

First Reading:

The prophet Isaiah foresaw a time of great joy for Israel when nations and kings would come to Israel praising the Lord. *How do you show gratitude to the Lord for the great joys of your life?*


Second Reading:

It was revealed to Paul that God intended to save all people (Jews *and* Gentiles) through his Son, Jesus Christ. Paul tried to convey the significance of this revelation to the Ephesians by using the language of "coheirs" and "copartners." *What does this language signal to you*?

Gospel:

The visit of the magi is one of the most well-known stories from the Gospel infancy narratives. It was an event that manifested God's revelation of His newborn Son to the world. It also foreshadowed the threat that some would experience because of Jesus. *How does Jesus challenge the status quo even today?*

Saint of the Week

The patron saint of Catholic schools, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (August 28, 1774 – January 4, 1821) was born in New York City to a prominent family of the Episcopal faith. When she turned 19, she married a wealthy businessman with whom she had five children. He later died of tuberculosis in 1803, leaving her a young widow. After discovering the Catholic faith in Italy, where her husband had died, she returned to New York and converted to Catholicism in 1805.

After several years struggling as a single mother, Elizabeth moved in 1809 to Emmitsburg, Maryland, where she founded the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph, the first community for religious women established in the United States. She also began St. Joseph's Academy and Free School, which started a chain reaction of Catholic-based education in the United States that continues today.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was canonized September 14, 1975 in St. Peter's Square by Pope Paul VI and was the first citizen born in the United States to be given the title of "saint."







Update to Pandemic Protocols for Liturgical celebrations from His Eminence Daniel Cardinal DiNardo

Since the local pandemic situation has continued to improve, Cardinal DiNardo has announced the following liturgical directives which will take effect on Sunday, January 2, 2022, the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord:

General Dispensation from the Sunday and Holy Day Mass Obligation

This dispensation is removed for all Catholics within the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston. The faithful should fulfill their Sunday and Holy Day obligations joyfully and conscientiously.

Please be mindful that, the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday or Holy Days of Obligatin is not morally binding for those who find it impossible to attend Mass, such as, due to illness, advanced age, caring for a sick person, or being at high-risk for contracting COVID-19. These persons should fulfill their obligations through some act of prayer or meditation upon the sacred scriptures for the Mass of the day.

Reception of the Precious Blood from a Common Chalice

For the time being, the suspension of receiving the Precious Blood from a common chalice remains in effect.

Holy Water

Holy Water will once again be available in fonts here at St. Anne within the next week or so. As a courtesy to one another, all are encouraged to sanitize their hands before using the holy water font. While the Holy Water will be replenished frequently, please use your own discretion when availing yourself of Holy Water from the font.
