

OCIA & OCI-C

As we journey further into the season of Lent, the OCIA/OCI-C elect that will be initiated into the Church on Easter Vigil will be partaking in the Penitential Rites also known as Scrutinies. The Scrutinies are three special rites that help prepare the Elect, those participating in OCIA/-C, to enter the Catholic Church. They take place during the period of formation known as Purification and Enlightenment, near the end of their formation.

The season of Lent involves a more intense period of examination and preparation for the Elect, and hopefully for those of us already living the Catholic faith. Though they are meant for the OCIA/-C Elect, the Scrutinies can help all Catholics seeking to live a life of continuous conversion. The purpose of the Scrutinies is "to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful" in the hearts of the Elect and to "strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good." (Quotes from Ritual Text for Order of Christian Initiation for Adults)

The Scrutinies are associated with three specific Gospel stories on the third, fourth, and fifth Sundays of Lent:
•Saturday March 22 at the 5:00pm Mass:

Jesus encountering the Samaritan woman at the well, where He offers Himself as the Living Water.

- •Sunday March 30 at the 12:15pm Mass:
 - Jesus healing the man born blind, where He gives Himself as Light of the World.
- •Saturday April 6 at the 10am Mass:

Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead, where He reveals Himself as the Resurrection and the Life.

Stations of the Cross

Ouestion: Who invented the Stations of the Cross?

Answer: The first Stations of the Cross were walked by Jesus himself on the way to Calvary. Known as the "Via Dolorosa" ("The Way of Suffering") or the "Via Crucis" ("The Way of the Cross"), it was marked out from the earliest times and was a traditional walk for pilgrims who came to Jerusalem. The early Christians in Jerusalem would walk the same pathway that Jesus walked, pausing for reflection and prayer. Later, when Christians could not travel to the Holy Land, artistic depictions of "The Way of the Cross" were set up in churches, or outside and Christians would walk from station to station, reading the Gospel account of the Passion, or simply praying and reflecting on each event. While the content or place of each station had changed, the intention was to make a mini-pilgrimage and follow--literally--in the footsteps of Jesus.

This devotion became better known in the Middle Ages, and the Franciscans are credited with its spread. Lent is a time when many people make the Stations and some churches present Passion plays or Living Stations. But anyone can pray the Stations at any time. It is a simple and personal reflection on the passion of Jesus and what it means to us.

Applications and instructions are available for each program in the parish office or on-line at "Ponderosa Council 4928." The submittal deadline is no later than April 14th at 3:00pm.


This Knights of Columbus program is distinct from the parish Fr. George Wolf Memorial Scholarship program.

March 9, 2025—1st Sunday of Lent GOSPEL MEDITATION

One of the most fascinating moments in American history is when George Washington could have become the king of the newly liberated United States and didn't. At the height of his power and fame, on Dec. 23, 1783, he resigned his commission as Commander-in-Chief, and went home. The astonished King of England remarked that in doing so, Washington was "the greatest man in the world." Greatness is often defined by what we could do but don't. Greatness is measured by the temptations we overcome.

Jesus' greatness is revealed in his victory over temptations, too. The three offered him by the devil contain, we might say, all potential possible temptations: food, power and fame. They correspond to the triple human needs of body, soul and spirit. In overcoming these three, he says "no" in essence to every and even the greatest temptation. We see that every desire of his humanity — body, soul and spirit — is perfectly united to God, to love. This is a power available to each member of his body. It is the path to true greatness. How can we, who so easily fall into even small temptations, find the power to overcome large ones? By entering into the great dynamics of Jesus' temptations.

Lenten challenge: This first week of Lent, list some concrete ways you can overcome temptations that correspond with your desires. For example, you may give up snacks between meals, choose not to participate in an activity of which you are an expert, and decide to reduce social media posting by 50%. It may not seem like much, but by saying "no" to the tyranny of food, power, and fame (in this example), you'll discover true greatness.

After Mass #1: Thanksgiving

"Give thanks to the LORD, for he is good. His love endures forever." - Psalm 136:1

A theologian once said, "The Mass begins long before Mass begins," highlighting how the work of God starts in a person's life long before they ever enter the building of the church. However, the opposite is also true—"the Mass ends long after the Mass ends," emphasizing that the Mass continues out into the world. Because of this, in many places there is the custom for the people to remain in the building of the church for a few minutes after Mass in order to thank God for all that He has done and all that He will do.

What prayer do you use to thank God for all He has done for you?

Could you spend time after Mass to give thanks to God?



March 16, 2025—2nd Sunday of Lent **GOSPEL MEDITATION**

St. Thomas Aquinas said that friends share three things: time, possessions and secrets. For example, how do I know if you're my friend? Well, let's say we've been to Mexico together, you've tried my shaky attempts at pasta carbonara, and you know what ridiculous costume I wore in a music video I filmed in my early twenties. We, dear reader, are definitely friends. We've shared time, possessions and secrets.

How does friendship with Jesus develop? The same way. Jesus lives and eats with his disciples. Then he takes Peter, James and John to Mount Tabor and there reveals to them his deepest secret: his glorious, divine Sonship. The majesty of God shines from within his humanity in a way that goes beyond description. God the Father confirms this "secret," saying, "This is my chosen Son, listen to him" (Luke 9:35). It's all so precious that "they fell silent and did not at that time tell anyone." Do we take time to be alone with Christ, to allow him to mystically share this "secret" with us as his dear friends?

Lenten challenge: This week, identify one time when you experienced an awareness of some specific aspect of Jesus - perhaps on a retreat, at Mass, in prayer or in an act of service. Spend ten minutes consciously re-living that experience in your heart. If you can't recall one, set aside at least two hours this Lent as a mini retreat, either alone in nature or in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. Focus on him and ask him to share the secrets of his heart with you. He will. Then, as his friend, share the secrets in your heart. - Father John Muir ©LPi


