

EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL

What is the Eucharistic Revival?

Last year, the US bishops called for a three-year Eucharistic Revival to revive and enhance our faith, belief and love for Jesus in the Eucharist. We are invited to deepen our relationship with Jesus Christ, Our Lord, through the celebration of the Eucharist, so that we can be set on fire for the mission our Church needs so desperately. We are in the second year of this Eucharistic Revival, which aims to (i) reinvigorate worship of Jesus in the Eucharist; (ii) enhance our personal encounter with Jesus at Mass, in the Eucharist and in our parish; (iii) offer robust faith formation opportunities to learn more about the Eucharist; and (iv) encourage us to invite family, friends and strangers to St. Peter. What is the Eucharist?

The Eucharist is the greatest gift that Jesus has given us because it is His very self. At every Mass, the ordinary bread and wine that are consecrated by the priest become Jesus's Body and Blood. It is not something figurative or symbolic. The bread and wine really are changed into Jesus Himself. When we celebrate Mass, a miracle happens! Through the priest, God changes the bread and wine so that they become the real Body and Blood of Jesus. God does this miracle when the priest says the words of consecration: "This is my body" and "This is my blood." This is the most important moment at Mass. It still looks and tastes like bread and wine, but after the priest says the words of consecration, the bread and wine really and truly become Jesus. Even if we can't see Him, Jesus is there! We believe the bread and wine are really Jesus because that is what He told us Himself in the Bible. Remember, Jesus is God, and He can do anything, even change bread and wine into His Body and Blood! Jesus does this because He loves us so much that He wants to be very close to us. Holy Communion is food that feeds our soul, just like regular bread feeds our body.
