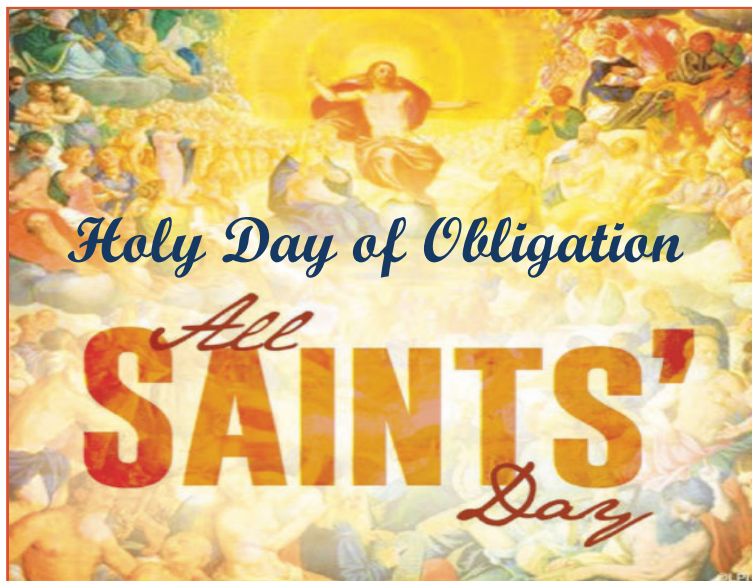

Halloween

Is Halloween a pagan holiday or a Catholic one?

The short answer: nowadays, a little bit of both. But it wasn't always that way. Halloween and All Saints' Day are closely connected. In the 800s, the Catholic Church began celebrating All Saints' Day. It was originally called All Hallows' Day or Hallowmas. The celebration began early on All Hallows' Eve. But if Halloween is really about the saints in all their victorious glory, where do we get haunted houses, costumes, and pranks?

All Saints' Day became associated with the other deceased rather quickly. November 2nd is All Souls Day, where we pray for the souls in purgatory. Throughout the European world, especially with the Celtic and Germanic peoples, the dead were honored in the autumn months. The Celtic pagan celebration of Samhain had its own folk rituals and occurred around the same time as these Catholic feast days.

Within the last few hundred years, this included dressing in disguise and going door to door, asking for food in exchange for a rhyme or poem. Some people masqueraded as "dark" spirits and pulled pranks on others. Today's celebration of Halloween tends to take on these later practices, rather than the original meaning of celebrating the saints. But remember ... this feast was Catholic first!

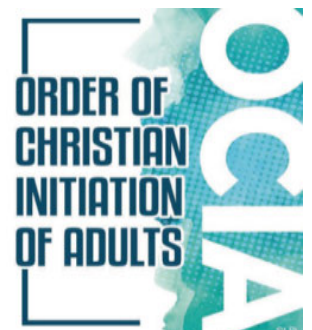
1. Daily Mass will be offered Monday thru Friday at 12:00 Noon. All are welcome!
2. Daily Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will be held from 11:00am to 12:00pm noon. There will be monthly Adoration on all 1st Fridays from 9:30am to 4:30pm. Please join us for 30 minutes to one hour. Pray for Respect Life, World Peace, Vocations, and Parish unity.
3. Visits to the Blessed Sacrament as individuals or families.
4. Organize study groups on ‘The Meaning of Mass’. Become a small group leader. Hold the study groups twice a year from October to December and from February to April. Complete the study in six to seven weekly sessions.
5. All current and future liturgical ministers make an effort to complete the ‘The Meaning of Mass’ study guide.
6. All parents in the family Catechesis program will have the first six sessions on ‘The Meaning of the Mass’

October 20, 2024—29th Sunday in Ordinary Time GOSPEL MEDITATION

From a young age, I loved winning at sports. I confess that winning was a bit of an addiction. It was probably coming from a deep desire for attention and affirmation from others. Nevertheless, it was a driving motivation for me. Baseball, soccer, track, table tennis, and whatever else I could find was a chance to win. Competition was my obsession.

Another John, and his brother James, demonstrate a kind of wildly competitive obsession when they dare to say to Jesus: “Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory” (Mark 10:37). Their audacity arouses an indignant reaction from the other apostles, who are clearly raw that these two are out to win the highest spots.

How does Jesus respond to us in our desires for greatness? The same way he does to James and John. He does not criticize them for their desire for glory. But he does highlight their ignorance (“you do not know what you are asking.”). Then he invites them to be champions of true greatness: by drinking not the cup of worldly victory, but his cup of self-giving suffering love, to be the “slave of all.” The true winners are slaves of love. This week, dare to tell Jesus what your ambitions truly are. Hear him call you to an even greater victory.

Communion Rites #6: Behold the Lamb of God

“The next day he [John the Baptist] saw Jesus coming toward him and said, “Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world.” John 1:29 NAB

Immediately before the distribution of Communion, the Priest will say two somewhat odd things—first:

He will re-echo the words of John the Baptist who was the first to recognize the presence of Jesus and bid others to turn to Him as well: “Behold the Lamb of God.” But then the Priest will say “Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.” Without knowing the context, this can seem incredibly weird—why are we having dinner with livestock?

This, however, is a reference to the book of Revelation 19:9, which speaks of the wedding celebration between Christ and the Church. It is in the Eucharist where even now we participate in that heavenly marriage between Jesus and the Church, between the soul and God.

October 27, 2024—30th Sunday in Ordinary Time GOSPEL MEDITATION

Near my house there is a school for the blind. Often, I see blind people learning how to navigate the world with only a walking stick, even on a busy street with roaring traffic. I’m amazed to see how adept and carefully they get around without sight. Nevertheless, often a sadness arises in me that he or she cannot see all the beautiful colors, images, and persons filling the world around them. Those days, I find myself deeply grateful for the basic privilege of sight.

That’s part of why the mystery of Jesus as the sight-giver is so moving to me. This week, it’s wonderful how Bartimaeus the blind man is no longer content with his limitation and bellows out his desire for Jesus’ mercy. In beautiful simplicity, he cries out to the Lord, “Master, let me receive my sight.” Jesus quietly heals his sight. And off he goes, fully taking in the world around him. Imagine the delightful new way in which he is able to respond to the world.

Like blind Bartimaeus and the courageous people in my neighborhood, we may be able to get around reasonably well in our daily lives. But we are blind to the gestures of heroic love of people close to us. We can’t see the desperate need of the hungry, thirsty, imprisoned, exploited, endangered, and so on, in our midst. We can’t see Jesus drawing near to us in so many ways, but he is. This Sunday let’s cry out to him: Lord have mercy on me! I want to see! And little by little — or perhaps in a flash — we’ll see once again, or perhaps for the first time.

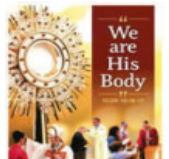
