



Posadas

We invite you to join us for the posadas from Saturday, December 14th to Sunday, December 22nd at 7:00pm each day. What are "Las Posadas"? Las Posadas are a

beautiful tradition that celebrates the 9 days before Christmas, reenacting the search of Mary and Joseph for shelter in Bethlehem, ending with a celebration at the end when they finally find their lodging and Jesus is born. Traditionally, two children dress as Mary and Joseph. Accompanied by people dressed as angels and shepherds along with the Wise Men. They sing Christmas songs and request lodging. Part of the group becomes the chorus that responds to the request for lodging. In the beginning the request is rebuffed. They move to several more homes where the ritual is repeated. Eventually, at the last home, their need is recognized, and they all enter the home where a

party ensues.

While this custom teaches children an important aspect of the Christmas story, it also emphasizes the need for hospitality to strangers and the continual need we all have to make room for Jesus in our "posada." As we struggle to arrive at a fair and just immigration policy, it would be good to recall the fact that Mary, Joseph, and Jesus were also immigrants looking for a hospitable place to dwell. ©LPi

Las posadas son una hermosa tradición que celebra los 9 días antes de Navidad, recreando la búsqueda de María y José por refugio en Belén, terminando con una celebración al final cuando finalmente encuentran su alojamiento y nace Jesús. Tradicionalmente, dos niños se visten como María y José. Acompañados de personas disfrazados de ángeles y pastores junto a los Reves Magos. Cantan canciones navideñas y solicitan alojamiento. Parte del se convierte en el coro que responde a la solicitud de alojamiento. Al principio, la solicitud es rechazada. Se trasladan a varias casas más donde se repite el ritual. Eventualmente, en el último hogar, se reconoce su necesidad, y todos entran en el hogar donde se produce una fiesta. Esto se repite en diferentes barrios y hogares cada uno de los nueve días.

Si bien esta costumbre enseña a los niños un aspecto importante de la historia de la Navidad, también enfatiza la necesidad de hospitalidad con los extraños y la necesidad continua que todos tenemos de hacer espacio para Jesús en nuestra posada. Mientras luchamos por llegar a una política de inmigración justa y equitativa, sería bueno recordar el hecho de que María, José y Jesús también eran inmigrantes que buscaban un lugar hospitalario para vivir. ©LPi

GRIEF AND ESTATE PLANNING

Most of the time, death is not a topic we are eager to discuss, but avoidance can make a difficult time more complicated for our loved ones. After listening to the stories of survivors in our Grief Support Group, it became apparent how a frank discussion about one's passing can help reduce confusion and doubt. This is especially true if death is sudden and unexpected. Planning ahead can make an emotional time a little easier to navigate.

Financial, legal and funeral arrangements are the broad issues that must be dealt with upon death.

These are important personal matters. Does your spouse or family know what to do? Who will have access to bank/ investment/credit accounts? Do you have a Will or Trust? How can we prepare?

Fortunately, there are resources available to assist in this matter. AARP and the ABA have a comprehensive book, <u>Checklist for My Family</u>, which outlines several topics for consideration in an easy fill in the blanks

format. Also, Amazon.com and the Washoe County Library have many books available under the topic, Estate Planning. This is a starting point for exploring the issues and information that should be considered.

After you have ideas and information organized, then you may want to consult with professionals as needed. Remember, it is not if we are going to die, but will our loved ones be prepared when we die.

On a bright Spring morning, a passerby once saw St. Francis of Assisi hoeing a row of beans and asked him, "What would you be doing right now if you knew this was the last day of your earthly life?" The Saint responded, "I'd keep hoeing this row of beans." Preparing for this world to end — whether by our death or by Jesus' glorious coming — invites us to live not in the past or the present, but deeply in the present moment.

This same point is on display in the simple advice given by the wild and eccentric John the Baptist. He speaks of the one who is to come who will baptize "with the Holy Spirit and fire" (Luke 3:16). Despite the bizarre awesomeness of this announcement, he tells his listeners to engage in the present moment with simple acts of justice and love as their preparation for Jesus' coming, sharing their clothes and food, eliminating greedy and underhanded practices, being content with their wages. It's so undramatic. But how many actually did it? We don't know. How many of us will commit ourselves to these types of humble and demanding practices in our lives? That's what we should be doing now in our present moment, not worrying about the future.

Advent challenge: Name one way you are doing the bare minimum towards others in your daily life. Or name something you are doing because you are not content with your financial situation. Pray: "Jesus, if it is your will, help me to stop doing these things this week. Help me prepare for your coming." Then make the appropriate changes. — Father John Muir ©LPi

Communion Rites #9: Purification Rite

"My God, I believe, I hope and I love You!" - Excerpt of one of the prayers taught to the children of Fatima

After everyone has received the Eucharist, the priest will purify the vessels to ensure that every particle of the Sacred Body and Blood of Jesus is treated with love and honor. This is not simply "doing the dishes," but a further expression of our love of Jesus. As we are told by St. Thomas Aquinas, every particle of the Eucharist contains the whole Christ (ST III Q73,A3), so that whether we receive a large

host or a small one, we receive the entirety of who Christ is. And so in the purification, we show our love and respect to our savior still present with us in the Sacrament.

December 22, 2024—4th Sunday of Advent GOSPEL MEDITATION

The Blessed Virgin teaches us the secret to being blessed, happy, and full of joy. When Elizabeth, her cousin, greets her, she calls Mary "blessed" for two reasons, her motherhood of Jesus, and Our Lady's belief that "there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her by the Lord" (Luke 1:45). Mary is "blessed" entirely because of her relationship to the Incarnation of God in Jesus, and for no other. This of course makes perfect sense, because as the Lord, as God-in-the-flesh, her son is the source of all blessedness, life, and joy. Mary is blessed because of her contact with Jesus, and by her faith in him.

So, it is with us, too. We become blessed by our "motherly" contact with Christ in our souls through baptism. He lives in us and grows to maturity within us. We bear him to the world. This requires unshakeable faith that his promises to us will be fulfilled, despite all the problems and difficulties that plague us. We become blessed, happy, and joyful in the measure that we are in contact with Jesus and trust in him.

Advent challenges: 1.) This week go to someone who has borne the love of Jesus to you and tell her or him how they have been a blessing to you. 2.) Name someone in your life now to whom God has sent you to bring Jesus' presence. Pray: "Lord, thank you for the blessing of sending me to bring your presence to this person. Help me bear you faithfully to him/her."
