Dear Parishioners:

---We begin this **Third Week of Ordinary Time**, in the first reading from the **book of Jonah 3: 1-5**, God called Jonah and sent him to Nineveh to announce repentance and faith in God or they would all be destroyed. Jonah did as God said and within a day, the whole city repented, "*believed God; they proclaimed a fast and all of them, great and small, put on sackcloth*".

When the disciples in today's **Gospel of Mark 1: 14-20**, leave their nets and present occupations in order to submit to God's Kingdom, they model what this *turning from* and *turning toward* means. How can we bring the Good News of God and of Jesus to our cities that are often so vast, so impersonal, so busy and filled with noise?

What does Jesus Christ demand of us today? *Repentance, conversion, a turning away from* our own ideas about how God's Kingdom should operate and a turning toward belief in **Christ's teaching** and example about God's Kingdom that is among us here and now. Our ultimate commission is to preach the word of God in season and out of season.

---**Last Friday, January 22nd** was the forty-eighth anniversary of the U. S. Supreme Court Decision Roe vs. Wade - a "**Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children**". The Bishops of our nation have asked all Catholics to fast and do extra penance as small reparation for the millions of abortions committed in our country, and for the legal approval of these actions.

In response to this effort, the **Knights of Columbus and Parishioners** from St. Gabriel and Prince of Peace Parishes was encouraged to attend the livestreamed "**Mass for Life**" on Friday, January 22nd at 8:00 AM with Archbishop Etienne and (*with many Catholics through our Archdiocese*) at St. James Cathedral in Seattle this year because we're still in Coronavirus protocol restriction. Please pray for conversions and a "**culture of life**" in our time.

---Please support the **Northwest Catholic Magazine** - *the official publication of the Archdiocese of Seattle*. Its mission is to proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ to Catholics in Western Washington, to teach, inspire and form disciples who know the Lord and live their faith to the full. *There will be a special collection at all Masses next weekend.*



Saint of the Week: St. Angela Merici, Virgin

The saint was born in 1474 in the diocese of Verona. Early in life she dedicated herself to Christ as His bride. After the death of her parents, she desired to live solely for God in quiet and solitude, but her uncle insisted that she manage his household. She renounced her patrimony in order to observe most perfectly the rule for Franciscan Tertiaries.

During a pilgrimage to the Holy Land in 1524, she lost her eyesight temporarily. Pope Clement VII, whom she visited in Rome, desired her to remain in the Holy City. Later she founded a society for girls, under the protection of St. Ursula; this was the beginning of the Ursuline Order. St. Angela was almost seventy when she died; her body remained incorrupt for thirty days. Remarkable phenomena occurred at her burial in the Church of St. Afra.

Live the Liturgy - Inspiration for the Week

"Repent, and believe in the gospel." Some type of honest and sincere repentance is necessary for any type of authentic growth and maturity. We have to come to the realization, unless we are happy wallowing in immaturity and superficiality, that the way we have been doing things is not the best or the healthiest. There isn't a human being alive who hasn't acted foolishly or erratically at the cost of almost losing a treasured relationship. "Why did I act that way?" is a question we often ponder after some reflection and enlightenment. Faith works the same way. Stumbling through life and bumping up against meaninglessness, a person can begin to see that something significant is missing. They see that there is merit to a relationship with God and an embrace of faith. Before these can take root, sincere sorrow for past wrong doing, missed opportunities, errors in judgment, and short sightedness is necessary. Repentance is necessary. Then having realized that we were walking in darkness, we can rejoice that by God's grace we now see the light.

Vivir La Liturgia - Inspiración de la Semana

"Arrepiéntanse y crean en el evangelio". Algún tipo de arrepentimiento honesto y sincero es necesario para cualquier tipo de crecimiento y madurez auténticos. Tenemos que llegar a la realización, a menos que seamos felices revolcándonos en la inmadurez y la superficialidad, que la forma en que hemos estado haciendo las cosas no es la mejor ni la más saludable. No hay un ser humano vivo que no haya actuado de manera tonta o errática a costa de casi perder una relación preciada. "¿Por qué actué de esa manera?" es una pregunta que solemos meditar después de un poco de reflexión e iluminación. La fe funciona de la misma manera.
