





Best known as Padre Pio, Francesco Forgione was born in 1887 in Pietrelcina, Italy. As a young boy he suffered many illnesses, such as typhoid. He joined the Capuchin Franciscans at age 15 and took the name of Pius or "Pio" in honor of Pope Pius I. He was ordained in 1910, and at this time he began receiving the marks of stigmata, the wounds of Christ. Frequent illnesses continued to plague him. Padre Pio served in the Italian Medical Corps during World War I, but he was discharged early because of illness, probably tuberculosis. He was assigned to the friary in San Giovanni Rotondo. In 1918, while serving at the friary, the stigmata reappeared and remained until his death. Many faithful came to see him at the friary. His days were long, beginning with Mass at 5 a.m. then hearing confessions all day, taking breaks to bless the sick. A simple man, content to do God's will, and with an ardent desire to serve the sick and poor, he urged a

hospital, Casa Sollievo della Sodderenza (House for the Relief of Suffering), to be built in San Giovanni Rotondo. It opened in 1956. Padre Pio died At the age of eighty-one in 1968 and in 2002 Pope John Paul II Proclaimed him "St. Pio of Pietrelcina."

With these words from the Gospel (Luke 22:19), the Lord Jesus offers us the gift of himself in the Eucharist. This theme reminds us that the object of all catechesis is Jesus himself. The role of the Catechist is, first of all, to be a disciple and one who draws close to Jesus in the Eucharist, and then to be a witness to others and a companion as they too come to know Jesus and to encounter him in the sacraments. May we who aspire to be effective catechists, have unwavering faith in the real presence of Christ, that we lead others by teaching and example to encounter Jesus with us at the Eucharistic table.


