Each year on the first Sunday after Pentecost we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, also known as Trinity Sunday. Although it wasn't until 1334 that Pope John XXII officially established the feast for universal observance in the Western Church, the mystery of the Holy Trinity has been the pulse of the Church's life since the very beginning. The Trinity is "the central mystery of Christian faith and life and is the source of all the other mysteries of faith". The whole of the Church's life flows from the central belief that the one true God exists as three divine Persons — Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Since the very beginning of time, God has gradually revealed and communicated the truth of who he is as Trinitarian through what he has done in salvation history. Although God gradually revealed himself throughout different stages of the Old Testament period of salvation history, mankind had no way of knowing the full truth of God's inner life of the Trinity before the time of Christ, since this mystery of our faith is "inaccessible to human reason alone before the Incarnation of God's Son and the sending of the Holy Spirit."



Born to nobility, St. Norbert of Xanten, was ordained as a subdeacon and served in the court of Henry V, Emperor of Germany, however, at court it was easy to be distracted by wealth, power and luxury and he lived a worldly and corrupt life there. By the grace of God while traveling in a storm he was nearly struck by lightning and almost killed. This experience changed St. Norbert and he became penitent, left his court post, and after a period of discernment in a monastery, felt called to be a priest.

Norbert became an itinerant preacher, preaching against worldly attitudes but at the Pope's request finally settled in northern France and founded the Norbertine order established according to the rule of St. Augustine. The order grew rapidly and soon founded women's branch. Norbert traveled and preached across Germany where he also founded a lay branch of the Norbertines. In Belgium he preached against heresies which denied the Blessed Sacrament.

Eventually he was made Archbishop of Magdeburg, Germany, and later he traveled to Rome in support of Pope Innocent II, against the antipope. Afterward he returned to Germany to court of Emperor

Lothar as advisor, at end of life, in failing health, St. Norbert was carried back to Magdeburg where he died.

Save our Social Hall


The harsh winter exposed many of the weaknesses of the Social Hall roof. After inspecting the damage, we realized that this was the first roof, and maintenance was becoming increasingly expensive. The ceiling tiles were discolored, paint was bubbling and pealing, and health concerns were developing.

An effective roof ensures that water doesn't penetrate the building, thus preventing structural damage, leaks, and potential hazards to occupants, such as the black mold we discovered. Patching jobs were becoming more frequent, less effective, and more expensive. The roof significantly impacted the Social Hall's energy efficiency. This was further exacerbated by higher energy pricing.

In light of so many new and exciting ministries that have recently started, re-started and grown at Holy Family, replacing the roof seems much less thrilling of a project. This, however, clearly makes the replacing the roof all the more urgent. The project is expected to cost about \$110,000. Please consider making a donation to our Project SOS to Save our Social Hall.
