

Second Reading:

Jesus turning water into wine at the wedding feast in Cana was one of the first public "signs" he performed revealing his divinity. It also showed Jesus' compassion, sparing the family shame at running short of wine. *How do you imagine the family reacted to Jesus' intervention and rescue?*

"Confession Through the Eyes of a Child"


En route to church to make his first confession, my nervous seven-year-old grandson asked me what he could expect.

The process for Baptism at St. Anne begins with completion of a Baptism Registration Form, which can be obtained in the Parish Office or requested via email. Parents requesting baptism must be in good standing with the Catholic Church. Complete requirements for Godparents are outlined on the Registration Form.

The steps for completing the process are below:

- 1. Return the completed Baptism Registration Form *with a copy of the child's state issued Birth Certificate*.
- 2. Parents and Godparents must complete classes if they have not done so within the last three years. In-person classes are back in session at St. Anne beginning Friday, January 21, 2022. Virtual preparation through Formed will no longer be accepted for new registrants who are not already in the preparation process. If you are in need of classes, you will be contacted to schedule them once the Registration Form and Birth Certificate are received.
- 3. If classes have already been completed within the past 3 years, provide dates Parents and Godparents completed baptism classes. If classes were taken at a parish other than St. Anne, obtain a letter from that parish verifying attendance at classes.
- 4. Submit all information to <u>parishoffice</u> <u>@stanne-tomball.org</u> with "BAPTISM' in the subject line.



GOSPEL MEDITATION ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE



Reflecting upon the deep measure of joy God has in us can be a source of joy for ourselves. Delight is infectious. A very young brother and sister were playing on the beach when the all too familiar ice cream truck made its daily rounds. The boy shook with excitement and delight as he took his sister's hand and exclaimed, "The ice cream man is here, isn't it great!" As they ran off toward the truck, one could hear the girl reply, "Yeah, I can't wait!" The experience of a child's delight in something so simple as ice cream, lifts our spirits from our burdens and transports us to the lighter, more innocent side of life.


