Truth is truth, found only in God

Many people give their allegiance to something until it asks them to do something challenging or radical. Then, they find themselves rethinking whether they want to be associated with it.

The same holds for God. Either we serve God, or we don't. There can be no lukewarm stance with regard to faith. If we are in, then faith in Jesus Christ asks us to do some difficult things: work in service of God's kingdom, love our enemies, offer no resistance to injury, and trust that the Eucharist is in fact Jesus' very Body and Blood.

For some, buying into these things may prove too difficult and a return to a life without them is preferred. But truth is truth and it can only be found in God. If we find it hard to accept it from the mouth of Christ, where else can we go to find it?

The task before us is to commit to the truth even when it may be easier to pursue something else. Truth is always worth obtaining even when it is difficult. Jesus offers us the truth of life, a life that is found in his own flesh and blood and a life of discipleship.

If any family chooses to do faith formation online, please enroll in the program. We will also continue middle school Edge ministry.

August 16th will be the last day for Registration. I humbly ask all parishioners for their prayerful support. Kindly keep Faith formation/Family Catechesis in your prayers.

Ephesians 4:11-12

Family Catechesis is a faith formation model that is family, community (Eucharist and Word of God) and Christ centered. It is families celebrating their lives and faith with gratitude.

- A facilitator/teacher is a person of prayer (personal prayer life, participates in worship and is comfortable praying with the family).

- Is one who believes in prayer as the most transformative ministry in building up relationships and fostering community.

- Is a person of relationship and is eager to learn the life and faith of the family.

- Is one who tries to identify with the family but at the same time is able to observe and take notes.

- Is respectful and attentive to the real situations for the family and be willing to walk with them.

- Is familiar and knowledgeable about the bible lessons, questions on faith and reflection points.

- Is one who is not inclined to teach but encouraging maximum sharing by the family.

- Is reliable, consistent and maintains very good communication with the family.

- Is desiring personal growth and ongoing formation.

- Is very prompt to answer question and will relay those questions unable to answer to the parish office immediately.

- Is creative.

- Is thankful.

- Is willing to spend at least one hour of their time/week.

- Is willing to join us for a monthly meetings.

In Memoriam: Patrick Pettinari

A loyal and loving family man, Patrick David Pettinari was unexpectedly called home to the Lord on August 2 at age 74. The devoted husband, loving father, father-in-law, grandfather, brother, uncle, and friend was a proud Reno native. Born on March 29, 1947, Pat spent his whole life in Reno-Sparks building a family, a business, and an amazing network of friends.

He attended St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic School and Bishop Manogue Catholic High School graduating in 1965. He married his high school sweetheart and best friend, Cathleen Lewis, on September 21, 1968, and they remained happily married for over 53 years until his death.

They built a tight-knit family of 5 children based on their Catholic faith: Dina Barry (Brett), David, Damon, Rich, and Chris (Julie). He was the proud grandfather of Abigail Barry and Josephine Pettinari, the apples of his eye.

"He was loyal and loving," said Cathy. "People wouldn't know that because he was so quiet. He was that way his whole life. We were high school sweethearts. We both went to St. Thomas and Bishop Manogue and I'd known him since 7th grade. He was just solid and honest and faithful and loyal."

Cathy said Pat was a self-made man. Working alongside his father-in-law, Dick Lewis, he became the President and owner of A. Carlisle & Co. He built a successful business that afforded his family a blessed life. He was deeply invested in the employees who worked for him. He was extremely generous with his successes. Through his guidance and the employees' hard work, the business was able to establish a Journalism Scholarship at UNR

for over 20 years. In appreciation of the blessings he had, he and Cathy found numerous ways to give back to the community.

He was a current member and past President of the Kiwanis Club of Reno Downtown for 50 years. He belonged to the Italian Benevolent Society. A man of unwavering faith, he


was an active parishioner at St. Albert the Great and Holy Cross Catholic Community. He held various Council and Committee positions at these churches and was a Board Member for Catholic Charities. He belonged to the Knights and Dames of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem, another symbol of his enduring devotion to his Catholic Faith.

Pat and Cathy were able to go traveling including a trip to Italy, a cruise from Montreal to Boston. "We did an Alaska trip with my parents, and just two years ago, we did an Alaska trip with all of our kids and grandkids."

As for hobbies, his main hobby was his family. He liked to be home with his family and he did enjoy other people. "Pat was witty, very witty and that is what we'll miss a lot about of him, very sharp, sharp mind. We're going to miss him."

He is preceded in death by his parents. He is survived by his wife Cathy, children, grandchildren, his brother Mike Pettinari, sister and brother-in-law Colleen and Al Zeme, numerous cousins, nieces, and nephews.

A breath of cool air



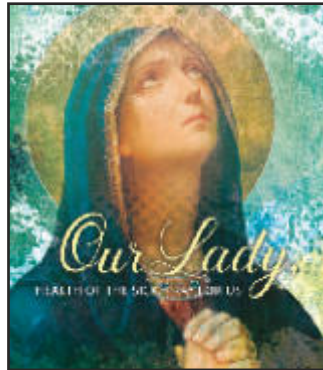

All must wear masks to indoor gatherings

With the return of a Mask Mandate for many Nevada counties, Bishop Randolph Calvo has directed all persons, vaccinated or unvaccinated, must wear masks at all indoor gatherings. This Nevada Emergency Directive that went into effect on Friday, July 30 due to a substantial transmission of Covid-19. Washoe County is one of the affected counties.

The directive requires all persons to wear masks at public indoor gatherings. The new Diocese of Reno protocol, therefore, is that all persons, whether vaccinated or unvaccinated, wear masks when participating at indoor Masses and other liturgies and all indoor gatherings.

Calvo wrote the key to stopping the spread of Covid-19 is within reach: vaccination. He asked that parishioners who are not vaccinated to do so. Concern for one another's health and safety comes from Christ's command to love one another.

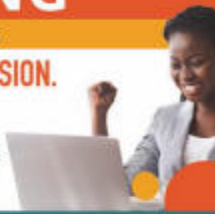
