THE SYNODAL PROCESS: WE ARE A LISTENING CHURCH

The word Synod is not yet familiar to each of us, however it soon will be. Simply stated, Synod is the art of listening to every one of us and Pope Francis has launched a history making 2 year listening project; one that is expected to have a global reach and change the Catholic Church in fundamental ways for a strong future.

I will be coordinating and facilitating this project on behalf of Mary, Queen of Peace. The task is to listen to you and to all Christians within the Parish boundaries. Yes, this project is all-inclusive; people who attend, people who do not attend, former & future members, people at risk or disconnected, and people of other denominations. We need to gather broad input from everyone, record everyone's thoughts and add those to the other people who live in the Archdiocese of Seattle. The Archbishop will then send that input to the USCCB, who will then forward it to the Vatican.

What input do we need? We need to know two things:

- Is our journey together through life and the Gospel happening today in our Church?
- What steps does the Holy Spirit invite us to take in order to grow in our journeying together?

We need **you** to discern the answers to these questions for yourself and then relay your thoughts to us. This may be a story, an example, a memory, or a hope or dream. As facilitators, we will provide you with a safe, and sacred, place to share your input and promise to faithfully record and relay your thoughts.

What can you do today? Pray. Pray for the insight and guidance that the thoughts you will offer will reflect the Holy Spirit and chart a course for our future. Pray that these thoughts will help with the journey, will heal wounds, and will lay the foundation for the Church.

As the coordinator, I am currently recruiting members for a team to plan, promote, invite, host and record your thoughts. We will use all forms of communication – in-person meetings, virtual meetings, phone calls, e-mails and simple conversations. If you are interested in joining this team, please contact me. For everyone, please look for the invitations to a listening session starting in January.



CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD

“LET THE CHILDREN COME TO ME...

...and do not prevent them; for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these.”

It has been a gift to prepare the atrium this fall for the little ones of Mary, Queen of Peace. Parishioners are answering the call of Jesus to bring children to Him. Many have shared their talents to prepare linens, upscale small furniture, make dioramas, and paint figures. On behalf of the children and their families, thank you! The Catechesis embraces the child’s need to listen with their heart and work with their hands. Our material makers have been blessed by this work too. Thank you MQP for making this happen in 3 months! This fall, we prepared the Level I atrium (for ages 3-6) located in the Elizabeth Ann Seton Room.

This Advent 2021, our parish became home to the 3rd atrium on the Eastside – along with Holy Family in Kirkland and St. Monica on Mercer Island. We welcomed a small group of children who gather during four separate session times. As CGS continues to grow here, we invite catechist volunteers and material makers to join our atrium community! This allows us to serve our parish families, along with Family Formation and Sacramental Preparation.

In early December, during a presentation on the Annunciation, we pondered the words of angel Gabriel: *Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name him Jesus.*

The catechist asked, “What was it like for Mary to hold Jesus in her womb, to be a dwelling place for God?”
One of the children responded, “Heaven. It’s like heaven.”

We’ve only had a few sessions so far, but I trust that there will be more beautiful responses like these in the atrium. The most common response in any Level I atrium is silence. After a presentation of the Good Shepherd parable or the model altar, the children often sit in silence. In that silence, I am confident that Christ the Teacher is speaking to them. The Holy Spirit will fan the flames of faith already alive within each child.

Come, Lord Jesus! Come and dwell in us! Make us more and more like You. Make us small like You for the kingdom of Heaven belongs to such as these.

PLANTING SEEDS FOR THE KINGDOM

For the past month of Family Formation & Sacramental Preparation classes, I have been blessed to meet many MQP families and hear about how much they have been learning and enjoying the new program. The classes are offered to families whose children are in grades 1st to 5th who wish to learn more about the beauty of Catholicism as well as to help prepare the children to receive their sacraments. The Family Formation & Sac. Prep is a new model where parents and children meet in person for class twice a month and learn together about Scripture and the teachings of the Catholic faith. Classes are filled with dynamism and opportunities for children and grownups to participate in the different activities, to build community, as well as to encounter Jesus through Lectio Divina meditations and meaningful conversations. Lastly, this program is also meant to equip parents to become the main catechists of for their children, preparing them with the answers to their children's most challenging questions about the faith.

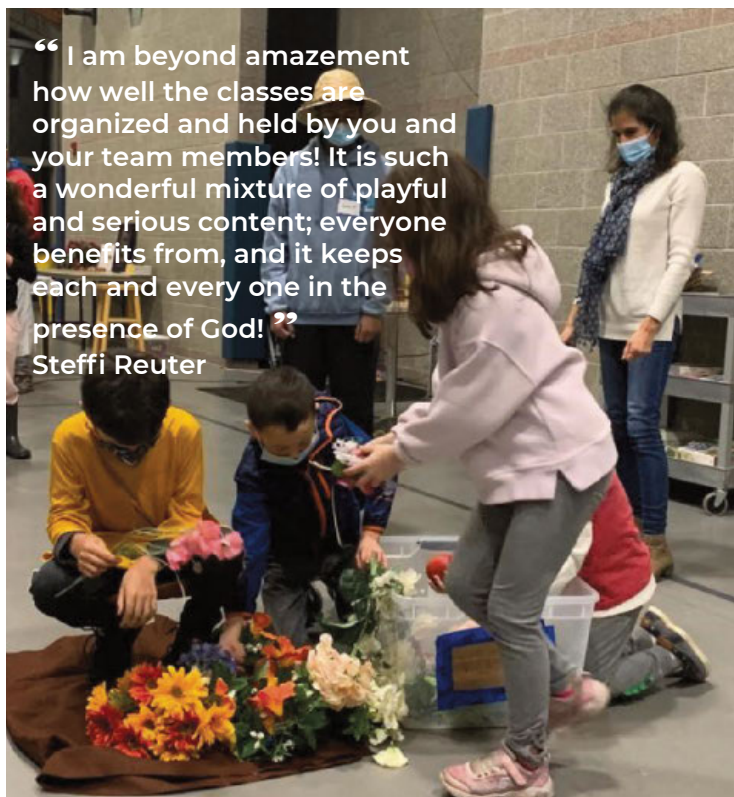
Families whose children are 7yrs or older and are candidates to receive their First Reconciliation and First Communion, also need to register for the Family Formation & Sacramental Preparation program. Additionally, there are several things that need to be completed in order for your child to receive these sacraments.

1. Complete registration and payment online **before December 31, 2021.**
2. Submit a copy of your child's Baptism Certificate.
3. Become a member of MQP (if your family is not already one)

**There is an attendance policy that states that your child is expected to attend all the classes, as it is important for the student to study and learn the meaning of the sacrament. (No student is to miss 4 classes during the year).*

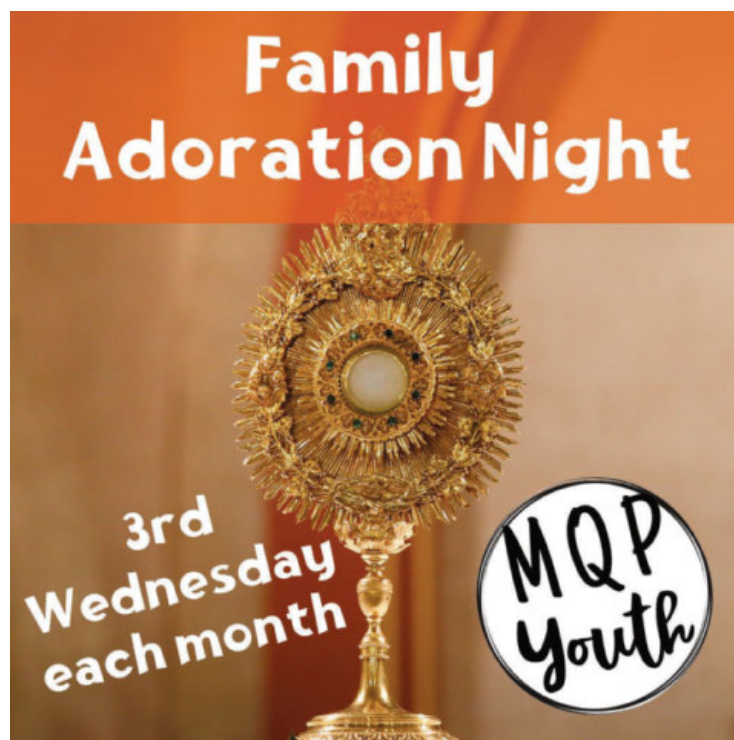

RCIA: LEADING AND WELCOMING OTHERS INTO FULL COMMUNION WITH THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (a.k.a. RCIA), is an entryway into the fullness of faith in Christ and reception into the Catholic Church for baptized Christians or adults who have not yet received the sacrament of baptism.

The RCIA Team at Mary Queen of Peace is composed of 5 lay ministers. They share the joy of facilitating RCIA each Sunday morning after having heard the Word and listened to the homily at the 9:00 Mass. Classes culminate at the Easter Vigil.

In addition to Sunday morning RCIA, the team is considering ways to run a “year-round RCIA”, possibly through a combination of in-person and virtual meetings, or meeting at coffee shops and pubs – opportunities where seekers can ask questions about the Catholic Faith before they step into the formal RCIA process.



“I am a convert myself and really appreciated the RCIA process when I went through it,” says Diantha Zschoche. “So now I find real joy in walking along with others in their spiritual journey to the Catholic faith. It is always so interesting to see the myriad of ways that Our Father draws people to the Church.”

MEN “CATCHING FIRE” AT MQP!

Fellowship ministries for men, at Mary Queen of Peace, really “caught fire” in 2021!

“When Father Chad told us in a homily about Exodus-90 (exodus90.com), some of us guys took it to heart and started a group and ventured out,” says Kevin McCarthey. *“the best way I can describe it is “It’s like a boot camp, trek, and retreat with Jesus and MQP brothers... Transformative!”*

Then the pandemic happened, but nothing slowed us down. Father also introduced us to Sacred Story Community (sacredstory.net/ssc) and another men’s movement emerged, with a focus on Ignatian Prayer. Buck Frymier tells his experience like this; “I’m drawing closer to God, and this new awareness of His presence, has helped me to see myself as His instrument for loving others”.

In spring of 2021, we had an amazing [Men On Fire Conference](#), which ignited a flame for many more men! Says Francisco Moraes, “A life changing opportunity to revive my Confirmation, joined by Mary and the Apostles - experiencing heaven being torn open and being filled with the Holy Spirit just like at Pentecost!”

This summer, several men started up the monthly [Saturday Men’s Breakfast](#), which usually falls on the second Saturday of each month. We meet at 7:30am where we gather for coffee, breakfast, and share stories.

The [Men’s Prayer Group](#), moving into its seventh year, meets each week from 7:30-8:30 p.m. on Wednesday’s, via ZOOM. The group also usually meets once a month in person for “pint night”. Member Werner Fee says, “The group helps me refocus, from daily struggles to God, and the companionship helps me know that I am not alone.”

[The Knights of Columbus](#), the most enduring men’s fraternity in the Catholic Church today, lives strong at MQP and also meets on Wednesday evenings. *“The Knights provide the unity to accomplish big projects, far more than any of us could do alone”. ~ Jim Chambers*

[The Spanish speaking](#) men's group is currently under re-construction, but there will be news coming out soon in early 2022. Sergio Queija describes his past experience with the Spanish-speaking men's group: “When I came to the USA I not only found great new friends but also support from the Spanish men group in MQP that helped me to find a better path for me to find Jesus. I really needed that support at that time and God gave me the opportunity to find this group and support me in my faith growth through the years”.

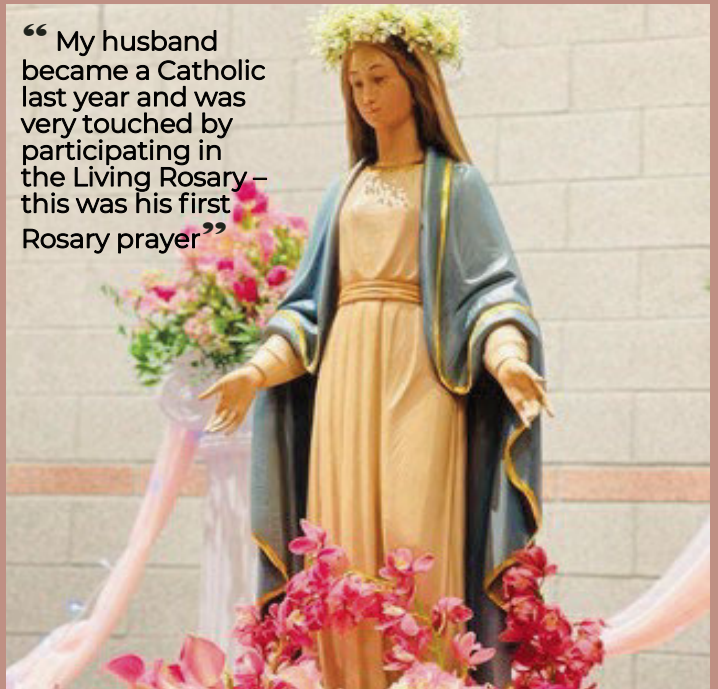

LK 2:41-52

Each year Jesus' parents went to Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, and when he was twelve years old, they went up according to festival custom. After they had completed its days, as they were returning, the boy Jesus remained behind in Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it. Thinking that he was in the caravan, they journeyed for a day and looked for him among their relatives and acquaintances, but not finding him, they returned to Jerusalem to look for him. After three days they found him in the temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions, and all who heard him were astounded at his understanding and his answers. When his parents saw him, they were astonished, and his mother said to him, "Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety." And he said to them, "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" But they did not understand what he said to them. He went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them; and his mother kept all these things in her heart. And Jesus advanced in wisdom and age and favor before God and man.
