**I** SOMETIMES wonder about the relevancy of these reflections. As I sit here before my computer screen early on Thursday morning after having spent a half an hour before the Blessed Sacrament in our chapel at the rectory, I feel as if I live in a bubble of sorts. I wanted to begin this reflection talking about how wonderful it has been to celebrate the Easter season, the feasts of Pentecost, the Most Holy Trinity and the Most Holy Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ and then this weekend to return to what we refer as "Ordinary Time."

As I thought about this, I realized that most people, even you folks who are reading this, most likely have a different focus, that today is Father's Day, and not the 11th Sunday of Ordinary Time. My church bubble sometimes keeps me from realizing that there is so much more going on in our culture and in our world that I need to be attentive to. These are issues that are far more grave and important than the Hallmark greeting card approach to Father's Day. Therefore, let me share a reflection by Fr. John Frank, A.A., entitled "With a father's heart."

"The day I received my learner's permit, my dad agreed to take me for a driving lesson. With a big grin, he hopped in the back, behind the driver seat. 'John,' he said, 'I've been waiting for this ever since you were a kid. Now it's my turn to sit back here and kick the seat.' A father's love!

"With his most recent apostolic letter, *With a Father's Heart*, Pope Francis has dedicated this year to St. Joseph. We launch(ed) the month of May with the feast of St. Joseph the Worker. Having a year dedicated to him would seem quite foreign to Joseph. He was the 'silent one.' In the shadows. Ordinary. Obedient. Hard-working. Courageous.

"He never made himself the center of things. He did not think of himself, but focused instead on the lives of Mary and Jesus,' the Pope wrote. 'Our lives are woven together and sustained by ordinary people, people often overlooked... Yet in these very days they are surely shaping the decisive events of our history,' he said in his letter.

"Most of us lead hidden lives. But it is there that grace comes. It is in the ordinary lives of families that the true stuff of living, learning and loving takes place. May we turn to him who loved Jesus with a father's heart. Blessed Joseph, to us too, show yourself a father."

Dads, you have an incredible responsibility. We need to pray for you not just today, but every day. We need to pray that your Sacrament of Matrimony truly be your vocation and springing from that the fruit of your children if God has so blessed you.

Men, I suggest to you a book entitled *Priestly Fatherhood: Treasure in Earthen Vessels*, by Fr. Jacques Philippe. It is written from the perspective of the ordained priesthood and our role as "fathers." Yet, he speaks eloquently to all human fathers through the lens of the fatherhood of God.

Allow me to quote from his second chapter entitled "The urgent need for Fatherhood."

"There is a crisis of fatherhood today. Fatherhood is often invalidated, all paternity or authority being suspected of abuse or of being overbearing. The image of the father in modern culture is often pale and oblivious, even to the point of being made a caricature... Men who present a positive image of paternity are lacking in modern society. Fathers of families don't always play the role that they should assume, and they no longer know very well how to act. Paternity is in crisis in the Church; it is also suffering in the world of education and schools; not to mention politics, where politicians often give the impression of being argumentative children... There is also a crisis of masculinity, which is inevitable, given that true virility, in the end, can't be accomplished without a certain form of paternity... We are in a world of orphans and so many people are disoriented and suffering because they haven't had the chance of meeting someone in their lives who was a true father."

Men, this is a steep read, but well worth it. Fr. Philippe has written a number of books on the spiritual life which are highly regarded. They have enriched my priesthood greatly. I highly recommend him to you.

I also recommend two opportunities. For the last 15 years, every Wednesday morning at 6:30AM, men of the parish and beyond have gathered for prayer, fraternity, study and discussion. This group is open to all men. We are presently meeting on Zoom. We have guys from Arizona, Colorado and North Carolina joining us. If you would like to check it out, simply go to *SMP Connect* and click on "Fr. Jim's men's group." You'll find the link there. Welcome. We would love to have you join us.

Secondly, on June 30, we are inviting a new group of men for *Exodus 90*. This is a journey of prayer, asceticism and fraternity to refocus one's life on what is most important. For further information, connect with Andrew Goldstein online or at the parish office. We are praying for a group of 50 men who want to journey together in solidarity with one another to deepen their relationship with God and with one another on behalf of their spouses, families and the family of the Church. Will you take the challenge?

A blessed Father's Day. In Christ, I love you guys.

# Post-Communion Prayer

**A**FTER Holy Communion, we come back together for a prayer collectively before going to love and serve the Lord Jesus. In one of the books that I have studied during this time, it was called the “Prayer after the Sacrificial Meal.” During Communion, there is often a “Communion Antiphon”—a piece of Sacred Scripture that is sung—often accompanied with a psalm. It gives us something to meditate on during our reception of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.

Now, the whole congregation comes together again for a final prayer. It is one of the three prayers that often come in a set (the *Collect*, the *Secret/Super Oblata*, and the *Postcommunion*). It often reflects back on the Sacrament that we have received in the Eucharist, hence it often being called the “post-Communion” prayer! It both looks back at the events that have occurred—and it often has a “forward focus,” too, either asking God to assist us in living into this charity that we received as we leave or looking really far forward “that we may delight for all eternity in that share in your divine life, which is foreshadowed in the present age by our reception of your precious Body and Blood” (Post Communion Prayer, Corpus Christi).

This is a great reminder to us as Christians, that our lives both always look back at the event of Christ and forward to His promise for all eternity. As the famous phrase of the Carthusians relates, “The Cross stands while the world turns.” GK Chesterton put it this way: “The cross has become something more than a historical memory; it does convey, almost as by a mathematical diagram, the truth about the real point at issue; the idea of a conflict stretching outwards into eternity. It is true, and even tautological, to say that the cross is the crux of the whole matter” (Chesterton, *The Everlasting Man*).

As we move from the great prayer of Thanksgiving (the Mass and the Eucharistic Prayer), back into the world, the post-communion prayer recalls all of this for us, both looking back and looking forward—always towards the Cross!





## Are we placing Mass restrictions on ourselves?

Now that restrictions are being lifted with increasing frequency, a lot of people are wondering how many Catholics will return to Mass.

After all, we've all heard the depressing statistics regarding the small percentage of Catholics who actually believe the Eucharist to be the Real Presence.

It's shocking, for sure.

But perhaps a more uncomfortable question arises: What about those of us who know it's Jesus being offered on the altar; those of us who gladly proclaim our belief in his Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity and wring our hands about those who don't?

Are we placing unnecessary Mass "restrictions" on ourselves? Are we receiving the Lord as often as our lives allow?

I realize that everyone's circumstances are different and life presents a lot of challenges, but let's try and put this in perspective.

Imagine if you were the greatest doctor in the world, knew the answer to every medical problem, and could heal any disease. You had offices in every neighborhood around the world, they were open every day, and your services were totally free. Do you think you would ever have any downtime?

Of course not. Your offices would be packed.

And instead of merely gaining relief from temporary physical maladies from a fictional super-doctor, we have the opportunity to meet with the God of the universe who wants to give us peace, joy, happiness, healing — everything he's got, forever!

Brothers and sisters, we need to get to Mass and receive "the medicine of immortality" as often as we possibly can.

The Sunday obligation is just that, an obligation. It's the low bar.

But love isn't about obligation. If we know what's really being offered, we should be ecstatic to have the opportunity to become "partakers of the divine nature" of God (2 Pt 1:4). He's literally sharing his divinity with us!

And that gift isn't simply a one-a-week event.

Don't forget that Jesus taught us to ask the Father for "our daily bread."

Following his lead, Saint Ambrose asks a very pointed question: "If it is 'daily' bread, then why do you take it so infrequently? Take daily what will help you daily. And live so that you deserve to receive it daily. He who does not deserve to receive it daily does not deserve to receive it once a year."

Yes, it's not easy.

There are often days that I simply don't feel like going. I'm tired. The kids are whiny. The weather isn't great. The Mass time is inconvenient.

And to add a little salt in the wound, lots of times even when I get there, it isn't the most "heavenly" of experiences.

Even so, just like a family member or friend really appreciates it when you show up in spite of difficulty, realize that the Lord absolutely loves the fact that you simply showed up to be with him at Mass.

Of course, a lot of people don't have many available opportunities for daily Mass.

Whether it's because of work or other obligations, it just isn't possible to receive our Lord other than Sunday. If that's your situation, then try to spend some extra time in prayer and make a spiritual communion. It's extremely beneficial and will help propel you up the divine ladder.

But for those who have the opportunity, I would encourage you to see if maybe you can get to even one more Mass per week... or two if you're feeling motivated:).



It can transform your life.

And speaking of motivation, when I'm struggling to decide whether or not to make the effort to go (and it happens more often than I'd like to admit), I try to look at, or think about, a crucifix.



## Sharing Your Faith: A Primer

We are commanded by Christ to share the Good News. And while that may be easier said than done, evangelization doesn't have to be hard, weird, or forced. Here are some basic steps you can take to quickly and easily share your faith. A short, two minute conversation can change a person's life forever.

- ▶ A face-to-face conversation about Jesus Christ and His Church can begin with an icebreaker. Often it is helpful to give someone a tangible reminder of Christ's love for them, like a Rosary or a holy medal.
- ▶ Invite the person to share something of their story with you. Get to know them as you would anyone you meet for the first time.
- ▶ Consider that this person is loved by God and that the Holy Spirit may have put them in your life so that they can hear the Gospel.
- ▶ Ask them if they go to church or to describe their relationship with God as a way to start talking about faith.
- ▶ Offer to share one good reason why you choose to believe in God or be a Christian.
- ▶ Offer to remember them in prayer daily for the next week. Ask them if they have a particular prayer request.
- ▶ Offer to pray for them on the spot, placing the burden to pray on you and not on them.
- ▶ Ask permission to contact them later and tell them you would like to invite them to a parish event, or even over to your own home. Follow up on your promise to contact them.
- ▶ Invite them to events at SMP or small groups where they can explore the Gospel.

We have to be willing to walk with people as they seek answers to the big questions of life. That means we must be willing to foster an authentic relationship with those we seek to introduce to faith. ### PARISHIONERS HELPING PARISHIONERS

We are blessed to be a family of families who truly care about one another. That spirit of generosity is clearly demonstrated in the *Shoulder to Shoulder* ministry, which works through a special fund set up to help parishioners who are struggling financially.

Parishioners who find themselves in a financial crisis simply complete a confidential application, which is then screened by a committee of parishioners who, in turn, make a funding recommendation to Fr. Jim. If approved, the parish issues a check directly to the service provider—the doctor, landlord or roof repair company, etc.—not the applicant.

There are DVD series from Bishop Barron and The Augustine Institute (among others) and FORMED has many options. Another resource you are invited to check out is **Nextstep** from Evangelical Catholic. Visit [ecnextstep.com](http://ecnextstep.com) to set up a free account and get started. They have a variety of content. A couple of examples are:

**Guide your Kids:** Your goal as a Christian parent or grandparent is for your child to know and love Jesus. How do you help your children become Catholic disciples of Jesus? How do you even begin, and how do you know if you’re “doing it right”? No one has all the answers and there is no one right way, but we can discover guidance and insight from prayer and from other parents. In *Guide Your Kids*, find tips, encouragement, and practical ideas from real, imperfect Christian parents. Let God guide you as you guide them.

**Get More Out of Mass:** The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life, but we don’t always experience that reality. The Mass can seem confusing. We sometimes feel bored and distracted. That’s normal. But there’s also more. You can have a rich, engaging encounter with Jesus in the Mass. There are many things you can do to get more out of Mass. In this step, you will be given a specific instruction and prayer to use at Mass. And don’t worry about whether you have a profound experience or not. The most important thing is your conscious intention to connect with Jesus personally at Mass. Trust and believe that He meets you there.
