



We are fast approaching Holy Week, and already our sights are on the Easter Season. I pray that you have been blessed with the many graces offered by this sacred time of penitential preparation for the celebration of our Lord's Resurrection.

The Mysteries of Holy Week are celebrated every time we gather for the sacrifice of the Eucharist, and we offer ourselves to the Father with the Son through the Holy Spirit so that we can be transformed to become the Body of Christ we receive in Holy Communion.

Their encourage-ment and sage advice have been instrumental in the various Eucharistic Revival initiatives that have taken place, including the prayerful silence after Communion, the communal Act of Thanksgiving, The Meaning of the Mass small group study, and this Eucharistic Congress. Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord GOSPEL MEDITAION

A few months before they married, my twenty-three-year-old sister and her fiancé planned a cross-country road trip to visit his family. My parents told them that they could only go if they slept in separate hotel rooms, offering to foot the bill. It might sound prudish, but my parents wanted the young couple to understand that their approaching unity was close, but not yet. Patience solidifies love.

What could this possibly have to do with Palm Sunday? It's usually overlooked, but the Gospels tell us that, after entering Jerusalem, Jesus "looked around ... and since it was late, went out to Bethany with the twelve" (Mk 11:11) for the night. Who cares? Why include this detail? Jews in those days believed that the new Davidic King would one day re-enter and "marry" the city. A new future marked by fidelity would begin for God's people. Israel's God would be in union with His people forever. Without over-sexualizing the metaphor, perhaps Jesus refused to sleep in Jerusalem to remind us of his marital purpose. He was entering Jerusalem as the bridegroom-king. It was almost time, but not yet. Soon he will sleep in Jerusalem in the tomb and then something new will begin: his one body, his Church.

Lenten challenge: This Holy Week, I challenge you to keep this image in your mind all the way until Easter Sunday: Jesus is the faithful bridegroom who patiently prepares his bride for their new life together. Go to the Good Friday liturgy and kiss the cross. When you do, let that gesture be the long-awaited "I do" to our faithful God, who always waits for us.

Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord GOSPEL MEDITATION

Outside Chicago, there is a small cemetery in the woods behind Mundelein Seminary, where I was a student. One night I was exploring it. I looked up and was shocked to see an imposing seventeen-foot angel towering over me and preparing to blow a trumpet. Adrenaline rushed through me. I gasped and uttered, "Oh my God!" Quickly I realized it was in fact a massive bronze statue. I tried to calm myself down. But it still freaked me out.

As we begin to celebrate Easter today, this image might seem a bit unnerving. But please recall that for the first disciples on the morning of the resurrection, it was precisely that. It wasn't joyful at first, it was terrifying. It wasn't peaceful, it was unsettling. In that Jerusalem cemetery, something otherworldly had happened. Angels announced that he was no longer dead, but alive. They had blown their trumpets, so to speak, and Jesus had risen. Soon the disciples' shock in that dark cemetery would turn into joy.

We all have our own places of the dead, too, don't we? Deceased loved ones. Our tired patterns of blame. Relationships stuck in resentment. Indifference to the poor. Lost dreams. Despair about our future. Fear of sickness and death. These are our "cemeteries" where we don't expect much to happen. Today we enter — if we dare — those places with the disciples. See the mighty angel standing there, trumpet ready to blare!



Youth Corner

Hygiene Kit Drive: The Middle schoolers have been working hard these past 3 weeks with organizing, advertising and announcing our Hygiene Kit Drive, where we asked for donations to create Hygiene Kits in support of Eddy House, for homeless youth. We have had around 3-4 kids every Mass for the past 3 weeks helping to reach out our drive to the community, along with students Giada Nuti, Jaslin Macias, and Aly Diaz helping with announcements during certain Masses. The students along with parents, are planning on organizing, creating and dropping off the kits March 21st and 22nd. The endless effort that these middle schoolers have put in is an exceptional example of outreach during Lent.

Catholic Charities: The High school youth were called to service the community at the St. Vincent's Super Thrift Store March 17th. We had help from 12 youth from our confirmation and RCIC programs along with Diana Giron, Rosie Meza, Josie Deleon, & Dulce as teacher chaperones for the service event. 7 youth along with Diana were in charge with helping sort out donation bins into categories that are used to help shelf the thrift store easily. 4 youth along with Josie, Rosie, and myself were in charge of organizing clothing donations into bins that help aid the tagging of the clothing items. It was an experience that we will never forget and are extremely grateful to have had the opportunity to help. We are looking forward to more service events with Catholic Charities in our future.

The Live Stations of the Cross: The Holy Cross Youth have been working for 2 months to prepare for the Live Stations of the Cross play, a reenactment of Jesus' journey to death on the Cross, acted out by our youth. We have a total of 35 youth involved in our 2024 play, including our Narrator, Jesus, behind-the-scenes help, and more. The Live Stations has also proven itself to be a tradition beloved by youth over the years, including myself as a previous actor, and around 10 youth coming back from last year's performance. The power behind the youth in this play is touching, and they are working extra hard to make the experience a meaningful one for the community and themselves. The talent, the love, and the trust that the youth give out in their performances is breathtaking to say the least. They will be performing at 6:30pm on Good Friday at Holy Cross. 
