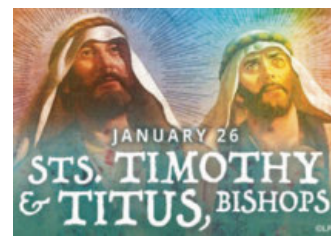

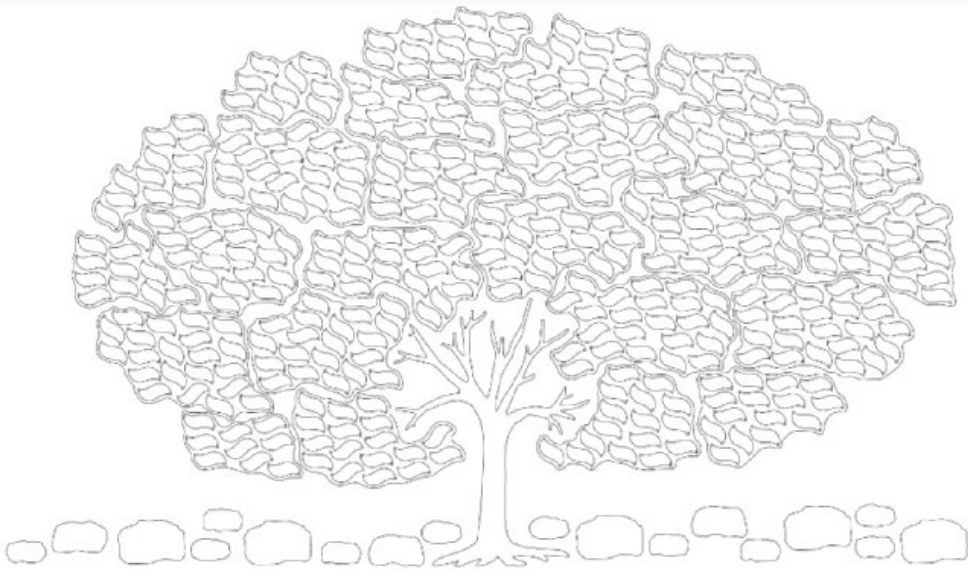

Liturgical Ministers Guidelines

Greeter:

- There will be two greeters or they can be a family.
- Please arrive 30 minutes before Mass.
- Please stand on either side and in front of the wooden Cross.
- Please do not engage in any lengthy conversations while greeting.
- Continue to stay in the Gathering Space and greet even after the opening bells are rang.
- Kindly close the front doors and the doors to the worship space as the 1st reading starts only.
- Return to your seats and join your family

Lectors: First Lector

- Arrive at least 20 minutes before Mass.
- Please sign in, greet the members of the team and find your seat in the worship space.
- First Lector, do not process in from the gathering space to the ambo.
- Please take a few minutes for centering before you get to the Ambo

Second Lector

- Arrive at least 20 minutes before Mass.
- Please sign in, meet the team and stay in the gathering space.
- Kindly fill in the welcoming binder & take it to the Ambo at least 5 minutes before the opening bell.
- Please return to the gathering space to join the entrance procession
- Lectors, please be seated in front of the Altar or at the Baptismal Font side
- Lectors, please do not adjust the Ambo microphone or "speak into" it.

Offertory Rites: Gift Presenters

- Arrive at least 15 minutes before Mass
- Gift Presenters are going to be a family
- Please be in the gathering space, as soon as the Prayers of the Faithful is concluded.
- Please wait for the Ushers to start taking up the collection & move away from Infront of the Altar to process in.

Ushers

- Gather at the center isle as soon as the "Prayers of the Faithful" is concluded.
- Start taking up the collection from in front of the Altar and move towards the classroom.
- Make sure to go to the classrooms, even if there is no one in the room.
- After the collection is taken ushers may proceed to the Altar, place the offertory basket in front of the Altar, bow to the Altar and return to your seats.

Eucharistic Ministers:

- Arrive 15 minutes before Mass.
- Only 3 Eucharistic Ministers at each Mass.
- Priests and Deacons will be distributing Communion.
- Eucharistic Ministers who serve on the west and east sides of the Altar, please stand closer to the podium so as not to interrupt the Communion line.
- After serving at your station, please do not go over to another station to help. Just return to the Altar.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

As a priest, I'm amazed how happily married couples remember the tiniest details of their earliest encounters. They effortlessly report things like: "he wore a blue shirt," "we ordered brussels sprouts," "her hair was up in a bun," and "he spilled shrimp cocktail sauce at my family's open front door when it was ten degrees below zero," (that one's courtesy of my mom). We delight in remembering and speaking of when our new life of love began. The little details are glorious reminders that it's all real.

It's similar for John the Apostle. He tells us of the two disciples who followed Jesus into his house, "...they stayed with him that day. It was about four o'clock in the afternoon." Why does that tiny detail matter? Because that's the time of day when they encountered the love of Jesus the Messiah in their lives. Our religion is not primarily about abstract truths about God, no matter how true or sublime. It is about God meeting and saving us in our human nature. It's about a human relationship.

What was the time of day when you first recall encountering Christ and his Church? Who was there? What did you feel? How did things look and smell? What happened? Take some time to recall it in detail. For me, it was inside an old, rickety church on a hillside in Jerome, Arizona. It was about 9 p. m. on a Saturday evening. I was with my friends Jenny, Brad, and Laura. We were praying, singing, and laughing. When was it for you? Remembering the details isn't empty nostalgia. It reminds us now that God's love for us in our humanity is real.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

We start telling lies around the age of three, the experts tell us. It's understandable. Lying is a god-like power. Whatever I want, I need only say it, and the world rearranges itself accordingly. It's amazing at first. But soon reality snaps back and I'm faced with a dilemma. If I remain committed to my lie I start to fracture into pieces. My words and reality drift apart, and I find myself lost in a lonely world of further falsehoods and fear of being found out.

How marvelous, then, that Jesus begins his ministry by proclaiming: "Repent!" We tend to think it means "stop doing bad things" but it doesn't. It literally means "go beyond the mind you have." Think in a new way. It's painful to admit, but some portion of my mind is addicted to lie-telling, usually to protect my ego or make life easier. To repent means to admit this tendency, to say, "I'm done lying," and to move beyond my split mind into a complete commitment to the truth. Perhaps that's why at Mass we together proclaim, "I have sinned in my thoughts, and in my words..."

Repentance and truth-telling work together.

Those who know the twelve-step process of addiction recovery know this process well. The fourth step requires radical truth-telling: listing our moral defects. This isn't being scrupulous. Rather it is freedom from falsehood, and entrance into the real world. This week, I invite you to join me in this practice. Get your phone or piece of paper. Answer the question: what are your true moral defects? Write them down. Remember, the Lord knows them already and loves you. We have a sacrament where this truth-telling is celebrated: Confession. Perhaps it is finally time to go beyond our childish lies.

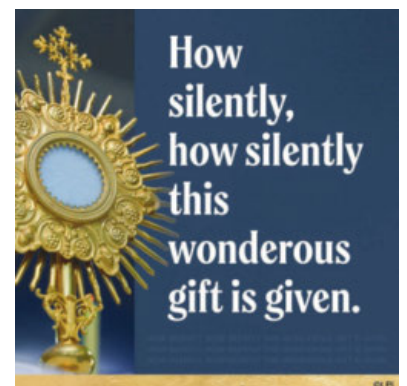

Eucharistic Prayer #6 – The Eucharist

"Truth Himself speaks truly or there's nothing true." - St. Thomas Aquinas

The real presence of Christ in the Eucharist is one of the most important dogmas of the Church. In the Eucharist we encounter Jesus, not just a symbol but the reality of His very person hidden under what looks like bread and wine. When we receive the Eucharist, we receive the body, blood, soul, and divinity of our savior. The Eucharist is the "source and summit of our Christian faith" (CCC 1324) because it is Jesus Himself from whom we receive our identity, and to whom we direct our lives. This is indeed a great mystery, one that transcends our understanding. And yet it is also the thing that makes us Catholic—the Church's entire identity, mission, outreach, and prayer comes from the Eucharist and leads us back to it.

Have you ever spent time with Jesus in adoration of the Blessed Sacrament?
