### **GOSPEL MEDITATION**

### ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Human history reveals many periods where people lost a sense of God's transcendence. It may even be argued that human beings have been wandering and lost more than they have been at home and focused. Human nature being what it is, we struggle with who God really is - the God of our salvation history or the "gods" of human constructs. Relying on our own designs and pursuits, we forget that we really are meant to listen to One upon whom the Spirit of the Lord rests, Jesus Christ, and not to ourselves. That same history that reveals our fickleness and infidelity also reveals God's constancy and faithfulness. God always finds us.

As people wander and fumble to find their way, God is there bringing them back to holiness and giving them the assurance of His presence. We have to allow God's Word, God's life, to touch us and change us. It



can make us more flexible and attentive to the sacred in all facets of life so that every day is one that is holy. Every day is a time when fulfillment is possible for one's soul. Jesus stood before those gathered in the synagogue as the fulfillment of words of promise that were echoed long ago. God doesn't forget. He always comes for us.

Now it is time to remember to go to God. Sometimes our lives are so confused and tangled that it is difficult to see the Word and hand of God. But when we realize, deep within, the depth of friendship God offers to us it really has the power to turn sadness to joy. The promise is fulfilled. Going frequently to God's Word, allowing ourselves to be enriched and rejuvenated, and pondering the certainly of God's fidelity and promise permanently transforms us. We will be more aware of the sacred and the holy and less invested in things that pull us away.

### HUMAN TRAFFICKING & CONSUMERISM

"We must rapidly begin the shift from a 'thing-oriented' society to a 'person-oriented' society. When machines and computers, profit motives and property rights are considered more important than people, the giant triplets of racism, materialism, and militarism are incapable of being conquered." - Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

The words above were spoken by Dr. King fifty-five years ago this April, 4 2022. Instead of reversing the "thing-oriented" trend that Dr. King warns of, our increasingly globalized world has intensified and expanded it. The rate and ways in which we function as a "thing-oriented" society have increased without concern for the impact this has on fellow human beings around the world.

We live in a world of great wealth and great inequality, in which greater consumption demands lower cost. Our demand for more products and low prices comes at a high price - that of the slave labor of men, women, and children around the globe. As Americans, we must ask ourselves: "Do we really care under what conditions our products are made?"



Many do not see the connections between consumption and the issue of human trafficking. Globally, there are over 14.2 million people trapped in forced labor in industries including agriculture, construction, domestic work and manufacturing. The International Labor Organization estimates that over 75% of human trafficking is forced or state-imposed labor exploitation, while slightly less than 25% of human trafficking is forced prostitution. Yet forced labor represents only 10% of trafficking convictions.

### WHAT CAN RE DONE?

The Better World Shopper (betterworldshopper.org), a research organization that ranks corporations based on a corporation's social and environmental practices, publishes information on more than 1,000 corporations; Fred Meyers, Walmart, Chevron, GE, Citibank and Nestle, turn up on its worst offenders list. Systems of certification have been developed to allow consumers to immediately identify, through labeling, whether a product has been certified as living up to specific labor and supply chain standards, but such practices must become more widespread and universally mandated.

Since companies are highly sensitive to consumer demand, consumers have an important role to play by encouraging companies to take steps to prevent human trafficking in their supply chains. By using our purchasing power and company shareholder activism, we can greatly reduce forced labor exploitation. As King noted fifty years ago, a "true revolution of values" is needed. Let us commit ourselves again to this vision.

# **INFANT BAPTISM**

### **NEWBORN TO GRADE TWO**

Baptism is an amazing gift!
When we are bapized we become
Children of God and
members of the Church.

Preparing for the baptism of your child, whether the first or second or even fifth child can be an exciting and faith filled time for parents.

At St. Anthony our preparation process for children (infants to grade two) is fairly straightforward. Currently all the sessions and the interview take place on zoom.

To begin the process, just CONTACT <u>Kathy</u> <u>Reilly</u> for baptism at an English or Vietnamese service or <u>Deacon Marco</u> for baptism at a Spanish service.

Once you contact them, they will reach out to you to guide you through the process.





Kathy and Deacons Marco will work with you to set up your INTERVIEW. Ideally, both parents will be present at the interview. At the interview, we'll talk about the process in general, the necessary paperwork, godparents and try to answer any questions that you might have. They'll also go over how to schedule the baptism. Please email today.

You'll also register for the online classes. The classes will be on zoom and other parents may be joining in also.

GODPARENTS are encouraged to join the parents for all classes; however, they are expected to join the parents for one of the classes. We'll talk about this at the interview. If the godparents can't join on zoom for the classes, they will need to take the preparation program at their home parish.

The process is somewhat different for older children and adults. Contact Miriam Marston for more information about this.
