The Holy Family

Saturday, we focused our attention on the baby Jesus. Today, the last Sunday of 2021, we focus on His Holy Family, Joseph and Mary.

The first family of Genesis, of Adam and Eve, were given everything but lost it all by disobeying God's command. They were driven out of Eden, yet loved by the One who made them in His own image. At that very moment, God promised them a Holy One who would be born into a family. That first family knew struggle and ultimately tragedy, as Cain, in a jealous rage murdered his brother Abel.

Through Holy Redeemer Church we welcome Jesus in the sacraments and see Him in one another. This year we rejoice with the 49 families who received the Sacrament of Baptism. Waiting on God's Answer

It's always easier to see the big picture when we look backward. With the gift of hindsight, we can often see the reasons why we went through certain trials in our lives and the graces that we obtained through them. It's tempting to think that the Blessed Virgin was somehow different from the rest of us - that she always knew the whole plan of her life from beginning to end and never had to work her way through difficult periods.

Today's Gospel reading tells us that wasn't the case. When Jesus was lost in the Temple, Mary and Joseph didn't know where he was. They didn't know what was going on, or how it would all be resolved. It's safe to assume they prayed, but they weren't given an instant vision like some heavenly GPS sign that told them where to find Jesus. Instead, for three long days they searched, growing anxious and fearful as the days passed.

Just like us, Mary had to rely on hope during those dark times because she didn't have all the answers. When we go through trials, and we will all go through trials, we can draw encouragement from the example of Mary and Joseph. We pray and we persist in prayer, trusting that God always hears us and will respond in his time, not ours, and always believing that when we seek Jesus, we will find him in his Father's house.


