

THE LITURGY of the WORD

First Reading - Jonah 3:1-5, 10

The word of the LORD came to Jonah, saying: "Set out for the great city of Nineveh, and announce to it the message that I will tell you."

So Jonah made ready and went to Nineveh, according to the LORD'S bidding. Now Nineveh was an enormously large city; it took three days to go through it. Jonah began his journey through the city, and had gone but a single day's walk announcing, "Forty days more and Nineveh shall be destroyed," when the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast and all of them, great and small, put on sackcloth. 





SENIOR ADULTS CORNER



SERVING THOSE IN NEED IN THE MIDST OF A PANDEMIC

St. Vincent de Paul (SVDP) volunteers from St. Theresa are used to seeing people down on their luck and in dire need of financial help. But Covid-19 has brought on an escalation of need. The 24 members of the St. Theresa conference of St. Vincent de Paul want you to know how grateful they are for the generosity of the parishioners of St. Theresa year after year. More than \$200,000 donated last year helped 1,187 people with rent, utility bills and food expenses among other emergency needs. "We just want to say a big thank you," says Ned Ahearn, the new president this year, "Our parish is so generous, and we are so grateful."



The St. Theresa conference shares territory with St. Louis. Those eligible for help live within boundaries that stretch from just east of I-35 to the Arboretum area on the west, and north and south from Braker Lane to 2222. It's not a perfect square; Steiner Ranch is in there too. "Our territory includes a number of zip codes where Covid, deaths from Covid, and unemployment are the highest," says Ned. "Many of our neighbors were already living day to day. Now, with unemployment, reduced hours of employment and sickness, people who in the past needed help with one month's rent, now need two months or more. Food is a constant need."



The SVDP volunteers at St. Theresa would normally go out in teams of two, making in-home visits to learn about a neighbor's needs in person. Depending on the religious affiliation of the neighbor, they may also read scripture and pray with them. Since the pandemic began, the assessments are done by phone. While help can be administered via grocery gift cards, financial assistance with bills or rent, securing a much-needed piece of furniture and contacting utility companies to work out a solution for a delinquent bill, the real help is connecting with our neighbors- respecting them, listening to them, praying with them and assisting them in finding a new direction if needed.

Volunteers meet every Wednesday night to discuss their cases from the week, share ideas for helping a neighbor and support each other as may be needed. Each Zoom meeting starts and ends with a prayer led by Spiritual Advisor Tony Cristofich. He reminds them that "we see Jesus in every neighbor we meet."

On behalf of all the St. Vincent de Paul team, thank you for your continuing generosity.

Because you donated, our team was able to help 1,187 people in 2020.

In 2020, we saw the level of need significantly increase as the months passed. People needed more help—more month's of rent, more help with utilities, more food, more diapers and sometimes a job. While we routinely involve other state agencies and non-profits in our assistance recommendations, the amount we contribute per neighbor increased as the year progressed.

So, while we thank you for all you have done in 2020, we ask that as you pray about what needs to be done in 2021, as you continue to support St Vincent de Paul. God bless you all.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

It was a normal day by all accounts, but John just wasn't feeling himself. He was a little lightheaded and out of sorts. Later in the afternoon, he experienced a sharp pain in his chest and arm. Quick thinking and action brought John to the emergency department with a diagnosis of a significant heart attack. Surviving this ordeal, he found himself face to face with his cardiologist, having an honest conversation about things that needed to change. "I came close to death," John found himself thinking. Then came the remorse. He was a young man with a loving wife and children who were very close to facing life without him. John found himself with intense sorrow for living an unchecked and self-indulgent life that almost brought him to his demise. He wanted to change.

We all have our wake-up calls. We have experiences and encounters that force us to really think twice about choices we have made and directions we have taken. Often, we find ourselves looking at those we have hurt square in the eye and wallowing in our foolishness. We regrettably realize that we have allowed our needs to lure us



into making some cruel mistakes. We impulsively say things and flippantly do things that reveal our unredeemed and unhealed self. It is a self we stumble over and try to tame but can't quite seem to master and control. Help!

We spin our wheels, naively thinking that we will somehow, perhaps through persistence, get ourselves unstuck. But, we don't. We just get out of the car, feeling very helpless, and ignorantly look at the mess we got ourselves into. Did we ever think to ask someone for help? Or, taken the advice of One who is wiser and avoid this route altogether? "Come after me," are words that Jesus says to all of

us. In order to heed his invitation, we must leave our ego-self behind and follow.

When we really see and understand the freedom, peace, justice, and love he offers, we find ourselves with such sorrow in our hearts for how foolish and silly we have been. All the misguided choices and sinful actions come full view and we see how risky our random impassioned behaviors really have been. Repentance is beautiful. When done with a sincere and contrite heart, it directs us to the glory that can be ours, ignites us with the challenge of living a life in service of others and reminds us that all is well.
