The Assumption

Ouestion:

What lessons should I learn from the Assumption of Mary?

Answer

Growing in holiness is similar to training in a sport. We need someone to show us how we can live our faith well. Mary is a model of sanctity. She shows us how to be faithful to God's will, living each day with confidence in God's mercy and love. At the Nativity, in Jesus' public ministry, and at the Crucifixion, we see her steadfast trust. She allows the Lord to use her life to accomplish his plan for her and for all of us. In the Preface of the Mass for the Assumption of Mary, we pray: "For today the Virgin Mother of God was assumed into heaven as the beginning and image of your Church's coming to perfection and a sign of sure hope and comfort to your pilgrim people."

It is this image of holiness that we strive to imitate. In the office, at home, or in our community, we look for signs of God's grace that call us to an ever greater love of him and each other. A greater awareness of God is a sign of our conversion of heart that lives the lessons Mary teaches.

"The Church on the Hill"

Holy Cross Catholic Community is the "common home" for nearly 1200 plus families who regularly gather together to worship and pray. This community has as its mission "to become disciples of Christ by the love we have for one another, as we journey together in prayer, friendship, and service"

This community was established on October 5, 1967 by Bishop Joseph Green. It was a large physical plant with a school, a convent, a rectory, and a multipurpose hall seating 500 people, but unfortunately with a huge debt. In 1970, it was decided to sell the property and move to a site in North-East Sparks. In 1976 ground was broken for a multipurpose facility that was dedicated in the same year by Bishop Norman McFarland. In the meantime, Church services were held at "Our Savior Lutheran Church". The community began to grow, so the present Holy Cross Catholic Community facility was built in 2000 and it was dedicated by Bishop Staling on December 29, 2001.

"The Church on the Hill" with its large beautiful windows overlooks Reno-Sparks landscape with a view of the majestic Sierras. The Prayer Garden dedicated to Our Lady of Guadalupe, the Memorial Benches and the Memorial Tree are just reminders that the community takes time to pause "to remember". We are, I feel, emerging as a great destination for people to come together, worship and pray and give thanks. I pray that we are a sanctuary of peace and hope. I am grateful.

"The Church on the Hill" is blessed to have a loyal and faithful multicultural community. Its "heart and soul" is its dedicated team of lay ministers. They are liturgical ministers, catechists, greeters, ushers, ministers of hospitality, youth ministers, "Heling Hearts" grief support group, ministers to the homebound, nursing homes and retirement community, five loaves, young adult Bible study group,...the list goes on. They keep the community thriving. Thank You.

Finally, to all those who worship and pray at Holy Cross Catholic Community, a Big Thank You. To everyone else, I extend a standing invitation to "come and see".




MEMORIAL TREE

August 11, 2024—19th Sunday in Ordinary Time GOSPEL MEDITATION

This week we hear Jesus say, "He that believes in me, has eternal life" (John 6:47). These straightforward words, uttered by human lips, sound — how to put this? — insane. Who could possibly say such a thing? Jesus says things that are so high, so demanding, so beyond our capacity to fathom, we hardly know what to do with them and (if you're like me), they usually go in one ear and out the other. So, let us ask: how can believing in him lead to eternal life?

To believe in something means not just to acknowledge its existence, but also to orient yourself entirely to it. If a football player believes in his team, it means he puts his life totally at the service of that goal. If a student believes in her dream to become a doctor, she gives everything she has to her studies and preparation for her MCAT test. Belief means to move boldly toward something we love, and trust is possible to attain.

What is the highest possible good at which we can aim? It is God himself, the gift of eternal life without end. Jesus has made this "good" possible in and through his human nature. To believe in him means to have him as our ultimate goal. This week let's believe the truth of these words and make practical decisions to orient ourselves toward what we see available in him: eternal life.

The Lord's Prayer #9: Deliver us from evil

"Watch and pray so that you will not fall into temptation. The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak." - Matthew 36:41 NIV

When we pray to be delivered from evil, we are praying to be delivered from the evil one, that is, satan. And yet we take courage, because Christ has defeated him, overcoming his whiles in the desert. So we turn to Christ—to Christ in the Scriptures to arm us against the evil one—to Christ in the confessional to free us from our sins—and most especially to Christ in the Eucharist that it might be Christ who lives in us.

Do you turn to Christ when you are tempted?

Do you have a favorite Scripture passage you turn to when things become difficult?



August 18, 2024—20th Sunday in Ordinary Time GOSPEL MEDITATION

A priest I know was asked by a door-to-door evangelist, "Do you believe in Jesus?" He answered, "Yes, I do. But if I may ask you," he continued, "Where do you experience Jesus' body and blood?" His interlocutor responded somewhat confusedly, "I don't. I just believe in him. That's all that is needed." Later my priest friend would relate to me, "The more I thought about it, that response struck me as totally inadequate. As human beings, we need to encounter Jesus' body and blood, not just hear about him and mentally believe. Otherwise, Jesus is just a ghost."

This week we see this central point as we arrive at the climactic moment of Jesus' teaching on the Eucharist. Jesus has established the importance of believing in him as the "bread of life come down from heaven." Belief deeply matters because it leads to a real, bodily encounter with Jesus through eating and drinking. That's why Jesus emphasizes to an almost outrageous degree the non-metaphorical necessity to "eat my flesh and drink my blood" (John 6:54). The real presence of Jesus' body and blood — he himself, truly, really, substantially — has been the Church's treasure since Holy Thursday. Internal belief in the heart and the ritual act of eating and drinking the Eucharist, the Church has stubbornly insisted on both, not just one or the other.

This is not meant to criticize non-Catholic Christians who deeply trust and love Jesus, nor is it a triumphal elitist claim about the Catholic Mass. Rather it is a humble, trusting acknowledgement that God in Jesus comes to us in a way most proper to human beings: in our hearts and our bodies, faith and the Eucharist.


