Celebrating

Liturgy is the source and summit of our Catholic lives, and our people believe it "must feed our souls" and support our Catholic identity. "What is missed is the transcendency and awe of Eucharist...which serves to draw everyone together". Worship should draw us into the sacred and the community, with corporate and personal prayer and most of all joy. People yearn to see the participation of youth and children in our worship services again.

Many ask for more lay participation at worship and prayer, particularly in the homily/reflection.

Homilies are especially important to the parishioners. Some criticize homilies that are judgmental or political. Many enjoy diversity at Masses and other prayer services.

Discerning

& Deciding The most frequent comments in these listening sessions are the most frequent ones heard internationally in public and private forums. What is the role and definition of the priesthood? An overwhelming number of participants would like to include more people into ordination, including women, both single and married, as well as married men. The participants also shared frustration with legalism for legalism's sake, (the concern about the validity of baptism). Many would like to see a continuation of strong lay leadership roles such as Parish Life Directors.

When making judgements clerics and church leaders are to be led by the Spirit of God as voiced by Pope Francis.

Going On Mission

We need a deeper connection with others. We need to be true evangelizers, meeting people where they are, and with the help of the Holy Spirit to call every baptized person to participate in the mission. The

church needs to go out to where the people are and not expect them to come to the Church. We need to continue to support Bible study and charismatic catechesis with children, adults and youth.

Each one of us has unique gifts. Direct, understandable opportunities such as the Corporal Works of Mercy encourage people to use these gifts to reach out to the un-baptized and unaffiliated. In the past, being in a Catholic family, school or neighborhood was an effective evangelization process. Now the church will need multiple evangelization tools to invite and reinvite children and teens to the Church. The Church needs to continue to support Catholic families and Catholic schools. Dialoguing Many parishioners are participating directly in community issues without Catholic Church involvement. Not long ago, the Catholic Church was at the forefront, in formation, justice, and supporting evangelization, and now seems behind. A first step to ecumenical collaborating with other Christians is for our pastors to team up, cooperate, and share resources to more effectively alleviate suffering allowing parishioners to serve the people of God. With that foundation, the Church can pursue more ecumenical opportunities. The Church needs to serve in a variety of functions such as, leadership, mentoring and heartfelt participation with other churches. "Jesus was a revolutionary, we need to be more like him."

Ecumenical collaboration is simpler in homogenous communities. Where real diversity in faith, economics, race, and gender exists it is difficult to reach agreement of what is an issue much less what to do about it. The Church must represent itself by action.

Listening

& Speaking The Church must be equitable at each level (parish, diocese and global church) and in each

apostolate. If we cannot show our equitability, we lose our reputation of being Christian and cannot lead the journey for a more equitable world. The Good News is clouded by sexual abuse scandals and mixed messaging by Church leadership. Perceived focus on legalism rather than the Spirit of God excludes many people from speaking, despite their gift of courage. Technology can expand learning and speaking but it can also be a barrier.

Synodality We need to strive for unity and recognize God's unconditional love. We connect our ritual and history to share joy.

Can the church speak and share joy with our children, youth and adults? The Church should help us share the message that we are broken, blessed and beloved. The Church should not shame or judge.

The Holy Spirit has called Church members to support each other at hours of need. Sharing common goals bring people together in the Church. The large number of people in the Church can be intimidating and needs to be balanced with smaller groups like faith sharing groups.

The synod process itself informs parishioners about communion, participation and mission. This process invites people to journey together.

At our next meeting, we will be discussing Paul: A Biography, N.T. Wright. bv definitive In this biography, renowned Bible scholar, Anglican bishop, and bestselling author N. T. Wright offers а radical look at the apostle illuminating Paul, the humanity and remarkable achievements of this

intellectual who invented Christian theology —transforming a faith and changing the world.

For centuries, Paul, the apostle who "saw the light on the Road to Damascus" and made a miraculous conversion from zealous Pharisee persecutor to devoted follower of Christ, has been one of the church's most widely cited saints. While his influence on Christianity has been profound, N. T. Wright argues that Bible scholars and pastors have focused so much attention on Paul's letters and theology that they have too often overlooked the essence of the man's life and the extreme unlikelihood of what he achieved.

To Wright, "The problem is that Paul is central to any understanding of earliest Christianity, yet Paul was a Jew; for many generations Christians of all kinds have struggled to put this together." Wright contends that our knowledge of Paul and appreciation for his legacy cannot be complete without an understanding of his Jewish heritage. Giving us a thoughtful, in-depth exploration of the human and intellectual drama that shaped Paul, Wright provides greater clarity of the apostle's writings, thoughts, and ideas and helps us see them in a fresh, innovative way.

Keeping the Air We Breathe as Clean As Possible

In order to ensure the cleanest and safest possible air quality, we have taken a number of steps to upgrade our ventilation systems at Holy Family. We have installed MERV 13 filters in every building on campus as well as Bipolar Ionization Generators in the Church, Education Center, Pastoral Center and Hall. Bipolar Ionization Generators cause small particles of dust and contaminants to bond together into a larger particle. These particles are then removed through various filters in the system. Particle reduction can be achieved

anywhere from 50 to 90%, depending on the size of the

particle. The joining of particles through ionization helps to increase their size and the greater likelihood of the particle being filtered out. We are also using a higher efficiency filter, improving the particle capture by over 65%. The implementation of these new upgrades will give us almost clinical grade filtration. We are very grateful to our generous donors who have made these important upgrades possible!

Mission Haiti, More Sea Container Bridge News







This past February the new bridge, Holy Family Parish Bridge, was dedicated in a wonderful celebration! The bridge was blessed by Archbishop Mesidor from Port au Prince who came to Cite Soleil for the first time in many months. Thousands of people are now safely walking across the bridge each day covering about 100 feet. They are thrilled as the previous path was treacherous, filled with garbage and two feet of stagnant water. Last year 12 people drowned on this path, one being a Hands Together student. The construction was completed

by gang members working side by side for their community. The Holy Family sea container has been transformed into a multitude of blessings. *Thank you parishioners!*
