




WORSHIP / THE GOOD WORD

Keeping the Air We Breathe as Clean As Possible

In order to ensure the cleanest and safest possible air quality, we have taken a number of steps to upgrade our ventilation systems at Holy Family. We have installed MERV 13 filters in every building on campus as well as Bipolar Ionization Generators in the Church, Education Center, Pastoral Center and Hall. Bipolar Ionization Generators cause small particles of dust and contaminants to bond together into a larger particle. These particles are then removed through various filters in the system. Particle reduction can be achieved anywhere from 50 to 90%, depending on the size of the particle. The joining of

particles through ionization helps to increase their size and the greater likelihood of the particle being filtered out. We are also using a higher efficiency filter, improving the particle capture by over 65%. The implementation of these new upgrades will give us almost clinical grade filtration. We are very grateful to our generous donors who have made these important upgrades possible!

Mission Haiti, Funding Report

We recently asked Doug Campbell and Fr. Tom where our donations were benefiting the people of Haiti. From the beginning of our relationship with Hands Together, we designated our funds as being unrestricted, meaning that Fr. Tom and Doug could spend the money wherever they felt was most critical at the time, i.e. projects or perhaps disaster relief in the form of food, water, shelter, medical aid. Throughout the years when traveling to Haiti, we were shown in person flourishing projects funded by Holy Family. Since we have been unable to travel to Haiti in the last number of years, Doug has provided us with an accounting of money



spent on the various projects. We will present this information over the next few weeks.

Hands Together recognizes the extraordinary support from Holy Family over the past 17 years. They have specifically dedicated several projects to the Holy Family community:

Monsignor Connolly School
Ti Desdunnes Holy Family School
Holtsnider Barefoot Kids Project
The Holy Family Bridge

Beginning with the Monsignor Connolly School (K - 6) in the Bellicou neighborhood of Cite Soleil, \$ 244,927 have been spent. This school is one of largest and most effectively run of all of the Hands Together schools. There are 850 students and 30 staff members. In addition, the elderly program held on campus feeds a daily meal and provides basic medical checks and care to 150 elderly people. This represents the largest percentage of your donations sent over the last year at 39 percent.

Talk to your children about what to do if they ever get lost in a crowd. First, tell them to stay where they are. Teach them how to locate another safe adult a park or store employee, someone in uniform, another mom with children — and how to ask for help. A great tip for parents is to start immediately shouting a name, age, and description of the missing child so others around you are searching too. The VIRTUS® "Protecting God's Children" training is good for four years from the date on the Certificate.

- Must take the "Keeping the Promise Alive" Recertification before the Certificate expires.
- If the Certificate is more than four years old, they must retake the "Protecting God's Children" session.







For over 30 years as a key member of our parish ministerial staff and 37 years as a parishioner, Frank Ponnet lived out the gospel call to discipleship. His death on July 7, 2021, left a void in our parish and in our hearts. Until a few weeks before his death when his health required that he step back, Frank was Holy Family's Director of Liturgy and Adult Education.

His ministry was marked by evangelizing, healing, teaching, reconciling, uniting, counseling and praying. A student of Church history and the documents of the Second Vatican Council, Frank understood the Church's human weaknesses, but he celebrated and was faithful to a Church that is alive and open to growth. Frank embodied with his life the fullness of being true Church, the fullness of being a true follower of Jesus Christ.
