





MINISTRY OF THE MONTH | CONFESSION



“Free to serve Him
with joyful love.”

ARE YOU MISSING A CRUCIAL SOURCE OF GRACE, FREEDOM, PEACE & JOY?

Have you considered taking part regularly in the beautiful sacrament of healing, the Sacrament of Reconciliation? You'll be surprised about how unburdened you feel after taking part in it. So many experiences; commonly deep feelings of peace, joy, relief, and love never expected. The Sacrament where, citing Saint Teresa, "*only to confession can we go as sinners with sin and come out as sinners without sin,*" we experience complete freedom. Jesus is calling us to experience His mercy in this way. Other benefits are to become better versions of ourselves; more self-knowledge, habitual virtue, inner peace, conscience refinement and the strength to overcome temptations and recover relationships.

So, with the decision to get these blessings, sometimes a question remains: how exactly do I make a good Confession? The essential requisites are to have the intention of being closer to God with our whole heart, humbly like the "prodigal son," and to acknowledge our sins with genuine sorrow before the priest.

Modern society seems to have lost the sense of sin; therefore, an effort to recognize our sins in our daily actions, words, and omissions is crucial. The Gospels show us the importance of the forgiveness of our sins. The lives of the saints prove they grew in holiness having a stronger sense of sin, sorrow for sins, and a need for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. No wonder the saints are filled with joy! They have discovered the key to handing over their burdens to Christ, so they can be free to serve Him with joyful love.

Remember, if you need help - especially if you have been away for some time - simply ask the priest, and he will help by "walking you through" the steps to make a good confession.

Before Confession, be genuinely sorry for your sins. This essential act of Penance is contrition: a clear and decisive rejection and repentance of the sin committed, together with a resolution not to commit it again out of love for God. The resolution to avoid committing these sins is a sure sign of genuine sorrow, a resolution to try to avoid the near occasions of sin suffices for true repentance. In cooperation with the intention to rectify our life, God's grace will give us the strength to resist and overcome temptation in the future. To be truly sorry for our sins, we should recognize our mortal and venial sins first. There are a few helpful patterns for doing this which you can discover by searching for "examination of conscience before Confession" on the web.

("WATER IS LIFE" IN DAGBONI, A GHANAIAN TRIBAL LANGUAGE)



This weekend, MQP holds its Buckets of Compassion drive to support providing local, clean, reliable water to waterless communities in Ghana.

Water Access Now (WAN), a local non-profit, uses funds raised by MQP and other donors to bring water to those who have none in Ghana. WAN partners with Catholic Relief Services (CRS) Ghana to bring practical, sustainable solutions to the 6-7 million Ghanaians who lack water. Find out more about WAN at: wateraccess.org.

Even last year, 2020, despite the pandemic, WAN and CRS Ghana made great strides and MQP donated over \$23,000 to this effort! If you'd like to read the WAN 2020 Progress Report from CRS Ghana, click on WAN 2020 PROGRESS REPORT (squarespace.com).

MQP parishioner, Gene Cash, describes the vital work that our Buckets of Compassion does in Ghana: "Until I visited Ghana years ago, I did not understand how important our donations were to Buckets of Compassion each year. The chairman of water and sanitation in Ghana has said: 'In the past we had more rains, today we don't have those rains. With your donations, the borehole will be our savior.' Information from a nurse says 'We use water for everything. Drinking, infant delivery, hand washing, and cooking just to name a few reasons of the borehole importance.' "

DONATE TO BUCKETS OF COMPASSION JULY 3 & 4



MQP's annual Buckets of Compassion fundraiser, for bringing water to waterless villages, schools, and health centers in Ghana, is this weekend. When we fund wells in Ghana, we bring the gift of improved health, more productive time for women (because they don't have to spend hours each day fetching water), and increased school time for girls (also since they don't have to spend hours walking for water). What a great gift! Please be as generous as you can. Donations can be made online via the MQP website, put in the collection at Mass, or brought to the MQP office.

Benefits of local, clean water include increase in health for the communities. One woman, interviewed a year after her village received a well, was asked "What is different for you now?" Her answer: "None of my children died this year."

Additionally, with local wells, women have more productive time in their day. At one basket weaving cooperative that received a well, one of the weavers said "I have three more hours in my day to weave baskets to sell now that the well is here."

When a well comes to a village, girls are more likely to be able to go to school. They don't have to spend their days walking for water or caring for younger siblings while their mother walks for water. Educating girls and women leads to better lives for Ghanaians.

MQP's support since 2008 has brought life - and hope - to thousands of Ghanaians. There are still waterless communities to be served and we pray that this year's Buckets of Compassion will be able to help some of them!

SUBMITTING OURSELVES TO GOD'S WILL

St. John urges us to “not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are of God” 1 John 4:1. We go about testing these spirits through the process of discernment. Discernment is a necessary part of the Christian life because it helps us to figure out God’s will for us. The word *discernment* comes from the Latin word *discernere*, which means to separate or divide. When we discern something, we make a conscious decision to submit ourselves to God’s will. We can trust that God does not directly will evil in our lives, and so we should discern the good; for example, it would be absurd that we try to discern whether or not we should steal.

Through good discernment we are able to live out the vocation preordained for us by God at the moment of our Baptism. Our primary vocation is sanctity or holiness and we live this vocation through our secondary vocation of either Holy Matrimony, Holy Orders, Single Life, or Religious Life. Thus, when we discern it is not as simple as making a decision between whether I want chocolate or vanilla ice cream, but looking to see how God is calling us to live our holy lives. This means that discernment is not limited to vocation, albeit that is a fundamental subject of discernment, but also applies to how we should live out holiness on a daily basis.

Now that we have established what discernment is, how do we discern God’s will for us? St. Ignatius of Loyola provides us with a spectacular tool for discernment called the discernment of spirits. In our daily lives we are influenced by both good and evil spirits, and through discernment we seek to follow the good. To properly discern the spirits, we should be in a state of grace through the periodic reception of the sacrament of Reconciliation, as outside a state of grace we have turned away from God, which makes it difficult to see where He is calling us. St. Ignatius recommends us that we first put ourselves in the presence of God in prayer and then offer to Him the subject of our discernment. Where we experience peace, joy, and fulfillment is where the good spirit calls us; and, where we experience anxiousness, fear, and confusion is where the evil spirit is calling.

In the last few years, with the help of my spiritual director, I have been able to discern that God is calling me to seminary formation, to grow in relationship with Him, as that is where I experience joy and peace in my prayer.
