Today we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord.

And the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased." *Luke 3:22*

This brings to mind a wonderful memory from two years ago, of putting my feet in the Jordan river where Jesus was baptized by John the Baptist. Christian Disciples in Mission this is our day! Most likely, we do not remember our baptism, but we can renew our

baptismal promises over and over again. What a perfect day to renew our baptism and commitments that have flowed from it. It is a new year, a time for resolutions and if you listen attentively, God wants you to experience his love in ways you haven't even imagined, and say to you "with you I am well pleased". What will you do this year to renew your baptism, listen more attentively and draw closer to God?









Stewardship

As we celebrate this feast of the Baptism of the Lord, we can study His actions at the Jordan River as a powerful example of servant leadership. We see in Jesus a type of leadership that is characterized by humility and leading by example.

Certainly, the sinless Savior did not need a baptism of repentance! But Jesus humbly made Himself one with His people to draw us to Him and create a relationship with us so that we would be open to His teachings and influence. As a servant leader, we also see that Jesus leads by example. He doesn't just tell the people they need to be baptized. He shows them how and does it Himself to teach them. To lead like Jesus, we, too, must "walk the walk" and not just "talk the talk." If we want those who we lead to be generous and hard-working, then we must show them how to do this by demonstrating generosity and hard work ourselves.

Immediately after His baptism, we learn of the powerful affirmation of the Father who opens the heavens, sends the Holy Spirit upon Jesus in bodily form, and says audibly, "This is my beloved Son with whom I am well-pleased." Let us be filled with gratitude for our amazing God and be reminded that when we are grateful followers of Jesus and servant-leaders in imitation of Him, the Father will be well-pleased with us, too.












Human Trafficking Awareness Day is Tuesday January 11. This is a human rights issue that violates the Dignity of the Person and has infiltrated and undermined the essence of humanity locally, nationally, and globally. It is exploitation-based and preys upon the vulnerable person who has no choices and who has limited or no resources to navigate his or her way out of bad situations like unemployment, hunger, abuse, or extreme poverty.

Human trafficking is the act of recruiting, harboring, transporting, providing or obtaining a person for compelled labor or commercial sex acts through the use of force, fraud or coercion. It's important to note, though, that human trafficking can include, but does not require, movement. You can be a victim of human trafficking in your hometown. At the heart of human trafficking is the traffickers' goal of exploitation and enslavement.

Blue is internationally recognized as the universal color for human trafficking prevention. This month, show your solidarity by adding blue to your wardrobe.

The Epiphany...with Brian Cannon

There's a lot more to the Epiphany than initially meets the eye. The word "epiphany" means "being made known" or "manifestation." When we celebrate the Epiphany we are celebrating coming to know Jesus as God dwelling among us. So, the adoration of Jesus by the Magi and his baptism by John in the Jordan River are both key to the Feast of the Epiphany.

In the Western Church we have put the emphasis on the travelers from the East - wrapping them into the Christmas story. The Eastern Church, however, has traditionally emphasized Christ's Baptism. Personally, I see a very strong binding of the two.

Many interpretations of the Magi suggest that they are meant to represent the nations. This idea is emphasized in the first choice of the Opening Prayer of Mass on the Feast of the Epiphany:

Father.

you revealed your Son to the nations by the guidance of a star.

I love that these Magi, or nations, come from the East. When Adam and Eve were sent forth from the Garden, they were banished to the land East of Eden. So, it's only fitting that we, the nations, come back from the East to re-encounter God.

And when we re-encounter God, it's amazing what we find.

God is as vulnerable as a little child and welcomes us into life without resistance or bitterness - without a memory of our past transgressions or defenses against how we might transgress in the future. Instead, we encounter defenseless, pure, blinding love. Our exile is over.

Baptism washes away forever the stain of that exile. Through our Baptism we are bound to him and we bear the beautiful gifts of that binding.

Gold: When our lives are mutually bound, we share in the kingship that is his. Every ounce of goodness, blessing and life given to Christ by the Father is given by Christ to us. The royal inheritance is ours.

Incense: We are sanctified and set apart as Children of God. We are holy. We were made to know God, love God and serve God and our binding to Christ ensures that we share in his priesthood.

Myrrh: As St. Paul points out; when we are baptized into the life of Christ, we are also baptized into his death. We let ourselves die and put on a new life in Christ. We are changed forever.

The encounter with the Vulnerable Christ cannot help but move us in new directions.

When the Magi left Bethlehem, they went back to their country by a different route.
