



FIRST READING

EX 24:3-8

When Moses came to the people and related all the words and ordinances of the LORD, they all answered with one voice, "We will do everything that the LORD has told us." Moses then wrote down all the words of the LORD and, rising early the next day, he erected at the foot of the mountain an altar and twelve pillars for the twelve tribes of Israel. Then, having sent certain young men of the Israelites to offer holocausts and sacrifice young bulls as peace offerings to the LORD, Moses took half of the blood and put it in large bowls; the other half he splashed on the altar. Taking the book of the covenant, he read it aloud to the people, who answered, "All that the LORD has said, we will

unblemished to God, cleanse our consciences from dead works to worship the living God.

For this reason he is mediator of a new covenant: since a death has taken place for deliverance from transgressions under the first covenant, those who are called may receive the promised eternal inheritance.

For if the blood of goats and bulls and the sprinkling of a heifer's ashes can sanctify those who are defiled so that their flesh is cleansed, how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself

still unbroken does remain.


The shorter form of the sequence begins here.

GOSPEL

MK 14:12-16, 22-26

On the first day of the Feast of Unleavened Bread, when they sacrificed the Passover lamb, Jesus' disciples said to him, "Where do you want us to go and prepare for you to eat the Passover?" He sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the city and a man will meet you, carrying a jar of water. Follow him. Wherever he enters, say to the master of the house, 'The Teacher says, "Where is my guest room where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?"' Then he will show you a large upper room furnished and ready. Make the preparations for us there." The disciples then went off, entered the city, and found it just as he had told them; and they prepared the Passover. While they were eating, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, gave it to them, and said, "Take it; this is my body." Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many. Amen, I say to you, I shall not drink again the fruit of the vine until the day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God." Then, after singing a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives.


EXPOSITION OF SACRED RELICS

Treasures of the Church

The Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist welcomes you to a teaching and exposition of Sacred Relics. Over 150 relics will be shown, some as old as 2,000 years.

Among the treasures will be relics of St. John the Evangelist, St. John the Baptist, St. Joseph, St. Maria Goretti, St. Thérèse of Lisieux (the "Little Flower"), St. Francis of Assisi, St. Anthony of Padua, St. Thomas Aquinas, and St. Faustina Kowalska.

There will also be a fragment of the Veil that belonged to Our Lady and some of the largest remaining pieces of the Wood of the True Cross in the world.





SYMBOL OR SUBSTANCE?


Symbol or Substance? Was Christ speaking metaphorically or literally when he proclaimed “this is my body, this is my blood?” One’s answer to this question represents a significant divide among Christians. The Catholic Church has consistently maintained that the consecrated host and wine are really Christ. This is commemorated this Sunday with the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (in Latin Corpus Christi).




Eucharistic Procession and Adoration at the Grove Plaza: Corpus Christi 2019

Distinct from other religious rituals of penance or imploring, from its inception in the 13th century the festival of Corpus Christi emphasized adoration and exaltation. Pope Urban IV established the feast as a Solemnity in 1264 and extended it to the whole Roman Catholic Church. Each community responded in unique fashion, adopting its own local customs and traditions. During the Reformation, however, the celebration of the feast was suppressed by most Protestant churches because many denied the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist; for them it was more symbol than substance. The Council of Trent that concluded in 1563 that aimed to respond to Protestant challenges, declared that "at the heart of the Eucharistic celebration are the bread and wine that, by the words of Christ and the invocation of the Holy Spirit, become Christ's Body and Blood."

Catholicism since the beginning holds that the Eucharist is more substance than symbol. While it is true Christ often spoke in symbolic terms (e.g., the parables He preached), it’s important to note that in this instance, when Christ was afforded an opportunity to clarify His statement to his followers if He was speaking metaphorically, He did not. Teaching in the synagogue in Capernaum, Christ proclaimed “this bread is my flesh, which I will give for the life of the world.” Then it follows in Scripture that “the Jews began to argue sharply among themselves, “How can this man give us his flesh to eat?” [John 6: 51-52] We are told that “from this time many of his disciples turned back and no longer followed him.” Jesus noted this and asked his twelve disciples if they too wanted to leave; i.e., this was the moment that he could have just stated that He was just speaking symbolically. “Simon Peter answered him, ‘Lord to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life.’ [John 6: 67-68] Christ said this is my body, this is my blood and He meant it. Just because humans might not be able to comprehend this, it does not disqualify what God can do. On this feast of Corpus Christi may you come to know the special blessing we have been given to partake in the Eucharist, “the source and summit of the Christian life.”


