This past Friday we blessed and lit up our Outdoor Nativity Scene in the Church Plaza, as well as the big tree up by our parish entrance! A big THANK YOU to all the staff and parishioners (Facilities Committee, Arts & Environment, and others) who helped bring this project together with their creative ideas, planning and design expertise, and setup and construction efforts.

The Nativity Scene continues a tradition attributed to St. Francis of Assisi in 1223. You can read more about this tradition in *Admirable Signum: On the Meaning and Importance of the Nativity Scene*, an apostolic letter written by Pope Francis last December: <https://bit.ly/3fSeY7E>

In his letter, Pope Francis encourages us to participate in “the beautiful family tradition of preparing the nativity scene in the days before Christmas, but also the custom of setting it up in the workplace, in schools, hospitals, prisons and town squares.” Our MQP Nativity Scene will be on display as a blessing to our community throughout the Advent and Christmas Seasons, which concludes with the Baptism of the Lord on January 10th.

BLESS A PERSON IN NEED THIS CHRISTMAS

Our MQP Giving Tree looks a little different this year!

You can now find our *virtual* tree on the parish website and newsflash. Choose the organization you would like to support and select the gift card amount you would like to give. Please mail your gift cards to MQP or drop them off at the parish office by Dec 10th.

The gift cards will be given to the following organizations:

St Vincent de Paul: supports families and children who need help in providing gifts and/or groceries for their Christmas holiday.

St Francis House: provides shelter and services for homeless families and those in need. It is located in Seattle. They have a Christmas Toy Program that has provided gifts for approximately 1,000 children.

Providence Marianwood: is a not-for-profit skilled nursing and rehabilitation facility in Sammamish. Their founding principles and focus are to serve the poor and vulnerable in our community.

New Bethlehem Day Center: serves families experiencing homelessness on the Eastside. It provides access to food, laundry, computers and social services. This Day Center is in Kirkland.

Heartbeat Serving Wounded Warriors: provides emergency assistance, morale-building and innovative therapeutic services for Wounded Warriors and their families in Washington state. It is supported by Knights of Columbus and Our Lady of the Americas Assembly.

Tent City 4: is a homeless encampment located in King County. This self-managed community is home to both men and women.

Burlington Migrant Workers' Children: MQP's Charitable Giving Committee provided a donation to the Tri Parish Foodbank in Burlington to support their drive-through Christmas event for families with children.

During this unusual holiday season, your generosity through our virtual Giving Tree will help these organizations to bless the people they serve at Christmas.

SPOTLIGHT ON... *TWO BELOVED STAFF*

WE THANK YOU, KATHI ROWLEY

We are saying good-bye to two beloved MQP staff members, Kathi Rowley and Jennie Caldwell, who are retiring at the end of the month. Zoltan Abraham interviewed them about their experience in ministry.

Kathi felt called to ministry as a young girl. Her sense of vocation became clear in her late teens and early twenties, when she volunteered at a Franciscan retreat house. She became the first woman to be hired as a lay ecclesial minister in the Diocese of Duluth in Minnesota. In time, Kathi moved to the greater Seattle area, where she worked at St. Patrick's Parish on Capitol Hill, St. Luke's in Shoreline, St. John Vianney in Kirkland, and here at Mary, Queen of Peace.

Over the course of 42 and a half years in full-time ministry, Kathi has served in many different ways. The long list includes youth ministry, children's faith formation, preaching at Sunday Mass, making sick calls, leading the prayers for the dying and the deceased, presiding at graveside services, RCIA, infant baptism preparation, marriage preparation, stewardship, outreach, hospitality, social life, women's ministries, Engaged Church, Living Your Strength, and Alpha.

Kathi has experienced many profound blessings through her ministry. Among her favorite memories are times, like Summerfest at MQP, when she helped people of all ages gather to celebrate, eat, and play together, thereby forging deeper bonds in the community. Kathi will also forever cherish witnessing the profound transformation that programs such as Alpha and Living Your Strengths have brought about in people's lives.

When asked about her prayer for the Church at this time, she said she prays that we could be a people who come together in unity and peace and could be a people who bring hope and light into our world by our lived example. Kathi will miss the community of MQP deeply, and she will miss her life as a lay ecclesial minister. At the same time, she is looking forward to the new ways that God will call her to serve. She can't imagine her life not being focused on service.





WE THANK YOU, JENNIE CALDWELL

Though baptized in the Methodist Church, Jennie was not given a religious upbringing. However, her life was touched and transformed by people of faith, who gave her a sense of belonging, which in time helped her develop her own sense of faith. After college, Jennie was received into the Catholic Church. She volunteered in youth ministry, which helped her discern her sense of calling.

She soon embarked upon what would become 40 years of service in lay ecclesial ministry. In that time, she worked at Assumption and St. Patrick's Parishes in Seattle, Holy Family in Kirkland, St. Luke's in Shoreline, St. Brendan's in Bothell, Holy Innocents in Duvall, St. Madeline Sophie in Bellevue, and here at Mary, Queen of Peace. She has always felt called to the community where she was working. The many ways Jennie has served God's people during these years have included youth ministry, children and family ministry, RCIA, Vacation Bible Camp, and archdiocesan Easter camps for Junior High youth. In the course of her work, she developed pioneering, new approaches to family faith formation.

Jennie has many cherished memories from each community where she has served. At MQP, the last Vacation Bible Camp stands out. So many people - adults, teens, and children of all ages - worked together to make it a success. The energy, enthusiasm, and joy of the participants truly reflected the presence of the Holy Spirit. Jennie has also always enjoyed Children's Liturgy of the Word, where she loved hearing the kids' insights into the readings.

When asked what her prayer for the Church is, Jennie said that, as we are being called forward into a new world, she prays that we have the courage to move into it, bringing with us the gifts of the past, but not so tightly that we cannot walk ahead.




SPOTLIGHT ON... NEW PA FOR YOUTH MINISTRY

SPOTLIGHT ON... *CALLED TO SERVE AS CHRIST* CAMPAIGN



AN UPDATE & THANK YOU

An update on the Called to Serve as Christ Campaign from the Archdiocese: “Last Friday, November 27 marked the formal conclusion of the Steier Group’s contracted management of the *Called to Serve as Christ* capital campaign. This fruitful collaboration between the Steier Group and the Archdiocese of Seattle has enabled the campaign to raise over \$62 million thus far in support of the archdiocesan priest pension fund, the retired priest medical plan, several religious communities of women, and every parish in the archdiocese to address parochial needs. The Steier Group will continue to consult with the Archdiocese during the pledge redemption phase of the campaign in the years to come.”

This was a difficult time for a capital campaign. It began nearly four years ago with the first wave. At MQP, we were given the okay to wait until the final wave of the campaign, given the critical need to replace the roof. 70 other parishes were also in this final wave. Little did we know that it would come in the midst of a pandemic. Archbishop Etienne asked us to move forward so that all parishes would at least have the opportunity to respond. We went forward with a shortened, and simplified campaign. The original plan had been to host a dinner in the Social Hall with the Archbishop, among other things.

Many MQP parishioners were able to make a pledge to the campaign. By the time the final reports come in, MQP will have contributed over \$400,000 to the overall goal of \$10,000,000, funds which will be used to care for our retired sisters and priests. Approximately \$60,000 of the \$400,000 pledged will be rebated to MQP to help pay off the final costs of the roof and skylight projects.

A sincere thank you to all of the many parishioners who made a pledge. And thanks to those who were not able to make a financial pledge but have promised to keep the campaign in prayer; that is also an amazing gift. Particular thanks goes to Carol Morgan, who served as Parish Campaign Chair, as well as many volunteers who made follow up calls.

Let’s continue to keep our priests and sisters in prayer, and especially those who have retired after many years serving God’s people!
