

FIRST READING

Neh 8:2-4a, 5-6, 8-10. Ezra the priest brought the law before the assembly, which consisted of men, women, and those children old enough to understand. Standing at one end of the open place that was before the Water Gate, he read out of the book from daybreak till midday, in the presence of the men, the women, and those children old enough to understand; and all the people listened attentively to the book of the law. Ezra the scribe stood on a wooden platform that had been made for the occasion. He opened the scroll so that all the people might see it — for he was standing higher up than any of the people —; and, as he opened it, all the people rose. Ezra blessed the LORD, the great God, and all the people, their hands raised high, answered, "Amen, amen!" Then they bowed down and prostrated themselves before the LORD, their faces to the ground. Ezra read plainly from the book of the law of God, interpreting it so that all could understand what was read. Then Nehemiah, that is, His Excellency, and Ezra the priest-scribe and the Levites who were instructing the people said to all the people: "Today is holy to the LORD your God. Do not be sad, and do not weep"— for all the people were weeping as they heard the words of the law. He said further: "Go, eat rich foods and drink sweet drinks, and allot portions to those who had nothing prepared; for today is holy to our LORD. Do not be saddened this day, for rejoicing in the LORD must be your strength!"

SECOND READING


1 Cor 12:12-30 Brothers and sisters: As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ. For



in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit. Now the body is not a single part, but many. If a foot should say, "Because I am not a hand I do not belong to the body, "it does not for this reason belong any less to the body. Or if an ear should say, "Because I am not an eye I do not belong to the body, "it does not for this reason belong any less to the body. If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? But as it is, God placed the parts, each one of them, in the body as he intended. If they were all one part, where would the body be? But as it is, there are many parts, yet one body. The eye cannot say to the hand, "I do not need you, "nor again the head to the feet, "I do not need you." Indeed, the parts of the body that seem to be weaker are all the more necessary. and those parts of the body that we consider less honorable we surround with greater honor, and our less presentable parts are treated with greater propriety, whereas our more presentable parts do not need this. But God has so constructed the body as to give greater honor to a part that is without it, so that there may be no division in the body, but that the parts may have the same concern for one another. If one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it; if one part is honored, all the parts share its joy. Now you are Christ's body, and individually parts of it. Some people God has designated in the church to be, first, apostles; second, prophets; third, teachers; then, mighty deeds; then gifts of healing, assistance, administration, and varieties of tongues. Are all apostles? Are all prophets? Are all teachers? Do all work mighty deeds? Do all have gifts of healing? Do all speak in tongues? Do all interpret?


GOSPEL

Lk 1:1-4; 4:14-21. Since many have undertaken to compile a narrative of the events that have been fulfilled among us, just as those who were eyewitnesses from the beginning and ministers of the word have handed them down to us, I too have decided, after investigating everything accurately anew, to write it down in an orderly sequence for you, most excellent Theophilus, so that you may realize the certainty of the teachings you have received. Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news of him spread throughout the whole region. He taught in their synagogues and was praised by all. He came to Nazareth, where he had grown up, and went according to his custom into the synagogue on the sabbath day. He stood up to read and was handed a scroll of the prophet Isaiah. He unrolled the scroll and found the passage where it was written: the Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord. Rolling up the scroll, he handed it back to the attendant and sat down, and the eyes of all in the synagogue looked intently at him. He said to them, "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."






Our Catholic High School.



Catholic Religious Orders Feature: Order of Malta

This week we feature the Sponsor: The Order of Malta is one of the world's oldest Christian institutions. In the 11th century Blessed Fra' Gerard saw poor and sick pilgrims of all faiths lying in the streets of Jerusalem. To relieve their misery, he founded a religious order of Catholic men and women to serve the needy. This religious order was recognized by Pope Paschall II in 1113, placing it under the protection of the Church and granting it the right to freely elect is superiors. There are actually four distinct orders under this umbrella, all sharing the same mission: giving assistance to the sick and poor. Soon the Order also assumed the mantle of "Defender of the Faith" and adopted the eight-pointed cross, still today its symbol. Their ministry now reaches 100 countries.

LIFELONG FAITH FORMATION

METANOIA is the Greek word meaning a journey of changing one's mind, heart and soul. This is not secured in an instant, but represents a lifelong quest to remain engaged with matters of the spirit. This entails various dimensions that we've listed as the seven stations of LIFELONG FAITH FORMATION, based on a pastoral plan as developed by the US Catholic Bishops. We are presently in the station of Community.

As is often the case, we often don't appreciate something until it's gone. Such was the case with our sense of community which has taken quite a hit during this COVID pandemic. About two years ago when most everything was shut down, many just isolated at home.

The virtual meetings helped, but there's really no substitute to being together in person. It isn't getting any easier with the recurring variants of COVID, but we can't lose heart. We are made to be with others.

A big part of our Catholic faith is based on a sense of community—not isolation. The sacraments, for example, are all communal in nature; i.e., none of the seven happens in isolation because it takes two or more gathered together. So we need to remain resolute and make an extra effort to sustain our sense of community with our friends and family generally, and with our faith community as well.







Consider (re)joining a parish ministry.

This can be when the church is open and entering into prayer in front of the tabernacle ("Dwelling"), or else during special times of exposition when the Blessed Sacrament is placed in a monstrance ("To Show").


Jesus knew that his Father was always near to him. God is always near to you and even more so here in the Blessed Sacrament. His loving heart is seeking you—calling out to you over the responsibilities, the noise and the distractions of daily life. Bishop Peter Christianson stated that "it's time that we come back to a deep encounter with our Lord. It's time we listen to what He speaks to our hearts. It is time we discern what is being asked of us. The time is now, and the time is right."

Come align yourself with Jesus and with each other. Come and pray. Come & listen.





"According to a 2019 Pew Research Center survey, only 31% Catholics actually believe in transubstantiation and the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist." In other compelling words, 7 of 10 Catholics either do not believe in or question the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. Jesus' words were most prophetic: "Unless you people see signs and wonders, you will not believe." (John 4:48)


