MINISTRY OF THE MONTH

WHAT IS THE PERMANENT DIACONATE?

"The foundation of the Diaconate is given to us in Acts 6:1-7 where the Apostles selected seven reputable men, filled with the Holy Spirit and wisdom, to service so they would have more time for prayer and ministry of the Word. They chose Stephen, Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas and Nicholas.

St Paul, in his first letter to Timothy states the public qualities of a Deacon:

"Similarly, deacons must be dignified, not deceitful, not addicted to drink, not greedy for sordid gain, holding fast to the mystery of faith with a clear conscience. Moreover, they should be tested first, then if nothing is against them, let them serve as deacons."

From 110 AD to 325 AD, the Church developed a Hierarchy of three Orders: Bishop, Priest and Deacon. Deacons were leaders of small communities, envoys for the Bishops and administrators of temporal goods.

After the Council of Nicea, the rise in sacerdotalism, the separation of religion and liturgy from secular life, and the resentment of power over property, led to the council of Sardica in 343 AD stating that the Diaconate should be absorbed into the Presbyterate Order and the Diaconate become a transition into the Priesthood. By the fifth century the Diaconate had declined and been fully absorbed. Some prominent Deacons were Stephen the first Martyr, St Philip who hosted Paul and Luke in Caesarea, St. Lawrence in Rome, St. Ephrem in Syria, St. Alcuin in England and St. Francis of Assisi. All were strong Evangelists.

At the Council of Trent there was a proposal to re-instate the Diaconate to its original function within the Church. Though it was received well, it was not carried into effect. During World War II, Internees in Dachau Prison Camp were concerned about the future of the Church after the war. After their release, they formed the first Diaconate Circle, outlining Diaconal Ministries, and petitioned the Vatican II Council for re-instatement of the Diaconate. It was favorably received. The Council expressed three reasons; 1. Desire to enrich the Church with the functions of the diaconate. 2. Strengthen with the grace of ordination those already exercising functions of the diaconate and 3. To provide regions, where there was a shortage of clergy, with sacred ministers.

Documents from Vatican Council II incorporated the renewal of the Diaconate. In 1968, the U.S Bishops requested permission to establish the Diaconate in the United States and guidelines were issued. NCCB established a standing committee on the Permanent Diaconate and the first Permanent Deacons were ordained in 1972. National Guidelines were revised in 1984 and the New National Directory was submitted to Rome in 2003 and approved in 2004 by Rome and the USCCB. Today there are almost 20,000 ordained Permanent Deacons, 85% of them are active in their ministry.

The National Directory looks at four dimensions for a Deacon; Human, Spiritual, Intellectual and Pastoral.

It suggests that these dimensions are not learned but innate in the individual. The word *deacon* has its origin in Diakonia meaning slave or servant. St. John Paul II stated; "By the standards of the world, servant-hood is despised but in the wisdom and providence of God, it is a mystery through which Christ redeems the world, and you are ministers of that mystery of the gospel." And again in Detroit, he stated; "Yours is not just one ministry among others, but it is truly meant to be a driving force for the Church's Diakonia. By your ordination you are configured to Christ in His servant role. You are also meant to be a living sign of the servant-hood of His Church."

The Catechism #1534 states: "Two other sacraments, Holy Orders and Matrimony, are directed towards the salvation of others. If they contribute as well to personal salvation, it is through service to others that they do so." The Deacon is a visible, living, personal sign of service required of the Church itself and all goes back to the washing of the feet by Jesus; "I come to serve." So the Deacon serves in three main areas; The Word, The Liturgy/Sacraments, and Charity.

He is not just someone who performs sacramental signs, he is a sacramental sign of Christ the servant, an Icon of the suffering servant, called beyond his baptism. The question is not what a Deacon does but rather who a Deacon is. He has a special relationship with his bishop. The bishop sharing his ministry with the deacon and priest becomes visible when the Deacon, at the Liturgy, is the minister of the cup and the Priest the minister of the host. A Deacon, if present, proclaims the Gospel. He is not a mini priest or super lay person but is clergy, living in the lay world, with one foot in the sanctuary and one foot in the secular world. Bringing both together he lays the prayers, the needs of the people and world, on the Altar where they are consecrated and transformed leading to acts of Charity. The Deacon's mantra is "Here I am Lord. I come to do your will."


