Prayers for Children, July 15th

War is surely most dangerous when it becomes a norm in the minds of the young. More than two children die and another 450 are injured each day during the Russo-Ukrainian War. These children's childhood has been destroyed. Education has completely stopped for about 3 million children in the Ukraine. An estimated 40 million Ukrainians have had to leave their homes and about a third of that number are children.

Let us pray for Ukraine and its children, may their lives be spared and may this war soon end. "No woman should ever face a pregnancy feeling alone, or desperate, or like she has no other options. These are our sisters. We cannot be indifferent to their fears. We need to be near to them, to help them in every way that we can."




The Good Word Lk 10:25-37

There was a scholar of the law who stood up to test Jesus and said, "Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus said to him, "What is written in the law? How do you read it?" He said in reply, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself." He replied to him, "You have answered correctly; do this and you will live."

But because he wished to justify himself, he said to Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus replied, "A man fell victim to robbers as he went down from Jerusalem to Jericho. This quintessentially Florentine art - taking the form of dazzling multi-colored ornaments for major buildings of the city, delicately modeled and ingeniously constructed freestanding statues, serene blue and white devotional reliefs for domestic use, charming portraits of children, along with decorative and liturgical objects - flowed in abundance from Della Robbia's workshop for a hundred years. Passed down to family members and associated workshops and developed further by each generation, the closely held technique achieved new heights of refinement and durability in modeling and color, praised for combining elements of painting and sculptor in a new and all but eternal medium. Important patrons, from the Medici family to the French court, enhanced the reputation of the Della Robbia. In the 19th century, revived interest in the Renaissance in general and the Della Robbia in particular brought their works into major collections beyond Italy, particularly in England and the United States, and sparked the rediscovery of the technique by contemporary Italian ceramic workshops. Today we are the beneficiaries of this resurgence of interest in the Della Robbia ceramic pieces. Holy Family announces the establishment of the Frank Ponnet Endowed Lecture Series and the dedication of the Ponnet Gathering Area adjacent to our church.



For over 30 years as a key member of our parish ministerial staff and 37 years as a parishioner, Frank Ponnet lived out the gospel call to discipleship. His death on July 7, 2021, left a void in our parish and in our hearts. Until a few weeks before his death when his health required that he step back, Frank was Holy Family's Director of Liturgy and Adult Education.

Over his years at Holy Family, he and his wife, Dawn, also served as directors of Christian Initiation (RCIA), Youth Ministry, and Remembering Church. Frank was the parish liaison to the Ecumenical Council of South Pasadena, and was committed to interfaith dialogue. He was a champion of the parish's social justice education and outreach programs. He oversaw the training of Eucharistic Ministers, Lectors and

Altar Servers. When members of our parish community lost loved ones and prepared for the Church's final rites, Frank's consoling presence accompanied them through difficult days.

His ministry was marked by evangelizing, healing, teaching, reconciling, uniting, counseling and praying. A student of Church history and the documents of the Second Vatican Council, Frank understood the Church's human weaknesses, but he celebrated and was faithful to a Church that is alive and open to growth. Frank embodied with his life the fullness of being true Church, the fullness of being a true follower of Jesus Christ.
