BAPTISM


Parents, please call the Church office to begin the process of preparation for baptism.

THE FOUR LAST THINGS PART I: DEATH ON THE STATE OF SOULS IN PURGATORY

We return to our reflections on the Last Four Things. We last talked about was what purgatory is. So now we dive into what the souls in purgatory experience.

St. Thomas Aquinas starts by asking the question: are the pains of purgatory greater than any pains of this life? To answer this he quotes St. Augustine, “this fire of Purgatory will be more severe than any pain that can be felt, seen, or conceived in this world.” In other words, Purgatory is a mercy but not a consolation. Dr. Vost explains it thus: “The soul’s pain of losing the divine vision of God will be greater than any sense of loss on earth because the more we desire something, the more we suffer when it’s absent. (Any person who has lost a loved one can attest to this kind of pain.) Yet in purgatory, our overwhelming desire to see God is completely undiluted. The soul’s desire is not hindered or distracted by things of the body. Further, the soul knows that had it not been held back by the weight of sin, it would have already achieved the ‘Sovereign Good,’ as St. Thomas puts it. Therefore, the soul grieves most intensely because the delay of purgatory keeps it from its ultimate goal,” (Vost, 35-36).

Now this pain is different form the physical pain we experience in a broken bone or a pinched nerve. The pain can be related to the grief he mentioned earlier, but in the most acute way. It is a pain so deep and so hard, we can only describe it by analogy.

I know this sounds like a sort of hell, but it is very different from hell. Hell is an eternal prison of eternal suffering. Purgatory is a passageway that those souls chose to suffer, though difficult it may be, because they know the glory that comes is worth it, like the athlete who suffers greatly to achieve victory, but to a degree beyond our imagination.

This suffering cleanses the debt of punishment that remains in the soul. The debt of punishment is different from person to person as is the depth of their suffering. Each soul arrive in purgatory with different numbers and kinds of sin on their souls . If a soul was more attached to a particular sin, say judgment, they may have longer to suffer. The number of times he committed the sin of judgment that still remain on his soul determine the severity of the suffering.

To me, this is a wake up call. As we begin Advent and her in the Scriptures that He is coming soon, have we properly prepared ourselves? Have we sought God’s cleansing mercy in the confession now? This is the time to suffer because suffering here in light-weight compared to purgatory.






