Bread of Life

Dear Parishioners:

Yesterday on Saturday, July 31st, we celebrated the feast of our patron St. Ignatius Loyola, founder of the Jesuits. At a morning Mass, Fr. Sean Carroll, S.J. became the second provincial of the new West Coast Province (the combined former Oregon and California provinces). Fr. Scott Santarosa S.J. finished seven years as our spiritual leader, and was last seen in a cloud of dust driving south to begin his sabbatical. May the Lord bless both of these wonderful leaders.

As we approach once again the anniversary of Hiroshima and Nagasaki, it is good to remember the little Japanese girl named Sadaku. She was one of those little kids who was caught in the bombing of Hiroshima. She saw her mother and father and her family destroyed before her. She herself had severe radiation burns. She was in a hospital and basically, she was waiting to die. She knew she didn't have long.

But instead of bemoaning the tragedy, she said: "This can never happen again to people. People can't be this cruel to one another. So each day I'm going to make a white crane, and I'm going to send it to somebody and ask them to be a disciple for peace." Well, she did that every day for 683 days, and then she died.



Those who knew the little girl had their choice. They could be so outraged over the bombings that they'd be consumed by a desire to go out and bomb the rest of the world in revenge; or they could pick up on what she started – and they did. And so they made a 684th white crane, and 685th, and they go on without limit. Those white cranes still go throughout the world saying that life can be better.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE CONTINUED FROM PAGE ONE:

Perhaps our faith will never be as simple as it was when we were children. Yet adult skepticism seems to be like the people in today's Gospel, demanding proofs and miracles. The crowd had received free food, but had not understood the meaning of the sign.

The crowd represents those with superficial faith, those whom Jesus invites to go beyond external appearances to the deeper meaning of Eucharist. The crowd thinks that they can work for this bread, but Jesus says that the only work that God wants is faith in Jesus.

Jesus describes himself as food better than manna. He begins the sermon by giving a Eucharistic interpretation of the loaves from last week. Crowds have pursued Jesus, who had slipped back into Capernaum, but he questions them. He says that they only want more bread to eat without recognizing their deeper hunger. He points out that they missed the hidden meaning that the miracle of multiplying loaves signified. The hidden meaning is that Jesus is himself bread for eternal life.

Jesus then proclaims: "I am the bread of life." Eating of the bread from heaven means dining on Jesus – accepting the whole Christ – and this is what nourishes your faith. God sends bread from heaven. The Father sends Jesus. He is food and drink, sight and light, life and obedience. Jesus is not the minister of anything other than himself.

When Jesus announces "I am the bread of life," he employs the Old Testament formula for divine self-revelation: "I am" (Exodus 3:6) or "I am the Lord" (Isaiah 43:11). John presents Jesus as revealing God in our midst, as the one who gives bread (life) in its fullest sense.

Jesus recognized the hunger of those who followed him as hunger for a life rooted in eternity. This hunger endures in us. In our hunger for reconciliation, for respectful dialogue between those who disagree, let our communion with the Bread of Life nurture our hope for lasting peace. Like Sadaku, let us create each day a crane saying life can be better.

After months of discernment, and after wading through several applications for the Business Manager position, we're grateful to announce a new direction as St. Ignatius Parish heads into the fall. With thanks to our part-time bookkeeper, Phyllis Shelton, and to our Finance Council chair, Heidi Ruckwardt, we have been able to find our way through this pandemic year and craft balanced budgets for the year to come, which your Pastoral Council has approved.

As well, after much conversation and prayer, we've realized that an Operations Manager is in fact what we're needing; someone who will help coordinate, communicate, and oversee the fiscal development of the church and the school.
