



Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Recently I was with my little dog Libby at a retreat center in the Arizona desert. I sat in a chair near a ravine filled with shrubs. Unbeknownst to me, Libby wandered down there and disappeared. Suddenly an animal's wild shriek erupted from the area. Without thinking, I bolted down into the ravine fully expecting to see coyotes, javelinas, or rattlesnakes. I didn't care. I desperately wanted to get Libby out of there, without any self-regard. Before I could face whatever danger lay hidden, my dog blissfully trotted out from an entirely different area, utterly unaware that I had (quite heroically) just placed my life on the line.

When the adrenaline wore off, I thought to myself: how far would I have been willing to go to save her? I don't know. But I do know, if I had literally died, my friends and family would have certainly thought me insane for dying for a dog. No offense, Libby.

How passionately Jesus wants us to know him and his willingness to die for us! This week he says, "I know my own and my own know me," and "I lay down my life for the sheep." Here we encounter an insanely excessive love for us. Christianity is a relationship and not simply a religion or ethical code. In Jesus, God rescues and saves us. He laid down his life for you and me—and he has taken it up again. So often we are like Libby—blissfully ignorant of the reality of both our spiritual danger and his saving love. This Easter season, the risen Jesus calls us to be more conscious than ever before about his love. He never ceases to lay down his life for us.

OUR PASCHAL CANDLE

The Paschal Candle represents Christ, the Light of the World. It is blessed and solemnly processed into a darkened church at the Easter Vigil, bringing the Light of the Risen Christ into the church. The beeswax of which the candle is made represents the sinless Christ who was formed in the womb of His Mother, as is paralleled in the Exsultet, a proclamation chanted at the Easter Vigil: "a fire into many flames divided, yet never dimmed by sharing of its light, for it is fed by melting wax, drawn out by mother bees to build a torch so precious." The wick signifies His humanity, the flame, His Divine Nature, both soul and body. Five grains of incense, attached to the candle by nails and inserted form of a cross, recall the aromatic spices with which His Sacred Body was prepared for the tomb, and of the five wounds in His hands, feet, and side. Inscribed on the candle are the Greek symbols Alpha (A) and Omega (Ω) , meaning the Beginning and the End, which is a way Jesus is referred to in the Book of Revelation. At the Vigil, the candle is lowered into the Easter Baptismal Water, to bless the water and symbolize those buried with Christ by Baptism into death may rise again to life with Him.



Our candle was hand-painted over the course of more than nine hours by a young artist named Laura. The design she has painted features our Risen Lord seated in glory, bearing the wounds of His Passion and a banner that represents the Cross and His victory over death and sin. Below Christ are five painted Easter Lilies, a traditional symbol of the resurrection of Christ, Above Him is a dove, symbolic of the Holy Spirit, with seven tongues of flame, symbolizing the seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit.

The Paschal Candle is present and lit in the sanctuary of the church throughout the season of Easter, and then is reserved in the Baptistry, lit only at baptisms and funerals until the next Easter season.

Bishops of the Arizona Catholic Conference Statement on AZ Supreme Court Abortion Opinion April 9, 2024

The Bishops of the Arizona Catholic Conference (ACC) respect the life and human dignity of all people, from conception until natural death. In this regard, we will always stand ready to continue to serve the most vulnerable in our communities, especially preborn children, and their mothers.

We acknowledge that today's opinion by the Arizona Supreme Court on abortion is currently the law of the land. By a 4-2 decision, the Court ruled that Arizona's pre-Roe law protecting unborn human life from the moment of conception, with a life of the mother exception, is still valid. Previously, the Court of Appeals held that the 15-week ban statute overruled the older statute and it will remain in place for at least another 45 days because of a legal order given by a judge in another abortion case.

Nonetheless, we are also aware that a far-reaching pro-abortion initiative is being circulated that, if approved by voters, will ultimately dictate Arizona law in this regard.

This initiative, among other things, would likely remove most safeguards for girls and women that are currently in place at abortion clinics, permit a minor to obtain an abortion without parental involvement or permission, and allow for painful late-term abortions of viable preborn children. We do not believe that this extreme initiative is what Arizona wants or needs, and we continue to pray that it does not succeed.



Spend Time in Eucharistic Adoration

What we look at has the power to change us. Our eyes are like portals to our imagination. Seeing something has a unique ability to stimulate new thoughts, clarify former ideas and significantly alter our perception. To gaze upon the Grand Canyon, the face of a child or, more problematically, images of war or immoral acts, means we encounter it in a different way than simply hearing about it or reading a description. Our days are filled with a constant barrage of images, videos and other visual stimulants which threaten to overwhelm us and cause us to think only about the here and now, the immediate and, in many cases, the visually pleasurable. As an antidote to the visual storm of the world, the Church has always used imagery to tell the story of salvation history. That is the genesis of the beautiful stained glass windows in so many of our churches, and beautiful art such as the ceiling of the Sistine Chapel. Ultimately, though, no art, architecture or image can replace gazing upon the face of Christ in prayer, and eucharistic adoration offers us a unique opportunity to do just that.


St. Teresa of Calcutta was famous for inviting everyone to encounter Jesus in the "distressing disguise of the poor," but she was also known for spending significant time, every day, adoring, imploring and loving Jesus in the Eucharist. "Spend as much time as possible in front of the Blessed Sacrament and he will fill you with his strength and power," she said.

It requires God-given faith to believe that what looks like a little piece of unleavened bread contained in the gold monstrance is supremely worthy of our attention, honor, worship and time. In eucharistic adoration, we direct our vision toward Love himself, encounter a mystery beyond the world's comprehension and, most importantly, find ourselves in his gaze. Pope Benedict once said, "Adoration is essentially an embrace with Jesus in which I say to him: 'I am yours, and I ask you to stay with me always." In a world full of competing attractions, constant stimulation and disorienting visual noise, time with the Blessed Sacrament can heal our wounds, calm our minds and redirect our gaze toward he who is the source of our joy, hope and ability to live in the world, but not of it. So spend some time adoring Jesus in the Eucharist because he never tires of looking lovingly upon you.
