#### Dear People of God,

It is so awesome that you are as excited as I am to be gearing up for the Bazaar this year!!! For this Bazaar to be successful we will need all hands on deck and will need

everyone to share their time and talent. Please sign up at the back of the Church to help with the many booths and activities the day of the Bazaar. The most powerful way to let folks know about the Bazaar is to invite them, share posts on social media from our Facebook page, and join in to make this day a time of fun and success for our Parish. Big thanks to all who have already sacrificed months of time, talent, and treasure for this day to be a big one for our Parish!!! There continues to be many questions surrounding our New Parochial Vicar Fr. Vipin George. In my simple terms, Fr. Vipin was sent here to help me to love the people of God in Rosenberg and Beasley. I looked up for you an official definition of what a Parochial Vicar is in more formal language to hopefully answer your questions better,

"This is a priest (Fr. Vipin) who is assigned by the competent authority (Our Cardinal Dinardo) to assist the pastor (Fr. Orrin) in the pastoral ministry of a parish. Together as co-workers, the pastor and parochial vicar(s) carry out the functions of teaching, sanctifying and leading the people entrusted to their care (Author Unknown)."

We thank the Cardinal for giving us the gift of another priest to serve the faithful here in Rosenberg and Beasley. He is here permanently and will hopefully be here for many more years to come!!! Please give him your love and welcome in the upcoming days and weeks!!!

I am a Diocesan Priest meaning that I am obedient to the local bishop and usually will stay in the diocese unless a special assignment comes up. Usually, we are parish priest most of our priestly ministry. Fr Vipin, instead, belongs to an order and is obedient to his superior but has permission to serve here.

I asked Fr Vipin to share a description of his order:

" I belong to an order known as Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales (MSFS). We are also called Fransalians. It is an international order with priests working in more than 30 countries at present. It was founded by servant of God Fr. Peter Mary Mermier on October 24, 1838 under the patronage of St. Francis de Sales and Mother of Compassion at Annecy in France. The main charisms are Parish Mission, Foreign Mission and Education of the Youth. At present, the order has 11 provinces and 1 vice province with 1445 members working in different countries. There are 80 priests working in different dioceses of USA. Fransalians are known for their parish mission preaching, joyful optimism in all that they do, education of the youth and foreign missions."





### **EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP**

#### **Chancing the Narrow Gate**

From doctors to counselors, anthropologists to schoolteachers, it seems like everyone has their own parenting style to peddle, guaranteeing it will result in a happy and well-adjusted kid.

You've got "gentle parenting," predicated on respect for the child's feelings and needs. You've got "attachment parenting," based on the belief that kids need time to adjust to being outside of the womb. You've got "free-range parenting," where self-sufficiency reigns supreme.

But of all the parenting approaches I've come across, I've never encountered a philosophy that rejects discipline altogether. There are lots of conflicting opinions on how best to administer that discipline, but I've never heard any parent or parenting "expert" worth their salt say that a mother or father should completely ignore misbehavior that threatens the well-being of the child himself.

Discipline is in our human DNA. Consider for a moment what the world would look like if it came to be filled with people who had never been taught to reflect on their life challenges. People who bristled at the suggestion of personal growth.

And yet we become this way with God. Even the most "devout" among us shy away from occasions of divine constructive criticism. We avoid confession and forego daily examinations of conscience. We keep things superficial in our prayer life, avoiding depth of heart and real intimacy with God, afraid of what He will speak to us.

But when we do this, we rob ourselves of an opportunity to rely on God's fatherly strength, to rest in His mercy, to fill ourselves up with His goodness. We're putting up our hands, saying: "No thanks, Father, I'm good. You can keep your discipline. You can keep your grace."

When we do this, we are making a beeline for the "narrow gate," sure of our own strength and ability to pass through it. All I can say is this, proceed at your own peril. Are you so sure of yourself?

### **GOSPEL MEDITATION**—August 21, 2022

### 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time


The serious disciple knows the necessity and value of discipline. Thinking of discipline as something punitive in nature, we underscore its place in our spiritual lives. Discipline is really about a radical trust in God and his guidance. "When you are conducted by a guide who takes you through an unknown country at night across fields where there are no tracks, by his own skill, asking no advice from anyone, giving no inkling of his plans, what choice do you have but to give yourself completely to his guidance? If you are convinced that he is a good guide, you must have faith in him and abandon yourself to his care (Jean-Pierre de Caussade)."

If someone wants to be physically fit, they readily find a competent trainer who sets them on a rigorous schedule. Determined to reach their goals, they sacrifice personal pleasure and trust in his guidance. Why should it be any different with God? In order to remain true to the way Jesus places before us, we have to listen, learn, and be willing to change. Falling in love with God and maintaining that relationship requires an investment of time, energy, and hard work. Putting personal preferences aside in pursuit of the Gospel and giving proper attention to our spiritual lives is challenging work. At first, "all discipline seems a cause not for joy but for pain, yet later it brings the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who are trained by it (Hebrews)."

"What God does is essentially good. It does not need to be reformed or controlled...If you would live according to the Gospels, give yourself completely and simply to the action of God (Jean-Pierre de Caussade)." Submission to the holy will of God is not a submission to a set of pre-ordained set of circumstances. Rather, it is an abandonment and trust in God's creative, life-giving, and salvific power. God brings light out of darkness and life out of death. Nurturing this bond of trust and seeking God in all things creates an intimate and particular relationship and bond between our Creator and us. When He comes, there will be no issue with us recognizing Him or Him recognizing us. We will have met before. ©LPi
