## FIRST READING

### ACTS 2:1-11

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together.

And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were.

Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven staying in Jerusalem. At this sound, they gathered in a large crowd, but they were confused because each one heard them speaking in his own language.

## UPDATE REGARDING COVID RESTRICTIONS

### OFFICIAL STATEMENT FROM BISHOP PETER CHRISTENSEN

On May 11, Governor Little with the Department of Health and Welfare announced that Idaho has moved out of Stage Three into Stage Four of the Idaho Rebounds Guidelines. Therefore, today, in thanksgiving I am instructing our parishes to remove COVID-19-based restrictions as we continue to move toward pre-pandemic conditions. Specifically:

- + There are no size limits at liturgies or other parish gatherings;
- + While individuals may choose to wear masks, masks are not required in our parishes;
- + Signs requiring the use of Masks should be removed from your parish facilities;
- + Devices used to maintain six feet of distancing—ropes, tape, signs, and any other forms of barricades—should be removed from all parish spaces;
- + Parishes should resume the use of missals, bulletins, collection baskets, and other items in their pews and common areas;
- + Holy water fonts should be filled with blessed water;
- + Ministries or activities of the laity that may have been discontinued during the pandemic (e.g., lectors, gift-bearers, altar servers, extraordinary ministers, etc.) are to be restored;
- + The Sign of Peace may return to its pre-COVID practice;
- + Any other measures you may have in place to accommodate these restrictions are encouraged to be discontinued at this time;
- + Restrictions to receive solely on the hand are no longer in place;

- + Beginning on the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, priests are to resume the distribution of the Precious Blood to the faithful at the time of Communion;
- + Also, beginning on Corpus Christi, I am discontinuing the dispensation of the obligation to attend Mass. As always, the faithful must use their own judgement regarding whether or not to attend Mass if they have any concerns regarding their health.



As we approach the Solemnity of Pentecost, we prepare to celebrate the birth of our Church—rejoicing in the love of God which, through the Holy Spirit, made us one people in the Body of Christ. This is a fitting time for our parishes to be restored this unity in the fullness of our liturgies: One people gathered in Christ, partaking fully in His Body and Blood.

Animated by the Holy Spirit, with faith in God's goodness, may the Church in Idaho continue to thrive under your pastoral care. I am grateful for the care you have given the faithful under your leadership and I ask for your continued efforts and prayers for our Diocese, as we will soon return fully to our customary practices.


### VOCATIONS NEWS

## LIFELONG CONVERSION

TRADITIONALLY THE FIRST PENTECOST was in the year 33 Anno Domini (initials A.D. meaning “Year of our Lord”) and that’s why we use it as our video studio name. For Christians it is a memorial of the day the Holy Spirit descended on the apostles and the Virgin Mary in the form of fiery tongues, an event that took place 50 days after the resurrection of Jesus (the word Pentecost literally means



Fiftieth”). Pentecost marks the incarnation of the Holy Spirit into the world of men and women; it also commemorates the official inauguration of the Christian Church by the apostolic preaching of St. Peter, resulting in the conversion of 3,000 to the Christian faith. **Pentecost is thus the official birthday of the Catholic Church.** On the day of Pentecost, Jesus fulfilled his promise to send the Advocate or Paraclete. The gift of the Spirit would also enable them to fulfill Jesus’ commission to preach the gospel to all nations. Today’s gospel passage also tells us how Jesus gave to the Apostles the power and authority to forgive sins: “Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.” These wonderful words which bind together inseparably the presence of the Holy Spirit and the gift of forgiveness are referred to directly in the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation. But they have a much wider meaning. Those words indicate the power we are all given of being the agents of forgiveness in the world of today: “...as we forgive those who trespass against us.” So raise a toast today and sing Happy Birthday!


## EUCCHARISTIC OUTREACH

### FEATURED PARISH MINISTRY

This week’s featured Cathedral parish ministry is the **Eucharistic Outreach**. The Catholic Church describes the Eucharist, i.e., the Sacrifice of the Mass, as “the source and summit of the Christian life” (CCC 1324) It’s the source, because the Eucharist enables us to make present and offer anew Jesus Christ’s one redemptive Sacrifice of Calvary, which began with his Passion (CCC 1362-68; 1341). It’s the summit, because the Eucharist is truly a foretaste of heaven, in which we partake of Jesus’ body and blood as heaven and earth become most profoundly one. Sometimes, however, folks can’t make it to mass because of physical ailments. That’s where this ministry plays a crucial role. So please join in a prayer for these volunteers who enable those who are not able to come in person to still participate in the gift of grace of the Eucharist: Domine Iesu Christe. O Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the living God, who according to the will of the Father, with the cooperation of the Holy Spirit, hast by Thy death given life unto the world, deliver me by Thy most sacred Body, which, I, unworthy, have presumed to receive, from all my iniquities and from every evil, and make me ever to hold fast to Thy commandments and suffer me never to be separated from Thee. Amen.

### A Pastoral response to pornography: USCCB

"Given how widespread and easily accessible pornography is in today's society, everyone is vulnerable. Some people have only seen pornography a handful of times, perhaps unintentionally; some view it occasionally; while others find themselves compulsively viewing pornography, perhaps despite their best intentions to resist. While more men than women use pornography, the number of women users is growing. Pornography use is especially high among young adults, and it has been reported that the average age of first exposure to pornography is as early as **eight**, with boys being more likely than girls to be exposed at an earlier age and to view more extreme content before the age of eighteen.

The Church as a field hospital is called to **proclaim the truth** of the human person in love, to protect people—especially children—from pornography, and to provide the Lord's mercy and healing for those wounded by pornography. Many means of support are available for those who have been harmed by pornography **and who desire to be free from it and its effects.**"


