

FROM THE DESK OF FR. CHAD

Dear Friends,

On Pentecost Sunday, the Archdiocese published a new Pastoral Plan, which invites all of us—as parishes, ministries, families, and individuals—to “prayerfully discern how we are living our faith and carrying out the mission of the Church.” The mission is simply the “Great Commission” that Jesus gave to us before His Ascension to Heaven:



Jesus said to his disciples, “All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.” (Matthew 28:18-20)

The development of the plan began in March 2020, and was informed by consultation with the Archdiocesan Pastoral Council, listening sessions around the Archdiocese, and feedback from online surveys made available to the public. Archbishop Etienne invites all of us to read the plan and begin praying and discerning how Jesus Christ is inviting each one of us to know Him better and embrace His mission for our parish and our lives:

THE SEED STARTED SPROUTING

The seed had been planted and even though it appeared to have fallen on infertile soil, God had a plan. Decades later, the seed started sprouting...

I'd like to start off by giving you a summary of my spiritual upbringing. I was born to Gustavo Rodriguez Inestroza, a salesman, and Anna Ventura Gomez Carrero, a full time wife and mother. I was given the name Anna Concepcion Rodriguez Gomez.

On July 4th, 1976, I was baptized at our beautiful Cathedral in my hometown of San Pedro Sula, Honduras, a small country in Central America. That day, I was given the keys to an earthly spiritual home; one that I would ignorantly badmouth, but to which after years of wandering, I would come back: my now beloved Catholic Church.

I am not certain but I believe I received my First Communion when I was between seven and nine years old. Tia Celea, one of my paternal aunts, a devout Catholic woman, helped prepare me so I could receive my second Sacrament of Initiation.

During my teenage years, I joined a group at church that met on Saturdays for a couple of hours each week. We sang songs and read and studied the Bible. I don't remember the reason, but after some time, I stopped attending this Saturday gathering. As a girl, I also remember learning to pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet with my mother, and for some time we prayed it daily at 3:00 p.m.; the hour of Divine Mercy.

As I grew older, my questions pertaining to religion, the existence of God and faith, grew more complex and the answers I received did not satisfy me. I kept searching for answers, but of course, I was searching in all the wrong places. I engaged in long, soul-searching conversations over a few adult beverages with other lost sheep. I visited churches of other denominations, read about other spiritual approaches, watched videos that famous people suggested... you name it!

At that time, I had some open wounds from traumatic events that happened to me during my childhood, and the pain intensified during my teenage and young adult years. The concept I had then about God and religion was totally wrong but that was all I knew. I was already going through enough pain and didn't want to be close to this *God* of which all I thought to be true about Him was that He was out there to prohibit and punish. My perception of God was that He constantly reminded me that I was a failure and that He was a God that allowed babies to get cancer and good people to suffer. I was so confused; wasn't God supposed to be love? Spiritually, I was a disaster. As a result, I got consumed by the world and tried to numb my pain by distracting myself with earthly pleasures.

Ignorance is daring; I criticized everything I knew about church. I came up with as many excuses as I could as to why I wasn't attending Mass. Then one day I decided that I didn't need a "middle man" (church) and I would have a relationship directly with God without the Church! Sacraments remained not only unimportant to me, but at this point in my life, unnecessary for the good relationship I would develop with God on my own. Prayer remained a very intense practice, but only (cont. on pg. 6)

(cont. from pg. 4) when I was worried, needed something, or in those occasions in which I would travel by planes (I don't love to fly, so during takeoff my praying reached its peak intensity).

God has called my name throughout my life; He wanted to heal my wounds long ago, but it wasn't until I started tuning out noises from the world that I heard His voice. In the summer of 2020, I sank into a deep depression. Nothing made sense to me, my husband David was hurting, seeing my pain. I felt like I did not belong to this world; in which lies were forced to us as "truths" and in which hedonism was sold as love. The worst part of it all was that it soon became part of the education my young kids were receiving! One night I started reading religious articles that a beloved family member of mine shared with me, but at the time they had sent them, I had left unopened in my phone. I now know this family member had been praying a lot for me. There was a time in my despair where I didn't even want to answer phone calls, so she sensed something was wrong and she made a point to share more religious videos with me. One day I asked her to pray with me for the end to abortion and in that moment, God took the veil off of my eyes! I had a profound sense of God's presence with me. I didn't understand where this peace and joy was coming from but I wanted more of it. A burning desire to know our Lord exploded in my chest. After that, I started coming to Mass daily. All of a sudden it made sense that if taking care of one's physical appearance requires daily exercise and healthy eating, taking care of your soul requires good spiritual food and daily Mass. I started searching for answers, but this time from the right sources! I also started praying the Rosary to our blessed Mother, the Virgin Mary.



Soon after I realized that I needed to catch up with some pending subjects. Confirmation became a priority along with bringing my 20-year civil union to church. I also inquired about getting my six-year-old son baptized. St. Philip Neri was the Saint I chose to be my companion. When I read he was "the Saint who laughed his way to heaven", I felt an instant bond with him. I believe there is an immeasurable value in laughing. Today, I joyfully confirm to you all, my fellow MQP family: I am a devout Catholic and I want to spend the rest of my days on earth learning about and serving our Lord. I want to do this without any fear and with all my love. I vow to always tell the truth (the ONE and ONLY truth) and to carry God's message, inspired by the Holy Spirit. I am only a speck of dust in this world and all the glory is God's. He has seen through my brokenness and came to rescue His lost sheep. I recognize myself as a sinner, but now I am aiming to live my life as a Saint and maybe one day, meet and laugh with Philip about how seriously I took myself at times.

God bless you all and may God pour His Divine Mercy over you.



BIDDING FAREWELL TO TWO PILLARS OF OUR COMMUNITY

Ron and Mary Long were attending St. Joseph's Parish in Issaquah when the formation of Mary, Queen of Peace Parish was announced. The area was very rural at the time, mostly fields and trees. Sheep, cows, and horses would not have been an unusual sight. 228th was a two-lane road with one blinking light. The stores we are used to were not there yet. Instead, an old country store called Sadler's stood where the Shell station is today. Kids would ride their horses there and leave them tied up at the hitching post while they bought candy.

Ron and Mary had never experienced the formation of a new parish before, and they were very excited to be a part of the new community of Mary, Queen of Peace. They were there at the first Sunday Mass, held at what was then the Lutheran Bible Institute, and at the groundbreaking for the new building. They both became very involved in the life of the parish, as did all the founding families. (Continued on pg. 8)

(Continued from pg. 7) Both Ron and Mary feel very blessed to have been Eucharistic Ministers at MQP. Ron has also been very involved with the Knights of Columbus, who have sponsored many parish projects, including pancake breakfasts, the coat drives, and the building and maintenance of the Grotto behind the church. Mary has loved being a part of Art and Environment, where she helped create the funeral pall and the hanging flames for Pentecost. She has also found the Funeral Reception Ministry very rewarding, since that ministry helps people when they are going through an especially tough time.

Their favorite memories from the time they spent at MQP would take a long time to narrate. But what stands out for Ron and Mary especially is the community of Mary, Queen of Peace - the people who come from all parts of the world to make our parish the special place it is. Ron and Mary have also deeply admired the commitment of the community to supporting youth ministry. Today, Ron and Mary are preparing to move to Sultan in order to be with the youth of their own family, their grandchildren, hoping to be more of an instrumental part of their future and faith.

They plan to be just as involved in their new parish, which will probably be St. Mary's of the Valley in Monroe. When asked what advice they would give to newcomers to MQP, they said: "Think of areas where you would like to be involved. Introduce yourself to a leader or member of that group. Don't wait to be invited. Invite yourself." Ron and Mary will be greatly missed at MQP. At the same time, we can say confidently that the seeds that they have planted in our community will continue to blossom for years to come. And the seeds that MQP planted within them throughout their own spiritual journey will now flourish in another soil. God has given them gifts here to share with others in a new community.

YEAR OF THE EUCHARIST & YEAR OF THE FAMILY

GOOD NEWS INDEED

Last year, Archbishop Etienne declared June 21st, 2020 through June 6th, 2021 to be the Year of the Eucharist for the Archdiocese of Seattle. Many were puzzled when this was announced as the beginning of this special year landed during a worldwide pandemic where the laity were actually unable to receive the Eucharist as parishes were only just beginning to look at a reopening plan. But the fact that this year began during a time when many weren't receiving Jesus in the Eucharist, has in some ways, only made the year more impactful. I know my own encounter with Christ when we were finally able to return to Mass was powerful; that longing I had to receive Him only made me appreciate the Eucharist more. If this past year hasn't been one where you have been able to really celebrate Christ coming to us under the disguise of simple bread and wine, that is okay! Anytime is a good time to learn more about Christ's true presence in the Eucharist and His love for us. The Catechism of the Catholic Church is a great resource to learn more about His true presence in the Eucharist. For me, learning about Eucharistic Miracles played a profound roll in believing in Jesus' presence. Ask God to guide you as you seek to learn more about how He is coming to you, body, soul and divinity, each and every time you are at Mass.

As this Year of the Eucharist comes to a close, it overlaps with a new year declared by Pope Francis: The Year of the Family. Below is an excerpt, published from the Archdiocese of Seattle, about this special year.

“The Christian proclamation on the family is good news indeed” ~ Pope Francis, *Amoris Laetitia*, 1

Pope Francis established the Year of the Family on March 19, 2021, the Solemnity of St. Joseph. This marks the fifth anniversary of the publication of his Apostolic Exhortation, *Amoris Laetitia*, which means "The joy of love" and explores the beauty and joy found in family life.

The Year of the Family will conclude on June 26, 2022, on the occasion of the tenth World Meeting of Families in Rome with the Holy Father.

Pope Francis established the Year of the Family to help strengthen faith and live God's joy more fruitfully in family life.
