



Daniel Cardinal DiNardo announced that on January 8, 2023, the practice of distributing Holy Communion from the chalice to the faithful throughout the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston is restored.

Cardinal DiNardo asks all parishes to resume their customary pre-pandemic practice of distributing the Precious Blood to the faithful at Holy Communion on this date.

Understanding that some of the faithful may not be comfortable receiving Holy Communion under this form due to health concerns, Cardinal reminds us that, as always, reception of Holy Communion from the chalice is at the discretion of the communicant.

At St. Michael's Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion will be at Communion stations on the side aisles with a chalice for those who wish to receive the Precious Blood.

As guests at the banquet of the Lord's Supper, we can now more fully share in the joy and graces of receiving the Body and Blood of Christ in the Eucharist.

"We are grateful for your perseverance during these past years." Cardinal DiNardo shares. "Please be assured of our prayers for you as we receive our Lord in the great gift of Christ's Body and Blood in which we celebrate communion."



SAINT MICHAEL THE ARCHANGEL CATHOLIC COMMUNITY GIVES

During the past year, the people of Saint Michael the Archangel Catholic Church have brought joy and love to all people; young, old, homeless, and poor through many projects of compassion and giving. The many ministries of our parish cheerfully rolled up their sleeves and gave their time and talent and treasure to these efforts to reach out and show the love of Jesus to many in our community. The Knights of Columbus, Catholic Daughters, the students of Saint Michael's School led by Principal Dr. Cox, the youth group, Saint Vincent Depaul Society, and the young adult group and many other donors tirelessly aided in serving those in need. Not just during the Christmas season but throughout the year. Below are examples of our community's response to the needs of others.

SPIRITUAL BOUQUETS AND POINSETTIAS

For the last two years, the students of Saint Michael's School have made hundreds of spiritual bouquets and paper poinsettias. They were distributed to nursing homes in our parish boundary. The residents were tearfully grateful for such beautiful acts of kindness. They lifted the hearts of everyone; including the employees. Even those who were not Christian were visibly moved by such a generous act. Below are pictures of our students artistic efforts.



ADOPT-A-FAMILY

This year again dozens of families were adopted by parishioners. Our families bought gifts for needy families. These gifts were greeted with tears of joy by the children and their parents. I particularly remember delivering gifts to a tiny apartment where a single mom struggled to care for her three young children. It was very moving when we were invited into their apartment and saw a tiny tree on a table with no gifts underneath it. The children were so excited and were jumping for joy. Mom began to cry as she tried to thank us in broken english. Through our translator she told us that this would be best Christmas ever for her children. She thanked us over and over again.





HOMELESS OUTREACH PROGRAM

For the last year and a half, the Kolbe House, a Catholic faith-based transition facility for Catholic men coming out of prison have hosted the Homeless Outreach program where food care packages of ready-to-eat snacks and canned meats are distributed to the homeless under the bridges. The program began with distributing 100 packages.









Since then the program has exploded in a powerful way. Several churches donate food on a regular basis, but things really took off when Saint Michael's got involved. The amount of donations of food and clothing are huge. The school collects clothing and especially socks,1000's of pairs of socks, on a frequent basis. The volume of donations went from filling an SUV to filling an enclosed trailor.

These donations and the church donations are then sorted and assembled by the Young Adults group and the Senior High Youth group.

The food and clothing are then distributed in the homeless camps near Minute Maid Park.

Two months ago we distributed over 800 care packages and 32 bins of clothing, dozens of hygiene kits, shoes, and 100's of blankets. Recently we began to add family sized food products for families on limited bugets that live in nearby subsidized housing. Last month because of the overwhelming response of Saint Michaels donation program, we distributed over 80 bins of food, clothing, blankets and winter clothes. This distribution occurred just 5 days before the temperature dropped down to 16 degrees with a windchill of 0 degrees.

Recently a tent camp was burned down by an arsonist. The Saint Vincent DePaul Society of Saint Michael's donated money to provide tents for the residents.

Two days before the big freeze a donation came in and allowed us to buy 36 containers of propane for their tent heaters.

During our outreach to the homeless in Houston we found evangelization involves boldly preaching the loving message of God's love and redemption through words and actions. Sometimes that preaching involves handing out tents, blankets, food, and hot coffee and dozens of propane tanks for tent heaters. The least, the last, and the lonely, and the forgotten do not care what you know until they know that you care. We are called to assure them that they never walk alone. God is with them always.

At Saint Michael's Catholic Church we understand that now is the time for a major renewal. Pray for the Holy Spirit to come and light the fire, to fully wake up the church that the Pandemic put to sleep. It is time for an "all hands on deck" approach to evangelize the world. Begin with prayer, lots of prayer. Worship God with all of our hearts minds souls and strength. Pray for guidance. Pray for strength and grace. Then get informed and truly believe in God and His message, next receive him in our hearts, then live our faith everywhere and all the time, lastly give that faith to everyone all the time, everywhere.

The time for casual Catholicism is over. NOW is the time for heroic Catholicism. As we prepare for the New Year let us commit to boldly proclaim the message of the Gospel with our words and actions.


