



SAINT OF THE WEEK

ST. BLAISE | FEBRUARY 3


You may be familiar with the annual "blessing of throats" that many parishes in the United States use to commemorate the beloved bishop and martyr. St. Blaise lived in the fourth century in Turkey and Armenia. Due to religious persecution, he was forced to flee and hide in a cave in the back country in order to save his life.

History has it that one day a group of hunters stumbled upon where St. Blaise was living. They found the bishop kneeling in prayer, surrounded by wolves, lions, and bears that he had tamed. The legend has it that as the hunters dragged Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command, the child was able to cough up the bone and thus lived.

Today we remember the saint on his feast day by taking two candles, crossing them against the throat, and saying the following prayer:

Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from ailments of the throat and from every other evil. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

We were impressed with the time and effort they invested with the Discernment Guide before the session. Their effort led to a productive set of small group meetings and resulted in meaningful discovery. The participants bonded quickly with each other and we felt a bit bad in having to call time for the meeting to end that evening.

As intended, the discussions ranged far & wide with points of view on many subjects. Some was local parish, others more regional, and they touched on national & global issues as well. It was friendly, productive and all of us came away with a deep respect for each other. A side benefit of the process was that people have new friends and acquaintances at Mary Queen of Peace.

To clarify a couple of points:

The multiple sessions we will be holding are all expected to be more or less the same so there is no need to attend more than one meeting. You are free to come with others you know, or to simply sign up for which ever one is convenient. Please do register so that we can arrange space and staff to keep the breakout groups small.

The Discernment Guide (available on the website or copies are available on the table in the Narthex) is not a survey, not a list of specific questions. It is only an outline with some ideas on how to get started with your reflection with the Holy Spirit about your Journey and the discernment about how you are moved to contribute to the session.

We had people participate who had some real motivation and passion to tell their stories, their thoughts. As facilitators, we were moved by the revelations and energized for the next sessions. We hope to see you there!

FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME—JANUARY 30, 2022

READING I <u>JER 1:4-5, 17-19</u>

The word of the LORD came to me, saying:

Before I formed you in the womb I knew you,
before you were born I dedicated you,
a prophet to the nations I appointed you.

But do you gird your loins; stand up and tell them all that I command you. Be not crushed on their account,

as though I would leave you crushed before

them;

for it is I this day

who have made you a fortified city,

a pillar of iron, a wall of brass, against the whole land: against Judah's kings and princes,

against its priests and people.

They will fight against you but not prevail over you, for I am with you to deliver you, says the LORD.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM LK 1:46-55

R. (cf. 15ab) I will sing of your salvation.

In you, O LORD, I take refuge;

let me never be put to shame.

In your justice rescue me, and deliver me;

incline your ear to me, and save me. R.

Be my rock of refuge,

a stronghold to give me safety, for you are my rock and my fortress.

O my God, rescue me from the hand of the wicked. R.

For you are my hope, O Lord;

my trust, O God, from my youth.

On you I depend from birth;

from my mother's womb you are my strength. R.

My mouth shall declare your justice,

day by day your salvation.

O God, you have taught me from my youth,

and till the present I proclaim your wondrous deeds. R.

READING II 1 COR 12:31—13:13

Brothers and sisters:

Strive eagerly for the greatest spiritual gifts. But I shall show you a still more excellent way.

If I speak in human and angelic tongues,

but do not have love,

I am a resounding gong or a clashing cymbal.

And if I have the gift of prophecy,

and comprehend all mysteries and all knowledge;

if I have all faith so as to move mountains,

but do not have love, I am nothing.

If I give away everything I own,

and if I hand my body over so that I may boast,

but do not have love, I gain nothing.

Love is patient, love is kind.

It is not jealous, it is not pompous,

It is not inflated, it is not rude.

it does not seek its own interests,

it is not quick-tempered, it does not brood over injury,

it does not rejoice over wrongdoing

but rejoices with the truth.

It bears all things, believes all things,

hopes all things, endures all things.

Love never fails.

If there are prophecies, they will be brought to nothing;

if tongues, they will cease;

if knowledge, it will be brought to nothing.

For we know partially and we prophesy partially,

but when the perfect comes, the partial will pass away.

When I was a child, I used to talk as a child,

think as a child, reason as a child;

when I became a man, I put aside childish things.

At present we see indistinctly, as in a mirror,

but then face to face.

At present I know partially;

then I shall know fully, as I am fully known.

So faith, hope, love remain, these three;

but the greatest of these is love.

GOSPEL

LK 4:21-30

Jesus began speaking in the synagogue, saying:

"Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."

And all spoke highly of him

and were amazed at the gracious words that came from his

They also asked, "Isn't this the son of Joseph?"

He said to them, "Surely you will quote me this proverb,

'Physician, cure yourself,' and say,

'Do here in your native place

the things that we heard were done in Capernaum."

And he said, "Amen, I say to you,

no prophet is accepted in his own native place.

Indeed, I tell you,

there were many widows in Israel in the days of Elijah when the sky was closed for three and a half years

and a severe famine spread over the entire land.

It was to none of these that Elijah was sent,

but only to a widow in Zarephath in the land of Sidon.

Again, there were many lepers in Israel

during the time of Elisha the prophet;

yet not one of them was cleansed, but only Naaman the Syrian."

When the people in the synagogue heard this,

they were all filled with fury.

They rose up, drove him out of the town,

and led him to the brow of the hill

on which their town had been built,

to hurl him down headlong.

But Jesus passed through the midst of them and went




