of decisions can often get us into trouble. When a person has a confident sense of who they are and a real understanding of what is important and of value, the likelihood of kneejerk impulsive choices diminishes. Baptism gives us what we need to make well informed and purposeful decisions. By this simple gesture, God claims us as His own and provides us with the identity and purpose we need to properly live life.

It is tremendously reassuring, when we truly embrace this revelation and realize that we no longer have to wonder about the purpose of our lives or struggle to find our way. The answer of who we are in God has been given to us. We no longer have to fumble around, trip over ourselves or walk aimlessly about. Issues surrounding the sacredness of life, the meaning of death, the protection of those most vulnerable, care for the weak and the poor, offering hospitality to those in search of a home, the purpose and proper place of work, how to create a just social order, caring for creation, and understanding our roles as heralds and stewards are just a few of the wonderful gifts baptism brings. When we make decisions based on things such as these core Gospel truths we really act as Christ himself, revealing to others the new creations that we are. This is how we live our baptism.

It is difficult to walk against the tide. Yet, that is precisely what baptism calls us to do. Although we are sinners, in need of mercy and far from perfection we are called to order our life and make decisions based upon the wisdom and guidance of Almighty God. He alone is the one who can claim us as His sons and daughters. Standing up for our principles will not make us popular. But who ever said Christianity is a popularity contest? Baptism calls us to stand up for that which goes against the grain of secularism. Standing in line with other sinners, we have our anchor to steady us in the tempests of life and God is very pleased. Forge ahead. There is nothing to fear.

Deacon Patrick Henning

Rest in Peace 1946 -2021

Deacon Patrick Henning, who was ordained to the permanent diaconate in 1992 and served the Diocese of Sacramento for more than 18 years, died on Dec. 10. He was 75. Deacon Henning served in various ministries at St, Mel Parish from 1992 to 2009, and retired on April 5, 2011.



Born and raised in San Francisco, Deacon Henning had struggled in his brief by very difficult fight with cancer and was surrounded by his family, who cared for him with love throughout his illness and his final days.

In an interview with *The Catholic Herald* in March 2005, Henning reflected on his tireless dedication to securing just wages and working conditions for laborers for more than 30 years. Gov. Arnold Schwarzenegger had appointed the longtime labor leader to direct the state's Employment Development Department in November 2004. He served in that role until 2009 and was appointed to the California High-Speed Rail Authority Board of Directors in June 2013.

Among his priorities as EDD director, Henning told *The Catholic Herald*, were job training, a bipartisan approach to making California more creative among the workforce and employers, talking with growers and farmworkers about working conditions and fair wages, and "attacking the vast underground economy" with the help of state and local law enforcement agencies.

All of these goals meshed well with his ministry as a permanent deacon, he said, because he was fulfilling one of the deacon's primary missions – that of reaching out to all people who need assistance.

He is survived by his loving wife, Gina, of more than 50 years. They raised four children: Patrick, Robert (deceased), Erin and Michael. He also leaves behind four grandchildren: Chloe, Joseph, Nora and Jack. He was the devoted brother of John, Brian (deceased), Nancy, Daniel, Thomas and Mary. He is also survived by many loving nieces, nephews, and many other family and friends.



EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

I Hope I Am Like Him

"Who is this Christ? Is he like you?"

Perhaps you've heard this story, often attributed to the life of St. Teresa of Calcutta. A sick man asked her this question, as he marveled at her tireless service to himself and others in the name

of someone named Jesus Christ.



"He is nothing like me," the saint is said to have answered. "But I hope I am like him."

Though the authenticity of this exchange cannot be verified, its message rings perfectly true: all the value of our stewardship lies in its relativity to the one in whose name we perform it.

Consider the figure of John the Baptist — a magnificent, towering character even purely from a literary or historical perspective. A martyr who fed on wild locusts and boldly spoke truth to power — a man so great some mistook him for the Messiah.

But why is he great? Because he prepared the way. All his accomplishments and escapades mean nothing if they are taken out of the context of salvation history. He only makes sense relative to Christ — and this is exactly as he wanted it. "One worthier than I is coming," he insists. And because of that humility and that total embrace of God's will, he is given one of the greatest honors in the New Testament — he baptizes the Son of God.

Let's examine our lives in the light of their relativity to Christ. How do we prepare the way? When Christ comes to us, what do we do? How do we leave ourselves open to be actors in God's plan?

As you are writing, pray the following prayer: Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only-begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Action Item: Get your blessed chalk in the vestibule after Mass and gather your family as you pray together to bless your home.


CHRIST THE KING PARISH RETREATS

ST. HILARY OF POITIERS BISHOP AND DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH

Feast Day January 13

Born a pagan, St. Hilary (c. 315 – c. 367) studied philosophy and the meaning of life, eventually making his way through the bible. He became a convert and was appointed bishop of Poitiers in 353. Sometimes referred to as the Hammer of the Arians, St. Hilary defended the Nicene Creed against a popular heresy, Arianism. He was exiled to Phrygia for



opposing Roman emperor Constantius II, who preferred the heresy which denies Christ's divinity. From Phyrgia St. Hilary fought with his pen, zealously writing against the heresy.

Eventually he was allowed to return to Poitiers, but did so by a circuitous route, preaching against Arianism all the way. St. Hilary was likely the first writer of hymns in the West, his writings on the Trinity, Psalms and Gospel of Matthew survive today. St. Hilary was created Doctor of the Church, a title given to those who provided important contributions to theology and doctrine, in 1851 by Pope Pius IX.

This is a huge thank you to all the people who donated to our St. Mel Conference of the Society of St. Vincent DePaul this past year.

This holiday season we were able to provide 60 turkeys and bags of food to This holiday season we were able to provide 60 turkeys and bags of food to families at Thanksgiving, another 50 at Christmas time, gift cards for 27 families with children to buy Christmas gifts with were handed out, and the shoe box project gave 75 teens attending San Juan High School in foster care or without permanent homes a wrapped shoe box full of small gifts and personal care items.



Our ministry to the homeless in the area restarted in May, and we are currently delivering 35-45 bagged lunches twice a week along with socks, toiletries and clothes.

SVDP's sewing and knitting group has produced many dresses and shorts for children in the local community, at our southern border and in the Philippines. They have made lap robes and shawls for nursing home residents, caps and drain aprons for cancer patients and hats and scarves for the shoe box project and for the homeless.

We received a lot of first aid supplies in 2021; the largest portion we sent to a rural community in the Philippines, but we also donated to Mercy McMahon Nursing Home.

The food you donate to our pantry we give to many of the families that call us for help every week. Calls for assistance with rent and utilities are the most frequent, but we have also had the opportunity to do things like help people get beds for their children, a license renewal required by their employer, bus passes for medical appointments and even clothes for a job interview.

Your generosity reaches out into our community and beyond, bringing God's mercy and kindness to the poor. May His light and love continue to shine on you this year and always.


