Dear sisters and brothers of Holy Family,

We have a beautiful ministry in our Parish called "Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion to the Homebound." The ministers carry Jesus with them after Mass and share Him with the sick and shut-ins. In this weekend's Gospel, we hear the story of our Blessed Virgin Mary carrying Jesus and sharing His presence to her cousin Elizabeth.

It was the Holy Spirit who prompted Mary to go on a long journey—nearly one hundred miles—to visit her aging cousin Elizabeth and help during her pregnancy. It was the Holy Spirit who filled Elizabeth, revealing to her that Mary was carrying the baby Jesus. And it was the same Spirit who anointed Elizabeth's child, John, for his mission to proclaim the Messiah.

The Holy Spirit is hoping to direct our lives too. As Jesus told us, he helps us to know the truth and how we should act (John 16:13). He comforts, counsels, exhorts, and encourages us (14:26). When we are weak or don't know what to pray for, He prays with us and in us (Romans 8:26-27). Jesus Himself was anointed with the power of the Spirit (Luke 4:16-21). The Spirit is the engine that drives our journey with the Lord. Why wouldn't we want Him involved in every area of our lives?

As Christmas draws near, let us not forget about the Holy Spirit. He's the One who overshadowed Mary and brought Jesus into this world. He's the One who raised Jesus from the dead. And he's the One who lives in us.


Let us pray often to the Holy Spirit and listen for His inspiration. He will strengthen us for whatever task God gives us. Just as He guided Mary, each day He will direct our steps along "the path of peace," closer and closer to God (Luke 1:79) and share His loving presence to others.

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

"You, Bethlehem-Ephrathah

too small to be among the clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to be ruler in Israel;"

We do not have to go see the most recent superhero movie or binge-watch a streaming TV series that celebrates the underdog to feel the elation that comes with overcoming evil. We need only to look at our own lives, and God's plan of salvation for us, to understand what it truly means to be triumphant. From tiny little Bethlehem - a town of no consequence - would arise the Savior of the world. He would be the One who came to do God's will, and thus consecrated us to God through the offering of his own body as sacrifice, once for all. This is the One Mary carried in her womb and whom Elizabeth's unborn child - we know to be John the Baptist - recognized. He is the child-most-vulnerable who would become King of the Universe, "stand[ing] firm and shepherd[ing] his flock by the strength of the Lord." This is the God we serve: the One who became like us so that we may one day be like him. We shall soon celebrate the anniversary of his birth, while also waiting in joyful hope for his coming again. In this time of preparation, then, we pray for the grace to know the Lord more fully and to appreciate with gratitude the Savior he truly is.

GO EVANGELIZE

As we prepare to celebrate Christmas, now is the time many of us will begin to gather – as families, friends, and faith communities. What an ideal opportunity to renew our relationships with one another and with Jesus, asking the Holy Spirit to help us recognize the presence of God in our lives and in others. Micah's prophesy from today's first reading endures: "His greatness shall reach to the ends of the earth; he shall be peace." Let's do our part to share the peace and joy of Christ with those we encounter, witnessing to his saving grace in our lives, and offering others an opportunity to be a part of the greatest story, ever – of God's saving action.

Office of Child and Youth Protection – USCCB Charter Audit The Safe Environment compliance training and renewal training is a condition of employment and for volunteer ministry in our Archdiocese. All clergy, employees, contracted school personnel, volunteers, members of groups, movements, and organizations over the age of 18, who work, volunteer or participate in any capacity are required to complete the Archdiocesan Safe Environment Training and a criminal background check before they may begin employment or volunteer activities. In addition, the mandatory renewal training must be completed every five years and a new background check submitted before the fiveyear expiration of prior training. The Gospel of Luke: For our Reflection

Chapter 6: Love of Enemies - We receive infinite love and forgiveness and mercy from God. Jesus challenges us to think as God thinks, to think about the needs of others rather than our own. Do you love without measure, or do you place limits on your love? What is your reaction when you have difficulties with others? Are you merciful, "just as your Father is merciful"?

Chapter 7: The Healing of a Centurion's Slave - Jesus was amazed at the centurion's deep faith; we echo the words of the centurion at every Mass. Do you have his depth of faith, his depth of trust, in Jesus? What other attitudes or characteristics of the centurion might you seek to imitate?

Chapter 8: Jesus and His Family - Jesus reveals that all of us can become members of his family, not limited by blood or heritage. How do you become a member of his family? How can others recognize you as a member of his family?


