# AQUINAS A NOTE FROM FR. MUIR

Hi everyone, it's Fr. Muir. Wow, Christmas season has come and gone. It happened quickly, but I have so many fond memories of this past Christmas season. As we move into Ordinary Time, I urge all of you to reflect on this past Christmas season. Enjoy the moments and memories as we prepare ourselves to enter Ordinary Time.

Last Sunday we celebrated The Baptism of the Lord. The readings and my homily focused on our baptism's launch into life with a new identity (beloved children of God, new Christs) and new mission (the expansion of Christ's Kingdom). I've always been a touch uneasy with the English "ordinary" time. The word it translates really means something like "ordered" time...time "ordained" for something sacred...time "oriented" to a great purpose. This time is meant to signal that all our time is an adventure in faith. Our sleep, eating, prayer, work, relationships, and play have a deep, abiding purpose—even if hidden from our senses. And yet this purpose is revealed in our worship at Mass: everything is "ordained" for the glory and honor of God the Father. Let's make that our great purpose in 2022, whether in good times or in bad.

In other news, I'm so impressed with our new men's security ministry, the Porters of Saint Joseph. They work together to keep us safe on campus, and they also help each other grow in holiness under the pattern and patronage of Saint Joseph. I'm looking for a few more good, able-bodied men to help. An orientation meeting for the Porters of Saint Joseph is scheduled for our new members on January 22nd from 11:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. in Saint James Hall. Please join us if you have a prior lawenforcement or military background (or something similar, more or less).

Save the date! On Tuesday, January 25, Bishop Olmsted will celebrate a special Mass at St. Thomas Aquinas at 6 p.m. It's a special moment whenever our Bishop visits the parish. It's an experience of the fullness of the Church with the Bishop and his priests, deacons, and all the faithful people of God. Come and celebrate as a parish family in this special way.

Lots of other things are going on this month. Check out the rest of the bulletin for the details. May the Lord "order" all the ordinary moments of our lives to his glory and majesty.


The Knights of Columbus are praying the Rosary for Life on Saturday,






