A MESSAGE FROM FR. TOM

AT THE CONFLUENCE...

Our town of Sacramento lies at the confluence of two river systems, the Sacramento and the American, each fed by forks, secondary rivers, and streams. Our enlarged Sacramento River then meets with the San Joaquin complex in the Delta, and flows into the bay, and from the bay into the Pacific Ocean, which is part of the immense but fragile watery envelope that covers 70 percent of the earth. What's mysterious, and wonderful, is that it's all connected. Not a bad metaphor for our church as well.

Last May our parish Pastoral Council suggested that we do a parish survey, to find out where we are and what we need to do to serve our parish community better. After a very difficult period of isolation of COVID and political upheavals, we agreed that it's time to take stock, to ask some penetrating questions and to get your honest feedback and suggestions about how our parish can serve you and your families better. For this reason, we're launching this Sunday a parish survey, the details of which are spelled out in this bulletin on page 5, on our website and our Facebook page. Over the next few weeks we ask you to take a few minutes and fill it out: digitally if you're comfortable in the electronic sphere, or with a trusty pencil if you're not.

It's important for us to hear from as many of you as possible as we look to the future, even as we're imagining how to bring us all together more intentionally when large group gatherings become safely possible again.

Yesterday I received a packet of documents from the Diocese of Sacramento, detailing a larger yet parallel process that we will be engaging in over the next several months. In an unprecedented move, Pope Francis has asked the church throughout the world to provide real life feedback on where we are as we journey together in our faith, on how we participate in our mission in communion with one another and with the universal church. Each local diocese and every local parish is invited to share its joys and hopes, its griefs and anxieties: with our neighbors in the pews, with our local church here in Arden Arcade in Northern California, with our leadership. This invitation comes as a prelude to a, international meeting, a Synod to be held in Rome in 2023, whose topic is "synodality."

That word is uncommon to us in modern English. A "synod" is typically understood as ecclesiastical meeting of leaders and elders who legislate, or interpret teachings. Yet the roots of the word are much more dynamic, more inclusive: a synod is literally a shared journey, a traveling-together. Think of the Canterbury Tales's pilgrims who support each other on the dangerous trek by sharing their

stories; think of "buddy films" whose protagonists share their adventure in order to find deeper meaning in their lives.

A recently coined word, "synodality," tries to capture that dynamic. What is being proposed seems radical: let's listen to everyone, to the throng that surrounds Jesus eager to hear his message, not just the leaders and the hierarchy. Let's get input from the old and the young, the powerful and the marginalized, the scholar and the ordinary parishioner. Let's engage in dialogue, and move away from a hyper-clerical "we talk and you listen" dynamic. Let's listen to the Spirit's prompting with discerning hearts, and find new ways to communicate that are horizontal rather than top-down. And let's make this an enduring process, not a one-off experiment.

In the earliest days of the Church when journeying-together was still a novel experience for the community, this more organic process of listening, speaking, sharing, discerning and celebrating was an ordinary way of proceeding. With growth and stratification of roles, authoritative rulings became easier to accomplish than the messier business of wide consultation, listening, and discerning.

So why are we being asked to engage in an ancient process that seems alarmingly new? Because we need each other: to have our faith strengthened and our hope buoyed up by what we share, in our union and communion with one another, in our participation in mission. Our parish needs to hear from you in our survey, and in conversations that will follow up on it that will incorporate the synod process' focus on communion, participation and mission.

We stand at an inflection point, living in a place of confluence.

Here's the Holy Father's last word on the subject. Our goal isn't to produce more documents, but "to plant dreams, draw forth prophecies and vision, allow hope to flourish, inspire trust, bind up wounds, weave together relationships, awaken a dawn of hope, learn from one another and create a bright resourcefulness that will enlighten minds, warm hearts, give strength to our hands."

Those are goals that are surely worth our effort.

We may not be soldiers, standing in the path of a literal cannonball. And yet, we've been hit all the same. Cannonballs shatter our own hopes and dreams and expectations.


