





To one is given through the Spirit the expression of wisdom; to another, the expression of knowledge according to the same Spirit; to another, faith by the same Spirit; to another, gifts of healing by the one Spirit; to another, mighty deeds; to another, prophecy; to another, discernment of spirits; to another, varieties of tongues; to another, interpretation of tongues. But one and the same Spirit produces all of these, distributing them individually to each person as he wishes.



GOSPEL

Jn 2:1-11. There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you." Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from — although the servers who had drawn the water knew — the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him.






Rose Procession


Preparation

Catholic Religious Orders Feature. This week we feature the Dominican order of the Catholic Church. Known also as the "order of preachers" is was founded by the Spanish priest St. Dominic and approved in 1216A.D. One of best known quotes was "a man who governs his passions is master of his world." Founded to preach the Gospel and oppose heresy, the order is famed for its intellectual tradition. They too are one of four great mendicant (requesting alms or charity) orders of the church (Franciscans, Dominicans, Augustinian & the Carmelites). Their distinctive habit is white with a black cloak. There has never been a strong presence here locally—but maybe soon?

LIFELONG FAITH FORMATION

METANOIA is the Greek word meaning a journey of changing one's mind, heart and soul. This is not secured in an instant, but represents a lifelong quest to remain engaged with matters of the spirit. This entails various dimensions that we've listed as the seven stations of LIFELONG FAITH FORMATION, based on a pastoral plan as developed by the US Catholic Bishops. We are presently in the station of Community.

Q: The communities that we find ourselves in—what can they tell us about ourselves?

A: Lots, including how committed we might be to sustain our lifelong conversion journey.

"Show me your friends and I'll show you your future" is cited in print from at least 1828 and is said to be a Spanish proverb. There is a lot of wisdom in this statement. We generally don't get to choose our family; instead the choice there is usually deciding how much—or how little—we want to get along with family. In contrast, we do choose our friends, and they become our metaphorical mirror for life. If you want to literally see what you look like physically, you look in the mirror. If you want to see what you think like, then the metaphorical mirror for this is your writing; i.e., we write ourselves to clarity. But to see our character who we are at our core—the mirror for this is who we have chosen as our friends.

What attributes do you look for in a friend; i.e., do you include if this person can be of help to you (and you to them) in a shared spiritual journey to Christ? We are all in need of a "Faith Buddy." If you don't have a faith buddy in your life, consider where you might be able to find one including the numerous ministries listed in the middle pages of this bulletin—there too you can find faith buddies.

Feb 5: The Messy Family Project. Parenting Talks at Boise Centre - East.





This can be when the church is open and entering into prayer in front of the *tabernacle* ("Dwelling"), or else during special times of exposition when the Blessed Sacrament is placed in a *monstrance* ("To Show").







EUCHARIST

"According to a 2019 Pew Research Center survey, only 31% Catholics actually believe in transubstantiation and the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist." In other compelling words, 7 of 10 Catholics either do not believe in or question the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. Jesus' words were most prophetic: "Unless you people see signs and wonders, you will not believe." (John 4:48).

Many Catholics believe this adverse trend is not so much a failure of faith as it is a failure of catechesis to teach and explain the doctrine of the Real Presence. In response to the United States Bishops' call to engage in a three-year process of Eucharist renewal, largely in answer to the growing awareness that many Catholics are not well catechized in the meaning of the Eucharist and proper disposition for receiving the Eucharist, Risen Christ will be offering Bishop Robert Barron's Word On Fire 'Eucharist' program.
