



Dear Friends,

Do you know what day you were baptized?

I was baptized on Feb 12, 1978. It is also Abraham Lincoln's birthday, which has always helped my remember that my baptism is a true spiritual birthday. Once Saint John Paul II was asked what the most important day of his life was. He, a man who had accomplished more than most men do in a hundred lifetimes, answered unhesitatingly: "the day of my baptism." He never stopped remembering the fundamental value of this day: when he was re-born as a son of God, a "son in the Son," sharing by grace in the filial identity of the Son of God.

So, here's your homework: learn the date of your baptism and put in on your calendar to celebrate. You can celebrate by going to Mass, or confession (both which renew our baptismal grace in a special way), or even visiting the church in which you were baptized (a plenary indulgence is attached to this on your baptism day). Of course, you could also throw a party and invite friends. All are great options.

This Sunday's celebration is the Baptism of the Lord. We re-live the mystery that the Lord Jesus willed to plunge himself into the murky and muddy waters of our sinful condition so that we could arise as sinless and healed sons and daughters of God. He didn't need to be baptized. But it was fitting "to fulfill all righteousness." That is, his loving descent into our unrighteousness unleashes the power to bring divine holiness and life into our humanity. His baptism foreshadows his death and descent to the place of the dead—his rising from the waters is a sign of his resurrection. All this we experience sacramentally in our baptism.

So, what's the purpose of our baptism? Psalm 29 gives us a hint today: "Give to the Lord, you sons of God, give to the Lord glory and praise!" In the Bible, "sons of God" originally means "angels." They are the heavenly, created beings who are around God's throne and worship the uncreated One day and night. They are also the ones who exercise God's authority to invisibly govern natural and human affairs. In our baptism, we are given an authority equal to (even higher than!) the angels of God. The proof of this is our access to heavenly worship in the sacred liturgy. We worship God the Father "with all the angels and archangels" as we say in the preface. We are now sons of God who worship with the angelic beings. This baptismal elevation of our status as "sons of God" is also why we believe that human saints "intercede for us with unfailing help" in earthly affairs, much like the angels. They are baptized "sons of God" by the grace of Jesus.

This week, let's marvel at the mystery of divine sonship: revealed by Christ in his core identity, and given to us as a free gift—one to be celebrated and lived each and every day.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

Question:

At my grandson's Baptism, the priest put a bib on the baby. I do not remember seeing this before. Why is this done? Is it something new?

Answer:

When an adult is baptized, there is a part in the ceremony when the newly baptized is vested in a white garment. It is symbolic of the changes that baptism brings in the life of the baptized as they are freed from the bonds of sin and brought into the saving grace of Christ. Realities that are so profound are symbolically presented so that we might better grasp and understand them.

Infants are often dressed in a baptismal dress, which is the baptismal garment. In some places, the bib is used as a kind of baptismal garment. At the place in the ceremony where the investiture takes place, the bib is used. Some are poncho-like and fit over the baby's head. Others are simply placed on the baby's chest. If the baby is dressed in a white garment, nothing else is needed. The prayer says it all: "See in your white garment the outward sign of your Christian dignity ... bring that dignity unstained into the everlasting life of heaven." In baptism, we are given our purpose and goal in life as believers, and this is symbolized by the white garment.
