



## FIRST READING

Is 40:1-5, 9-11. Comfort, give comfort to my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and proclaim to her that her service is at an end, her guilt is expiated; indeed, she has received from the hand of the LORD double for all her sins. A voice cries out: In the desert prepare the way of the LORD! Make straight in the wasteland a highway for our God! Every valley shall be filled in, every mountain and hill shall be made low; the rugged land shall be made a plain, the rough country, a broad valley. Then the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together; for the mouth of the LORD has spoken. 
If you take away their breath, they perish and return to the dust. When you send forth your spirit, they are created, and you renew the face of the earth.



"According to a 2019 Pew Research Center survey, only 31% Catholics actually believe in transubstantiation and the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist." In other compelling words, 7 of 10 Catholics either do not believe in or question the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. Jesus' words were most prophetic: "Unless you people see signs and wonders, you will not believe." (John 4:48)

Many Catholics believe this adverse trend is not so much a failure of faith as it is a failure of catechesis to teach and explain the doctrine of the Real Presence. In response to the United States Bishops' call to engage in a three-year process of Eucharist renewal, largely in answer to the growing awareness that many Catholics are not well catechized in the meaning of the Eucharist and proper disposition for receiving the Eucharist, Risen Christ will be offering Bishop Robert Barron's Word On Fire "Eucharist" program.

Program sessions will begin Monday, January 24, 7-9 pm. Program text cost: \$20.

For the next few weeks we'll be profiling some of the institutions or congregations of the Catholic Church. A Franciscan is any member of a Roman Catholic religious order founded in the early 13th century by St. Francis of Assisi. They are one of the four great mendicant (requesting alms or charity) orders of the church (Franciscans, Dominicans, Augustinian & the Carmelites) and its members strive to cultivate the ideals of poverty, chastity, and obedience. These formidable-sounding promises are actually meant to be liberating, not restrictive-- although they certainly involve living within certain boundaries!


## LIFELONG FAITH FORMATION

METANOIA is the Greek word meaning a journey of changing one's mind, heart and soul. This is not secured in an instant, but represents a lifelong quest to remain engaged with matters of the spirit. This entails various dimensions that we've listed as the seven stations of LIFELONG FAITH FORMATION, based on a pastoral plan as developed by the US Catholic Bishops. This week we begin the new station of Community. The pastoral plan defined this as:

- Pursue personal and spiritual growth in human and Christian maturity.
- Cultivate the human values and Christian virtues that foster growth in interpersonal relationships and in civic responsibility.
- Nurture marriage and family life to build up the Church of the home.
- Share actively in the life and work of the parish, and foster the potential of small communities to deepen the faith and relationships of members, to strengthen the bonds of communion with the parish, and to serve the Church's mission in society.
- Learn the Church's teaching on the nature and mission of the Church, including an understanding of the Church's authority and structures and of the rights and responsibilities of the Christian faithful.
