Saint of the Week

Sir Thomas More was a humanist and statesman in Tudor England. He is still widely known today as the author of Utopia. More was a prolific writer and theologian. A true martyr of the Church, he was beatified by Pope Leo XIII in 1886, and canonized by Pope Pius XI on May 19, 1935. More was born in London in 1478, the son of Sir John More, a lawyer and judge. He attended Oxford where he studied Latin and Greek, as well as formal logic. He left Oxford in 1494 to train as a lawyer in London. After attaining the Bar, he spent time discerning a call to the priesthood. Though attracted to the Franciscan order More remained a lay Christian, continuing to fast, pray, and wear a hair shirt. He was married twice, the loving father of three daughters, a stepdaughter by his second marriage, and one son. More wrote many letters to his children when he was away on business and his daughters were known for their academic abilities, as they received the same education as his son, an anomaly at the time.

More rose to the Privy Council in 1514. He became the good friend and advisor to Henry VIII, and in 1521 he was knighted. In 1529 he was made Lord Chancellor of England. However, this appointment was the beginning of the end for the saint. He could not support the break with the Church in Rome when Henry failed to receive from the Pope the annulment of his first marriage to Katherine of Aragon to wed Anne Boleyn. More resigned as Lord Chancellor and continued to refuse to accept Henry as the head of the Church in England. Eventually he was imprisoned, tried, and sentenced to a traitor's death, to be hanged, drawn, and guartered. Henry commuted the sentence of his former friend to the more humane beheading. More was executed at Tower Hill, on July 6, 1535, before his death he famously proclaimed that he was "the king's good servant, but God's first."

RENOVATION UPDATES

What has already happened?

- The small organ at the front of the Church has been removed to create space for a statue of the Blessed Disciple. The organ has been safely stored as we await a buyer to give it a new home.
- A small construction trailer has been placed by the port cochere. This will serve as the office and headquarters for our contractor and foreman during the renovation process. A small construction dumpster delivery is pending.

What's happening next?

- Temporary walls will soon be built at the front of the Church to contain the demolition and construction of the new niches for the Blessed Mother and Beloved Disciple statues. This will require a temporary change to the flow of the Communion Procession at Mass.
- The large organ in the back of the Church will be covered to protect it during the demolition process. We will use only the piano for a few weeks during the demolition.

- Pronto se construirán paredes temporales en frente de la Iglesia para contener la demolición y la construcción de nuevos areas para las estatuas de la Santísima Madre y el Discípulo Amado. Esto requerirá un cambio temporal en el flujo de la Procesión de la Comunión en la Misa.
- El órgano grande en la parte posterior de la Iglesia se cubrirá para protegerlo durante el proceso de demolición. Usaremos solo el piano durante unas semanas durante la demolición.

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Thank you for supporting the fellowship and service opportunities of the Women's Club, as well as the social needs of the parish. The Women's Club encourages all women of the parish to participate in service to the St. Cecilia Community. The **areas of service** are as follows:

The <u>Altar Guilds</u> are a 12 month ministry to help with light house cleaning in the Sanctuary and Chapel. Each volunteer and her Guild partner work 1 to 2 hours, **once or twice** during the year. Keeping God's house clean usually takes place on Fridays.

The <u>Good Neighbor Committee</u> is a 12 month ministry for planning and hosting funeral receptions. Volunteers can provide food and/or help with set-up, serving or clean-up afterward. Consider becoming a one-month chair.

The <u>Hospitality Committee</u> provides for light refreshments at Club general membership meetings. They also provide table décor and direct the set up and clean-up for Club's special lunches. No washing dishes on this Committee!

The **Program Committee** works as an advisory committee to the 1st Vice President – Programs to bring entertaining and unusual programs and events for our membership meetings.

The <u>Social Committee</u> has a two-fold focus. It helps organize and carry out special parish receptions such as for recognizing departing or retiring parish staff. The committee staffs the Club's Oktoberfest booth, proceeds of which go directly into the Oktoberfest coffers to reduce parish debt.

The <u>Communications Committee's</u> telephone tree and e-blast are the lifelines used to contact members about our events and with special announcements. Telephone callers contact those who do not have/use email.

The <u>Ways and Means Committee</u> is responsible for all fund-raising for the Club's discretionary use. The proceeds fund our scholarship for St. Cecilia School and other parish gifts. A raffle is held during the May off-site luncheon. May raffle proceeds go directly to Angela House.
