Dear Parishioners:

Archdiocese of Seattle. Its mission is to proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ to Catholics in Western Washington, to teach, inspire and form disciples who know the Lord and live their faith to the full.

There will be a special collection at all Masses this weekend. Thank you for your generous donation.

---At the beginning of Mark's story of the Son of God, we read from last week Gospel, the calling of the first disciples (1: 16-20) and this week Gospel, the confrontation with evil (1: 21-28). Jesus is *not* a solitary prophet but one who calls *companions "to be with him"*; he enters the lives of four people engaged in their ordinary occupations, simply says, "**Follow me**", and they immediately leave everything to follow him.

Today, the story of **Jesus in the Capernaum synagogue** inaugurates the first day of his ministry that consists of *exorcisms and healings*. The story reflects contemporary Jewish thought that the coming of God's kingdom would mark the defeat of evil (*demons and unclean spirits*). Jesus' word is **so powerful** that people abandon their occupations and follow him, and even demonic powers are powerless before it. Jesus summons people *to a change of heart, to take a new look at their lives and put their trust in the good news*. This is *not* simply a story from the past, but one that continues to speak powerfully and prophetically to people today.

On this **Fourth Sunday of Ordinary time**, both the first reading (*Deuteronomy 18: 15-20*) and the Gospel (*Mark 1: 21-28*) raise the issue of the authority of those who speak the Word of God. **Authentic prophets** taught with authority because God put his own words into their mouths.

In the first reading, Moses tells the people that God will send a prophet from the line of the Israelites. God commands everyone to listen to this prophet, *who we come to recognize as Jesus*.

Jesus astonishes the people in the Capernaum synagogue with his teaching and authority. He taught with authority because *he is the living Word of God*. We are all witnesses to this living Word who is Jesus. Each member of the Church, *by virtue of baptism and confirmation*, has a *prophetic role*, and echoes the Word of God, both by **words** and **examples**. *So, we must walk our talk!*

Live the Liturgy - Inspiration for the Week

Most of us are not trail blazers. Throughout history though, there have been many folks who tirelessly and persistently pursued the promptings of their hearts without giving any care to what others thought or trends dictated. Jesus is one of them. St. Teresa of Calcutta and St. Francis of Assisi are examples of others. The rest of us are people who take a more measured look at things, want to test the waters, and take our time choosing what path or person to follow. We need credible witnesses of faith. We need the Moses people in our lives to show us by word and deed who God is and what integrity and a purpose-driven life looks like. They are the pointers to truth, who even though they struggle themselves, seem to embody an unspoken timeless wisdom that just sounds and feels right. Jesus taught with this same type of authority and caught the attention of the greatest of skeptics. They were astonished. Even though we need our human prophets we can also be somewhat prophetic ourselves by putting integrity and conviction behind our embrace of the Gospel. Perhaps much to our surprise, we all have the power to be a credible witness. Are you willing to give it a try?

Saint of the Week: St. Blaise, Bishop and Martyr

Saint Blaise is the Patron of Throat Illnesses and much of this has to do with a legend that a boy was brought to Saint Blaise who had a fishbone caught in his throat. The boy was going to die, however Blaise was able to heal him. An invocation to St. Blaise and a blessing of the throat remains in practice today The blessing is done by using two candles, held open slightly and then pressed against the throat.

The history of Saint Blaise is not as well-known as some of the other saints. He is believed to have lived during the fourth century under the reign of Licinius. He was raised as a Christian in Armenia and became a bishop of Sebastea.

Once Blaise became a bishop, there was a new level of Christian persecutions beginning. He received a message from God to escape to the hills in order to avoid persecution. He came upon a cave that was surrounded by sick animals. He was able to cure them of their illness. The men who were hunting in this area recognized him as a bishop where he was brought before the governor and killed.

St. Blaise is also the patron saint of wild animals due to his care of them.

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
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
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
